FROM THE PASTOR



In the book *Catholic Customs and Traditions* the author Greg Dues writes a long introduction to the Advent Season which begins this weekend in preparation for Christmas. He writes: "Advent, with its many emotional overtones, ushers in the most popular season of the year. At first, from the early 4th century, the feast of the Nativity on December 25 began the church year at Rome. When Advent

evolved, it took this position, and since the 900s has been considered the beginning of the church year. This does not mean that Advent is the most important time of the year. The Easter cycle has always had this honor...The beginning of Advent always falls on the Sunday nearest the feast of St. Andrew the Apostle, November 30."

"The word Advent (Latin, adventus, 'coming') originally described the whole mystery of the Incarnation. The conception of Jesus was an Advent, but so was his birth and what will be his final coming at the endtimes. In a more popular sense, Advent was first associated with the time of the year now called Christmastime and finally with the weeks of preparation for Christmas."

"Probably the most popular tradition today is the lighting of candles on an Advent Wreath in both churches and homes. This custom originated among Lutherans in Germany in the 16th century and quickly became popular in other areas. Along with the Christmas tree, it is probably an example of Christianizing practices popular from pre-Christian times...this tradition continued into modern times. In the 1500s, it took on a distinct Christian symbolism as the Advent Wreath, first among Lutherans in eastern Germany and then among all German Protestants and Catholics. This tradition came to America with German immigrants. It was popularized among Catholics with the liturgical movement in the mid-1900s."

I'll share more about Advent as we progress through the next four weeks. I hope you will plan on coming to the morning Masses during Advent. The readings are so beautiful. Celebrating daily Mass during Advent is an excellent way to prepare for Christmas.

I received a message from Father Christopher Smith, the rector of Christ Cathedral, written to all the priests in the Diocese of Orange. He asked that we share this information with parishioners. Here is a condensed version: "The Christ Catholic Cathedral Corporation (CCCC) has made great progress in the process of renovating and transforming the cathedral campus... Already the Arboretum has been renovated and restored to its original luster, the Diocesan Pastoral Center and Christ Cathedral Academy have been renovated and greatly improved, and the 34 acres of the campus are lush and green. At the eighth annual Orange County Catholic Prayer breakfast the Most Rev. Kevin Vann, Bishop of Orange, announced the selection of two architectural firms to collaborate on the renovation and development of the cathedral structure and its surrounding grounds—Johnson Fain and Rios Clementi Hale Studios... The CCCC and our architects have reached a point where the cathedral must be closed on December 1^{st} to pedestrian traffic so

the renovation can begin....Please keep the architects, designers, contractors and cathedral communities in your prayers as we continue this important and complex project."

Some of our parishioners remember Servite Father Gabriel Ramaciotti, O.S.M. and ask about him. Father Gabriel has been living at our Servite Parish, Our Lady of Mount Carmel, in Denver, Colorado for many years. I wish to thank all St. Juliana parishioners and visitors for attending the yearly FIMA *Interfaith Thanksgiving Service* last Tuesday. Hosting it here for the second time helped the participating faith communities to know that we have an ecumenical spirit and desire to welcome other Christian and non-Christian faiths to know us better. This faith sharing happens not only in our common prayer but also in the hospitality we provided following the Service. Once again I wish to thank Michele Tanaka and the Bereavement committee for providing the conviviality following the Service. Our school children worked hard on the decorations in the church. I especially liked the "Tree of Thanksgiving". My thanks to the students, their teachers and the parents who helped.

The annual second collection for *Retired Religious* scheduled for next weekend at all the Masses is an opportunity for us to show our appreciation and concern for the health and well-being of the Sisters, Brothers, and Priests of the myriad of Religious Communities situated across the United States. Once the collection is taken up, the gifts given are then shared equally with each community. St. Juliana parishioners are remarkably generous. In the last three years you have contributed a total of \$33,213 to this fund. Awesome!

Sometimes while working in the garden I get startled by pesky little bees busily swarming around. Usually, I am not afraid of these wee creatures that have one shot at stinging you if you disturb their industry. The National Honey Board has recently published these near miraculous facts about the "yellow gold" produced by these energetic workers. Consider these facts the next time you spoon some honey on your toast or in your tea. 1) Honeybees must tap 2 million flowers to make one pound of honey; 2) A bee will visit an average of 50 to 100 flowers during one collection trip; 3) A hive of bees flies more than 55,000 miles to produce one pound of honey; 4) An average worker bee produces one-twelfth of a teaspoon of honey in its lifetime; 5) Bees have been producing honey for 10 million to 20 million years; 6) And finally, though we might be familiar with more common forms of this liquid gold made from the nectars of orange blossoms or clovers, there are over 300 different varieties of honey available in the United States.

Ralph Waldo Emerson had it right when he said, "*When Nature* has work to be done, she creates a genius to do it." God created us and all living creatures, the bee included, to possess a "genius spirit."

NOTES FROM MUSIC MINISTRY BY TODD HELM, MUSIC DIRECTOR "THE MUSIC OF ADVENT"

Advent is one of the richest musical seasons of the church year.

Even though the stores have been playing Christmas music since October, Catholic tradition maintains that Christmas begins December 24. We use the time of Advent as preparation for the Christmas season, and we hope to encourage this sense of waiting



and anticipation through the singing of some of the most beautiful hymns in our repertoire.

When I selected the music for the next four weeks, I attempted to offer a mixture of the old and the new. Included will be some of our most traditional hymns - "Creator of the Stars of Night" based on 9th century plainchant, "The Advent of Our King" and "On Jordan's Bank", both composed in 18th century, and "People Look East", based on a traditional French carol from the Renaissance. Newer songs will include "Waiting in Silence" by Carey Landry, the Advent setting of "Bread of Life" by Bernadette Farrell, and "Come Lord Jesus" by M.D. Ridge - all songs written within the last several years by current composers. On the 4th Sunday of Advent, we will sing as an Entrance Chant the first 4 verses of what is arguably the most popular and well-known Advent hymns - "O Come O Come Emmanuel". After we hear the story of the Annunciation in the Gospel reading we will sing the beautiful old Basque carol "The Angel Gabriel". We will end this celebration with the concluding verses of "O Come O Come Emmanuel", including the beautiful 7th verse which prays that the coming of Christ will "bind in one the hearts of all humankind".

Rest assured the Christmas Carols will arrive with great fanfare on Christmas Eve - and will continue being the center of our musical liturgy through the middle of January and the celebration of the Baptism of Our Lord. Until then, I hope that you will embrace the beautiful music of the Advent season by fully participating in our congregational singing.



We have received **\$627,065** in pledges from 177 parish individuals and families. At this time, we are awaiting a response from over 1,300 of our parish families. Currently, we are at **45% of goal** from only 12% of our parish. Please keep in mind that since we have surpassed our 2013 PSA goal in cash, we will now receive 25% of all monies collected up to our campaign target of \$1,287,473. **Our rebate will be used to pay down the Parish Center loan that currently stands at \$838,503** and make some roof repairs to the Church and rectory






