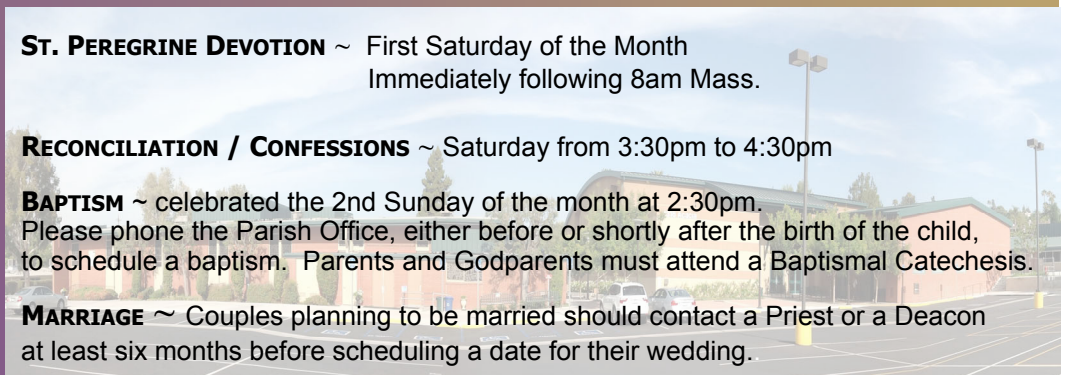

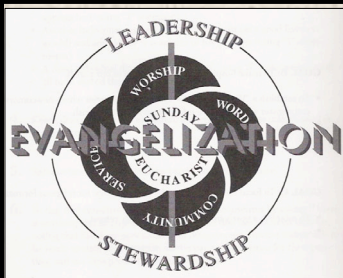

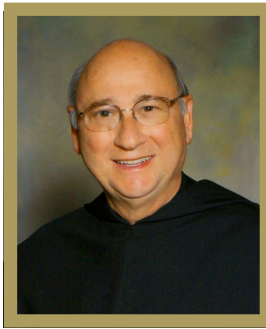

Jerry Welte in his little pamphlet, *Lent, the Healing Season* writes a short reflection, *Getting the Whitest White* based on St. Luke's description of the Transfiguration: "*The appearance of his face changed and his clothes became dazzling white*". He says: "*When we were baptized, we 'put on Christ,' and were given a pure white baptismal gown as a sign of our goodness. In time, however, that garment is stained with our fail-*

*ings. Laundry detergents are famous for advertising their ability to produce 'whiter whites.'* Faith also boasts the ability to remove the stains from our Christian attire so that we can again wear them proudly. Today we wash our clothes in God's mercy, as it says in Isaiah: "*Though your sins be like scarlet, they shall be white as snow.*" Jerry suggests: "Wear white today at church (next week) and home as a sign of your sharing in the glory of Christ and the holiness of God."

Congratulations to our second graders who experienced the sacrament of reconciliation for the first time last Saturday and were enrolled at the 9am & 11am Masses as candidates for First Eucharist in May. Blessings to their teachers Kayla Arabia, Debbie Barker, Jennifer Duck and Sheila McHenry.

RCIA team members Steve Enke and Barbara Dierterle along with our catechumens and candidates: *Sidney Ewing-Davis, Robert Davis, Isaiah Ewing, Lorena Frobenius, Samantha Rose Gallo, Gail Henkhaus, Domingo Melendez* joined Bishop Kevin Vann, Pastors, and RCIA communities from around the Diocese of Orange at Holy Family Cathedral last Saturday night for the Rite of Election and Call to Continuing Conversion. 328 Catechumens and Candidates along with their sponsors participated. It was a privilege for me to read the St. Juliana names publicly and present these newly chosen ones to the Bishop.

Our parish Mission opens this Monday, February 25<sup>th</sup> and continues until Wednesday evening. The Mission begins 7 pm with a different preacher each night. There is more information in the bulletin. I hope you will attend.

During Lent it is customary to extend our prayer life as part of the threefold discipline of Lent: *Prayer, Fasting, and Almsgiving* to include daily Mass and Stations of the Cross on Friday evenings at 6 pm. In the recent edition of the *National Catholic Register* team writers Tom and April Hoopes suggest ways to expand the threefold discipline. *Fasting:* 1) Skip meat an extra day or two a week; 2) Give up coffee or reduce to one cup a day; 3) Give up all unnecessary shopping; 4) Fast from music or talk radio in the car. *Prayer:* 1) Begin the daily rosary; 2) Meditate for 10 minutes a day; 3) Read a book on the life of Christ; 4) Read the Catechism of the Catholic Church's 74 page section on prayer. *Almsgiving:* 1) Visit a nursing home with your children; 2) Forgive someone and patch things up in a visit or phone call or letter; 3) Say a kind word to everyone you meet; 4) Pay one significant compliment or more to each of your children every day; 5) Visit an elderly friend or relative; 6) Save up a significant amount of money for a deserving charity or apostolate.

Our third annual *Get on the Bus* buffet dinner dance is this Sat-

urday March 2<sup>nd</sup> at 4pm in the Parish Center. This event is co-sponsored by the First Congregational Church of Fullerton and St. Juliana. Barbara Johnson and Marti Shrank represent the Congregational Church. Jo-Anne Matsuba, Jan Fontes, Barbara Kelley, Gail & Jim Besaw, Patti Chikahisa, Jennifer Powell, Alberta Saran, and Barbara Dietterle represent St. Juliana. Besides the committee our High School Ministry and a host of volunteers will be on hand to ensure a smooth operation. Money raised will help to hire buses to bring children to visit there incarcerated parents on Mother's Day and Father's Day. My thanks to the committee and all the volunteers.

Rabbi Ken Milhander and the congregation of Temple Beth Tikvah will present an "Interfaith Passover Seder Experience" on Thursday, March 14<sup>th</sup> at 7pm at the Temple. The "Experience" will include the story of the Exodus from slavery in Egypt through a specially created "haggadah" (a book used for the Passover service and meal) and a sample of traditional Passover foods. I plan on attending with Mike McHenry and I hope more parishioners will attend too. There will be a flyer with a reservation form in the bulletin. For now, please mark your calendars.

St Jude Medical Center Senior Services has a valuable program called *Caring Neighbors*. This program is administered by volunteers and is available to those who 1) Live in N. Orange County; 2) Are at least 65 years of age; 3) Live in a private residence or apartment; 4) Limited financial resources; 5) Have limited contact with family and/or friends. Next weekend a representative from *Food For The Poor* will speak at all the Masses. This program seeks out the poorest of the poor in 16 countries, aiding some of the most destitute. In each face the living Christ is seen who is hungry, thirsty, a stranger and naked. The organization serves those ignored in society by feeding the hungry, building water wells for thirsty villages, building houses for the homeless, aiding the impoverished elderly, raising orphans in a loving Christian atmosphere and discipline, healing the sick and overcoming illiteracy by supporting schools.

Our first two *Friday Lenten Fish Fry's* were well attended and the food exceptional both in quality and quantity. If you haven't eaten your yearly quota of fish, come to the Fish Fry before or after Stations of the Cross and enjoy the food and fellowship. My thanks to all the volunteers especially the kitchen staff and cooks who faithfully perform their duties each Friday.

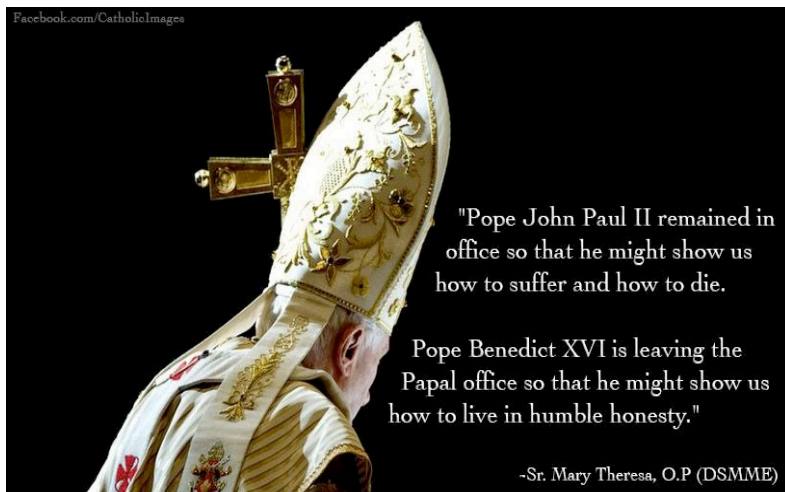
**MIDDLE SCHOOL YOUTH MINISTRY**

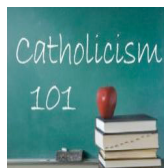

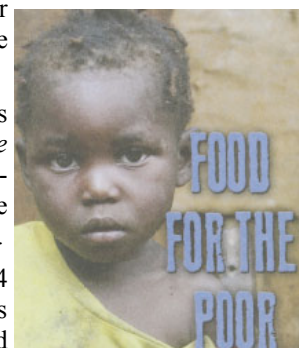
## FOOD FOR THE POOR

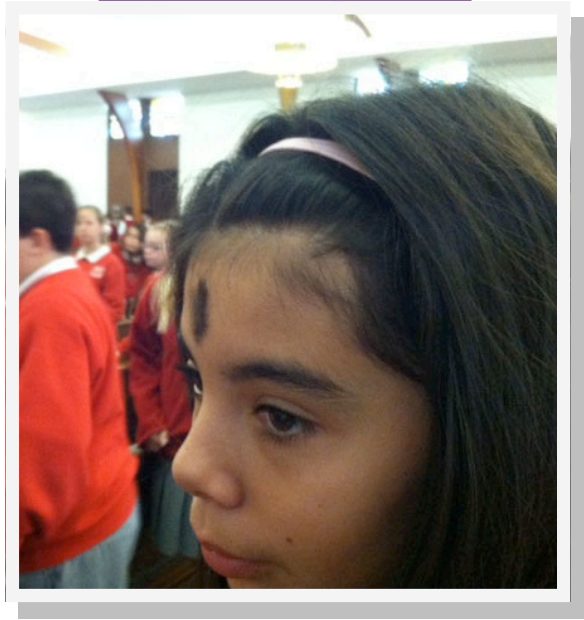

**MEN'S RETREAT FOLLOW-UP NEWS**

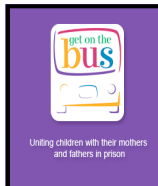

**FIGHTING THE FLU & MASS**

Here are some insights issued by the Diocese:

1. If you are sick you should stay home from Mass. It is not sinful to miss Mass if your are sick. It is actually an act of charity towards your brothers and sisters.
2. Those who hold hands during the Our Father you can adopt an orans posture (hands extended by not touching.)
3. For the sign of peace a nod, eye contact or verbal greeting is sufficient.
4. For receiving Eucharist and you are sick, receive the Blessed Sacrament in the hand instead of on the tongue. And since the Precious Blood is an option, it is again an act of charity to avoid drinking from the cup while you are ill. The body, blood, soul and divinity of Jesus exists in both species, bread and wine.



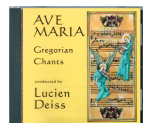
