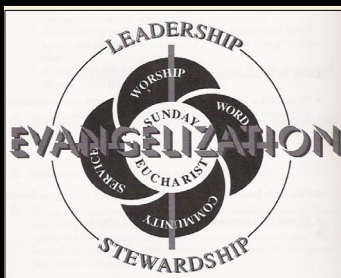

Food, drink, song, and entertainment provided a good time for young and old. What a three-day gala! Soon there will be a wrap-up meeting to discuss the good things and plan appropriate improvements. Thanks and kudos to John Kohaut and all the committee

members for their untiring efforts these past months. I wish I could mention all by name. The money counting office staff, facilities and clean-up, Ray Silva riding around for two weeks every morning preparing the lawn for parking and setting up the booths with electricity, the book sellers, cooks, drink dispensers, security, our cake walk specialist, raffle managers, and our newest addition: funnel cake fryers, worked side by side with great enthusiasm. Sacrifices abounded. Thank you to all. Everyone from the Festival committees are invited to join all of our parish volunteers at the Stewardship Appreciation Dinner next Saturday, October 12<sup>th</sup> in the Parish Center. I recently read an article entitled, "How to be Catholic in College: Six Steps to Success." It appeared in the periodical, *Shalom Tidings* and authored by Jonathan Mani. In his introduction to the *Six Steps* he writes: "The journey into university/college is a massive change. It is a time of new beginnings, life changing experiences and a healthy dose of independence. It can also be a time of crises....It is very easy to lose sight of God and everything we knew until that point. I offer you a list of things I believe you should do in university/college in order to resist against spiritual adversity and grow in the Catholic faith."

The author goes on to list the *Six Steps*. Here I have a summary of each step that seems to make a great deal of sense to me and may be helpful to university/college students in the parish or among your family and friends. **1) Join a Catholic Club on campus...**It is incredibly helpful to have a source of spiritual guidance whenever you need it. Also, clubs like these may conduct daily Holy Mass which will keep you in a state of spiritual grace; (See page 7 of this bulletin for info on our college Newman Club.) **2) Beware of the courses you take...**You may come across professors with a long list of academic accomplishments who will misinterpret various teachings of the Church...It is always important to cross-reference teachings with a reliable source such as a priest. Learning and understanding new perspectives are fruitful to your intellectual growth, but be careful of the things you accept as new truths; **3) Go to retreats regularly.** Going to a retreat is a way of renewing your life. It will give you new strength and, in addition to this, you will meet people who are in the same spiritual state as you. Growing in faith as a community is a great way to maintain an active spiritual life during school; **4) Adopt a Saint.** A good way to remain true to who you are is to adopt the traits of a saint or pray to a saint for intercession. Saint Thomas Aquinas is an amazing saint and is the patron saint for students, so perhaps you could start by praying to him; **5) Know the fine line between independence and temptation.** Without a proper understanding of what is right and wrong, it is very easy to fall into a mentality where our temptation to do something is labeled 'independence.' Always seek spiritual guidance before making any decision that may change your life and affect the lives around you; **6) Pray.** Be sure to pray daily! School is a place of growth, learning, hardships and happiness, but with a spiritual focus, we can grow to become the people God intended for us to be.

Our *For Christ Forever* campaign continues to focus on the spirituality of giving. Unless we believe in some connection between our financial support of this campaign and a spiritual reality in the service of our Lord and his Church, our enthusiasm will be weak at best. It may be more tolerance than zeal. This month will focus on a video presentation shown in church at all the Masses on October 12 and 13. The Campaign commitment weekend follows on October 26 and 27. More information may be found in the bulletin.

Father Henri Nouwen encourages potential donors to believe in a spirituality of fundraising. He writes: "From the perspective of the gospel, fundraising is not a response to a crisis. Fundraising is, first and foremost, a form of ministry. It is a way of announcing our **vision** and inviting other people into our **mission**. Vision and mission are so central to the life of God's people that without vision we perish and without mission we lose our way. Vision brings together needs and resources to meet those needs. Vision also shows us new directions and opportunities for our mission. Vision gives us courage to speak when we might want to remain silent. Fundraising is proclaiming what we believe in such a way that we offer other people an opportunity to participate with us in our vision and mission. Fundraising is precisely the opposite of begging. When we seek to raise funds we are not saying, 'Please, could you help us out because lately it's been hard.' Rather, we are declaring, 'We have a vision that is amazing and exciting. We are inviting you to invest yourself through the resources that God has given you---your energy, your prayers, and your money---in this work to which God has called us.'"

I wish to encourage parents of our Junior High Ministry students to promote the very important meeting this Wednesday, October 9<sup>th</sup> from 7:30 pm to 9:00 pm in the Parish Center Seven Holy Founders room. On that night, a very special presentation by a young man, Hal Hargrave, will inspire our youth. Hal is paralyzed from a spinal cord injury and goes to college, constantly works at his recovery, and runs his "Be Perfect Foundation," which contributes greatly to the recovery of others who have suffered spinal cord injuries, and more!

In an article published in *Christopher Notes* the author writes about the *Fruits of the Holy Spirit*. First, there are Fruits for our own good: **Charity (Love)**---This is that famous word 'agape' which means 'unconquerable benevolence; **Joy**---Joy is deeper than happiness or pleasure, and persists through trials and suffering; **Peace**---Serenity which means unaffected by outer circumstances; **Patience**---We gracefully bear life's trials and suffering. Second, there are Fruits for our neighbors' welfare: **Kindness**---Being understanding and helpful; **Goodness**---Christ's kindness, the broadest sort of good; **Generosity**---Our possessions, faith, and time are generously shared with others without counting the cost; **Gentleness**---We are not irritable or resentful and we treat other respectfully; **Faithfulness**---Faithful people fulfill every duty and don't waver from any of their commitments; Fruits that give witness from afar: **Modesty**--- It moderates how we show ourselves to the world. It shows some of the beauty of God who dwells within us; **Self-control**---It is having mastery over our passions; **Chastity**---Is sexual purity. It avoids or moderates indulgence of sexual appetite. The more we can understand and cooperate with these gifts, the more they have a profound influence on our ability to follow Christ.

**NOTES FROM MUSIC MINISTRY  
By TODD HELM, MUSIC DIRECTOR**

SELECTING MUSIC FOR OUR CELEBRATIONS

One of the main responsibilities I have as music director is to select the music for the weekend Masses. This is a somewhat involved process as the goal is to select songs that are familiar but not over-used, are sing-able with voice-friendly ranges, and most importantly, have a connection to the readings of the day. The process begins with help from our chosen provider of liturgical materials - Oregon Catholic Press.

Every 3 months or so, I sit down with the OCP publication "Today's Liturgy" and plan the music for the upcoming season. In this planner, the OCP music editor provides a list of suggested songs and hymns which are connected to the readings of the week. As I begin playing through the numerous suggestions, I not only consider familiarity and vocal range, but also the song's placement in the Mass. For the Entrance Chant, a song with multiple verses is ideal so that we are singing throughout the entire procession, regardless how long or short it may be. The song for the Preparation of Gifts can also contain multiple verses to cover the offering collection and the preparation of the altar. For communion, a song with a refrain the congregation can easily sing from memory while walking to and from communion usually works best. The Song of Sending Forth is generally a hymn with fewer verses and a theme of taking our faith into the world.

The selection process is one of collaboration. Beyond the traditional music of the Masses on Saturday at 5:00, and Sunday at 7:30 and 9:00, we are blessed to have music of a more contemporary style at the Sunday Masses at 11:00 and 5:00. I rely on the expertise of Claudia Kellogg and Phi Tran to choose music that fits the style of their musicians. This is why you may notice that the hymns and songs may be different at these liturgies. I also meet weekly with Father Frank to receive his feedback, and also listen to the valuable feedback from Claudia and our cantors, since they have a true perspective of which songs inspire our congregation to sing with enthusiasm and which songs prompt people to close their books after a few lines.

The songs of the Mass are meant to enhance the liturgy and unite individuals into a community of celebration and prayer. Is there a favorite song or hymn which you would like us to sing more often? A favorite that you feel has been neglected? Or a song that you heard at another church and would like us to add it to our repertoire? 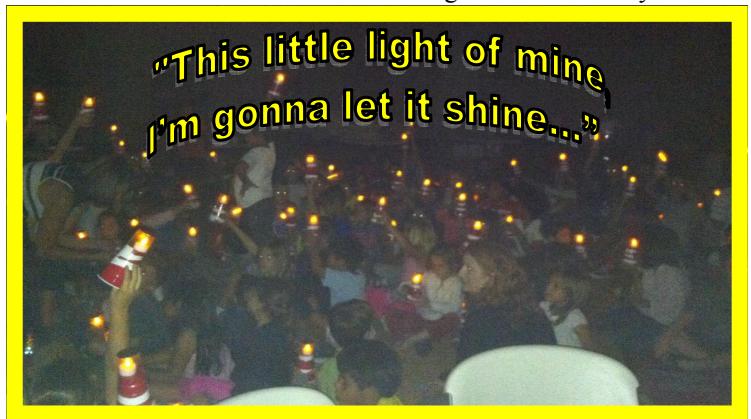
