



MARRIAGE ~ Couples planning to be married should contact a Priest or a Deacon at least six months before scheduling a date for their wedding.




THE PARISH AS ONE BODY

~ From the Pastor ~



The feast day of the Seven Holy Founders of the Servite Order is normally celebrated on February 17th. Since this date falls on the 1st Sunday of Lent, the feast day is transferred to this Monday, February 18th. Both morning Masses on Monday will be taken from the Servite missal. Following the 8am Mass we will have some light refreshments. I hope you will attend.

Last weekend I had the opportunity to participate in the annual Men's retreat at Mater Dolorosa Retreat House in Sierra Madre. There were 40 plus men from the parish in attendance. As in the past, St. Juliana was the largest group. There were five other parishes present for the weekend. All the retreatants observed the silence admirably. It requires effort to spend an entire weekend in silence. Terry Reinbold has served as retreat Captain for many years and the consistent exemplary turnout is due in large measure to his efforts and steadfastness. My hope is that more of our school dads will consider attending next year.

Thank you for supporting our second collection for the school last weekend. Your generosity netted \$1,285.50 to help needy families supplement their tuition. This total does not include gifts parishioners give electronically. The complete monthly financial report will appear at the end of the month.

I hope by now you have taken one of the cardboard "Rice Bowls" from the church entrance. When you have filled your bowl as a family sacrifice or individually, please convert the coin into paper money, place it in the envelope provided and then bring the envelope to church on the last Sunday of Lent. We will then forward your Lenten sacrifice to Catholic Relief Services. Every year, the Catholic community in the United States assists more than 100 million of the world's poorest people through the Catholic Relief Services, with innovative, long term solutions to poverty, hunger, drought and disease, and with emergency crisis relief.

The "Little Black Book" distributed by the Small Christian Communities is a useful tool for Lenten reading. I hope you have taken one from the church. While these are free you may leave a donation to cover the cost.

By now the retirement of Pope Benedict XVI is common knowledge. His decision is certainly a wise one. Years of suffering and incapacitation endured by Pope John Paul II was certainly admirable but seemed like torture for the Pontiff. Pope Benedict sees his senior years more in line with practical wisdom. Most of us have worked hard all of our lives and retirement is not a sign of laziness or selfishness, rather it is an earned privilege.

On this first Sunday of Lent Fr. Henri Nouwen, writer, teacher, and spiritual director composed these words for our reflection: "His (Jesus) temptation reveals the true identity of Jesus. Jesus is the Beloved of God. This spiritual truth will guide all his thoughts, words and actions. It is the rock on which his compassionate ministry will be built. The 'Tempter' came to him (in the desert) asking him to prove that he was worth being loved. The

'Tempter' said to him: 'Do something useful, like turning stones into bread. Do something sensational, like throwing yourself down from a high tower. Do something that brings you power, like paying me homage.' These three temptations were three ways to seduce Jesus into becoming a competitor for love. The world of the 'Tempter' is precisely that world in which people compete for love through doing useful, sensational, and powerful things and so winning medals that gain them affection and admiration. Jesus, however, is very clear in his response: 'I don't have to prove that I am worthy of love. I am the Beloved of God, the One on whom God's favor rests.' It was that victory over the 'Tempter' that set Jesus free to choose for the compassionate life."

Congratulations to our children in St. Juliana School and in our Faith Formation program who celebrated the Sacrament of Reconciliation for the first time this Saturday. The children were so well prepared and for the most part were relaxed while participating in the ritual.

During Lent I hope you will consider celebrating morning Mass as frequently as possible. It is so heartening to see parishioners and even school children come to Mass. Also you may want to consider participating in the Stations of the Cross every Friday of Lent at 6 pm. If you come to the Fish Fry, come and pray the Stations before or after you eat.

Tickets are still on sale for the annual Get On the Bus dinner dance and auction co-sponsored by St. Juliana and the First Congregational Church of Fullerton on Saturday, March 2nd at 4pm in the Parish Center. Get On the Bus brings children and their guardians/caregivers from throughout the state of California to visit their mothers and fathers in prison. An annual event, Get On The Bus offers free transportation for the children and their caregivers to the prison, provides travel bags for the children, comfort care bags for the caregivers, a photo of each child with his or her parent, and meals for the day (breakfast, snacks on the bus, lunch at the prison, and dinner on the way home)--all at no cost to the children's family. On the trip home, following a four-hour visit, each child receives a teddy bear with a letter from their parent and post event counseling. If you are unable to attend, you may leave a donation at the office, in the offertory collection or in an envelope marked for the event.

The author Jerry Welte penned a short Lenten reflection entitled, "A Checkup with the Divine Physician" which I would like to share with you. It reads: "Lent is the season to come to the divine physician for healing. People are sometimes reluctant to go to a doctor for a checkup, in part because we tend to presume that we are okay, and in part because we are afraid to discover that we are not. We need not fear to visit Christ with our spiritual wounds and ills, however, for Jesus said, 'Those who are well do not need a physician; sick people do. I did not come to call the righteous, but sinners.' Let us open ourselves in this season of grace and mercy to the miraculous healing power of our Lord. Let us embrace our weakness so that we may be strong. May we be honest in diagnosing our ills in order to be made whole by God's love."






Who Can Attend? The event is for children who will be entering 1st grade in September to children entering 5th grade in September.



SERVITE SEVEN HOLY FOUNDERS

Feast of the Seven Holy Founders (February 17th)
Bonfilius, Bonajuncta, Manettus, Amadeus, Hugh, Sostene, and
Alexis are the names with which were canonized the seven men



ORDER OF SERVANTS OF MARY

who, around the middle of the thirteenth century, founded the Order of Friar Servants of Saint Mary in Florence. The Church and the Order venerate them with the title of the **Seven Holy Founders.** They were lay men and merchants; some were married, others single or widowed.

They were animated by a strong desire for Christian perfection and belonged to the Greater Society of Our Lady. As members of this Society they served God and

Our Lady by practicing works of charity and penance. Their desire to serve God eventually led them to leave their homes and businesses and to form a community outside the city walls. About the year 1245 they moved to Monte Senario, about twelve miles from Florence, where they built a small church and dwelling. Soon other men, desirous of prayer and solitude, joined them. Because of the holiness of their lives, the seriousness of their religious commitment, and the esteem of the people, they obtained first the approval of the bishop of Florence Ardingo, and then that of the Apostolic See. From Monte Senario the Seven and their followers returned to Florence to engage in apostolic work, and at Cafaggio they built a church, the first nucleus of the present basilica of Santissima Annunziata.

Historical data about the Seven Holy Founders are not numerous; even their names, except for Bonfilius and Alexis, are uncertain. But the spiritual characteristics of their life are certain, as told in the *Legenda de origine Ordinis*, the oldest account of the work of the Seven Saints, transmitted by an uninterrupted tradition. These characteristics are an ardent love of God and Our Lady, humility, a spirit of service, a disposition to harmony and pardon, and an active desire to promote peace.

The Seven Holy Founders were canonized as a group by Pope Leo XIII in 1888. Their mortal remains are venerated in the basilica of Monte Senario.

VATICAN STATEMENT SUCCESSOR TO THE POPE

The conclave that will elect Benedict XVI's successor will have 117 members on the day his resignation becomes official, at the end of this month. There are 61 Europeans, 19 Latin Ameri-

cans, 14 North Americans, 11 Africans, 11 Asians and one from Oceania among the voters. Benedict XVI will not participate in the conclave. The country with the greatest number of cardinalelectors is Italy, with 21.

Sixty-seven of the electors were created by Benedict XVI and the remaining 50 by John Paul II.

The conclave will proceed according to the rules of "Ordo Rituum Conclavis," established by Pope John Paul II's apostolic constitution "Universi Dominici Gregis."

During the time between the Holy Father's resignation and the election of the next pontiff, Cardinal Tarcisio Bertone, as the cardinal camerlengo, will have the fundamental role in governing the Church.

While the conclave is ongoing, the cardinals reside within the Vatican. They are not permitted any contact with the outside world.

Jesuit Father Federico Lombardi, director of the Vatican press office, reported that Benedict XVI will go to the papal summer residence at Castel Gandolfo when he leaves office on Feb. 28. After that he will reside in a cloistered monastery within the Vatican walls. Please keep Pope Benedict in your prayers.


