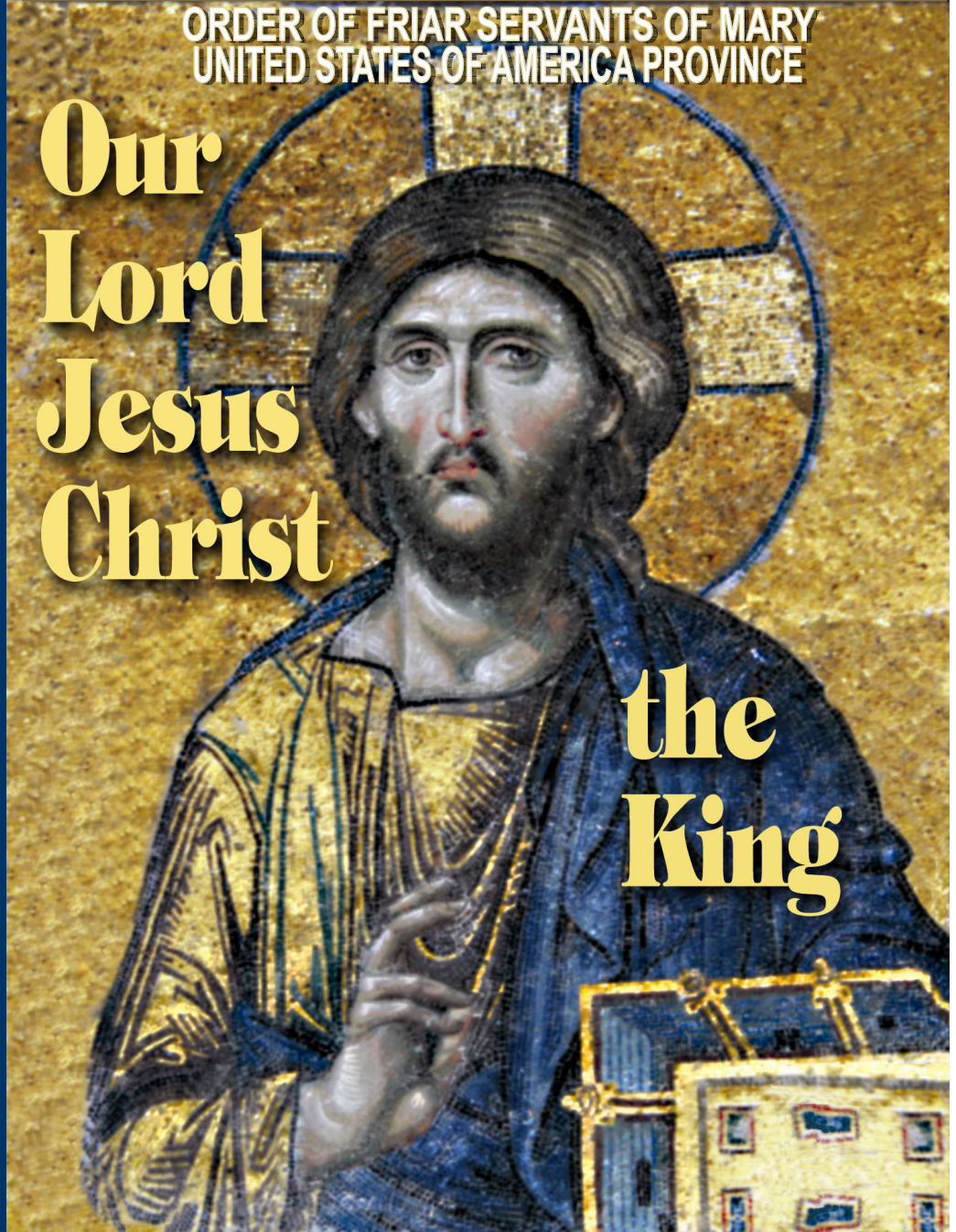

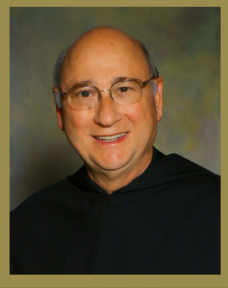

St. Juliana parishioners along with neighborhood visitors and members of the First Congregational Church of Fullerton participated in the prayer service led by Bishop Vann at Christ Cathedral last Saturday in support for *Comprehensive Immigration Reform*. The Service was well attended by advocates from various parishes in the Diocese of Orange along with clergy and Religious. Some local political

leaders were present as well. The estimated number of participants hovered around 2000. The prayers were led by Bishop Vann along with lay readers and guests who spoke briefly on a stage erected in the Cathedral outdoor plaza near the Cultural Center. It was a glorious day and a heartfelt experience interspersed with both meditative and lively music. Mike Clements and his dear wife Enedina provided transportation by chartered bus and a bag lunch for the St. Juliana delegation.

The Catholic Bishops have written the following guidelines which have been forwarded to Speaker Boehner and the Congress of the United States. *"We believe that the necessary elements for reform ought to include: (1) An earned path to full legal status, and eventual citizenship, that is reasonable and attainable; (2) Provision for immigrants brought here as minors to swiftly gain legal status to continue their education and enter the workforce; (3) The reduction of immigration application backlogs so that families may be united more quickly; (4) a temporary worker program that is safe, workable for families, and fair to all workers, immigrants and non-immigrants alike; (5) Restoration of due process protections restored for all immigrants involved with the immigration justice system; (6) the protection of refugees and unaccompanied immigrant children; and (7) a way of addressing the root causes of immigration.*

Congratulations to Scott Kambak and our Junior High Ministry on the occasion of their annual, *"5 Mile Walk to End World Hunger"* in Acacia Park from 10:30 am to 12:30 pm this Sunday. The students have collected monies from their sponsors--- friends, family, relatives---which will be donated to anti-hunger programs serving our local community and the world. The students take this yearly program seriously. Rain or shine they participate with youthful verve and resolve. Thank you Scott, students and parishioners for making this outreach possible!

The *Year of Faith* began October 11, 2012, the 50th anniversary of the opening of the Second Vatican Council, which ushered in a period of great change and renewal in the Church. It will conclude this month on November 24, the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, Universal King. Pope Francis wrote, *"Faith is not a light which scatters all our darkness, but a lamp which guides our steps in the night and suffices for the journey."* The Year of Faith inspired the slogan, *"Love It, Learn It, Live It."*

In the encyclical, *Lumen Fidei*, co-authored by Pope Benedict XVI and Pope Francis, we read: *"God does not provide arguments which explain everything; rather, his response is that of*

an accompanying presence, a history of goodness which touches every story of suffering and opens up a ray of light. In Christ, God himself wishes to share this path with us and to offer us his gaze so that we might see the light within it. Christ is the one who, having endured suffering, is 'the pioneer and perfecter of our faith.'" (Heb 12:2). (57)

Next Sunday, December 1, 2013 is the first Sunday of the Advent season and the beginning of the new Church Liturgical Year. The Knights of Columbus will be changing the missalette/hymnals in the blue binders and the Advent wreath will be blessed and lit the four Sundays of Advent. The author Greg Dues in his book entitled, *Catholic Customs and Traditions*, writes these words: *"A spirit of expectation (Advent) begins to pick up momentum: shopping trips, gift wrapping, parties, a different kind of music and song, and an avalanche of decorations. It is obvious that something wonderful is about to happen. In the midst of this swelling excitement throughout contemporary society and culture, worshippers in churches are reminded to be watchful, to repent, to do penance. This gospel message parallels a secular song heard occasionally during this time of the year: 'You better watch out, you better not cry, you better not pout, I'm telling you why: _____ is coming to town!' Purple inside churches clashes with red, green, and sparkling silver and gold everywhere else. Young and old alike prepare to celebrate Christmas by taking part in a great variety of traditions...Yes, someone 'is coming to town.' Prepare the way of the Lord!"*

The Society St. Vincent de Paul, St. Juliana Conference, recently sent \$1,000 through the International Society of St. Vincent de Paul Organization to the Philippines to assist in the relief effort after the devastation of Typhoon Haiyan. The parish will be matching that gift along with other donations from parishioners. If you wish to donate, mark your memo line and bring a check to the office or place it in the offertory collection basket at Mass. We will then forward all donations to the Diocese of Orange. I wish to thank Paul Durning and the SVD Society for their generosity.

The Knights of Columbus and the Society of Saint Vincent de Paul collaborate every year in the *Annual Food and Toy Drive* for the 125 families serviced by the Society at Christmas time. More information about this project can be found in the bulletin. I hope you will participate with the same enthusiasm as you have exhibited in past years.

This Thursday is *Thanksgiving*. You may bring food and drink to church to be blessed at the 9 am Mass. Also, I hope you will participate in the *Interfaith Thanksgiving Service* sponsored by Fullerton Interfaith Ministerial Association (FIMA) this Tuesday, November 26th here at St. Juliana. My thanks to Monette Velasco and members of the St. Juliana choir and Michele Tanaka and members of the hospitality ministry.

DIOCESE OF ORANGE FOR CHRIST FOREVER CAMPAIGN

Pledge Totals Surpass \$627,065 at St. Juliana Falconieri!

Our For Christ Forever Campaign Committee would like to thank all the families and individuals who have contributed so far and have made the diocesan campaign a great success. We have received \$627,065 in pledges from 177 parish individuals and families. At this time, we are awaiting a response from over 1,300 of our parish families. Currently, we are at **45% of goal** from only 12% of our parish. Please keep in mind that since we have surpassed our 2013 PSA goal in cash, we will now receive 25% of all monies collected up to our campaign target of \$1,287,473. **Our rebate will be used to pay down the Parish Center loan that currently stands at \$838,503** and make some roof repairs to the Church and rectory.

DIOCESAN INFO:

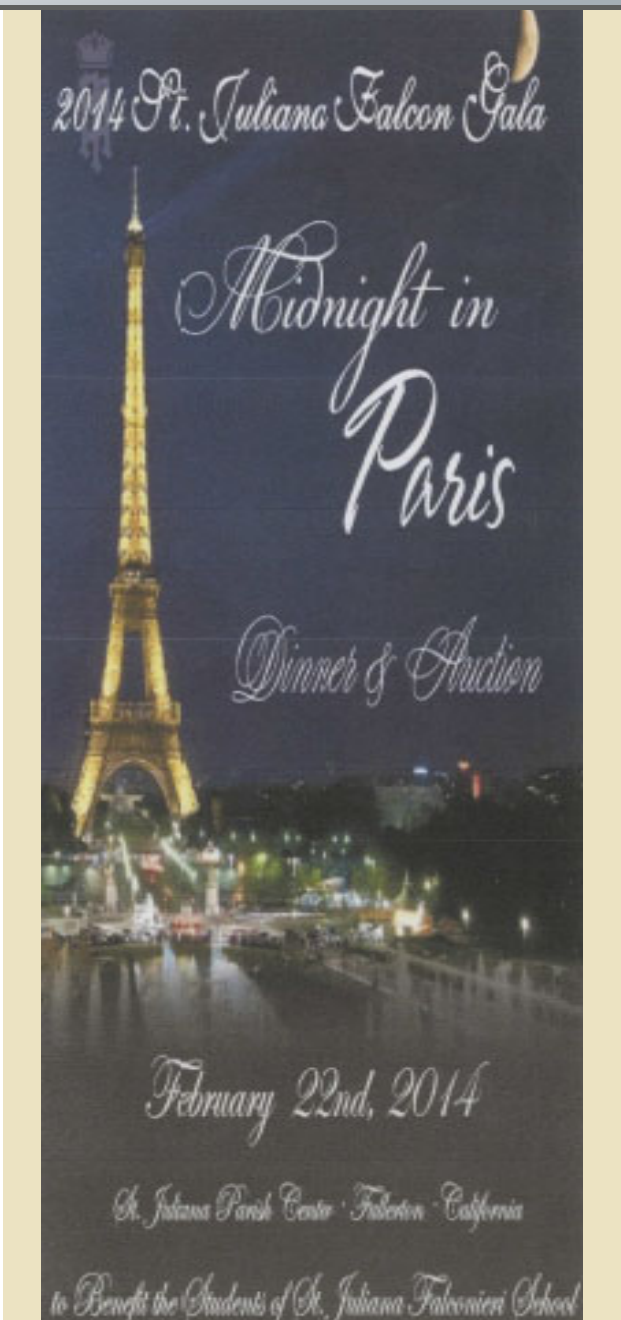

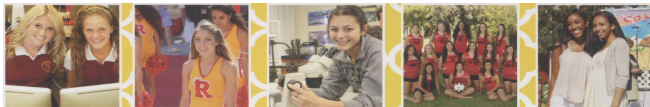
