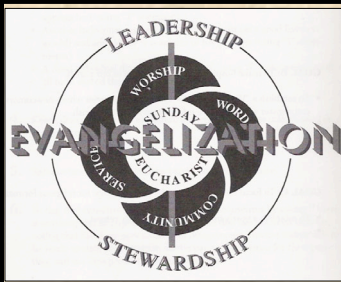

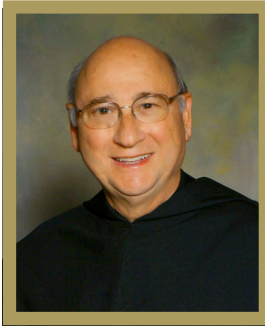

Shortly after the Parish Center dedication the custom of serving coffee and donuts began again. Parish organizations assigned volunteers to take a turn serving the refreshments every Sunday following the 7:30am and 9:00am Masses. At the end of Mass parishioners were invited to come over to the Center and have a donut, and while sipping coffee, juice and chocolate milk, enjoy conversation with fellow parishioners.

Nearly, six years later the custom continues. In the early days many came over to the Center. Each parish organization designated two or three members to serve the food and drink. Parishioners dutifully picked up their favorite donut and drink and mingled.

While this is how Sunday coffee and donut fellowship started out and continued for a period of time, at present the interest and participation has greatly dwindled. Parish organizations have not been consistent in appointing volunteers. Sal Mancino has generously served in this capacity, often without adequate help. Some come into the hall and take one or two donuts and head out the door.

We need to re-think this Sunday custom and weigh the pros and cons for continuing it. The idea of having this kind of fellowship ideally has great merit. We get to know each other better. The children enjoy the snacks and chocolate milk. New church members feel welcome.

I hope that as you reflect, you will see the value of this Sunday fellowship and participate more faithfully, even if it is only for ten or fifteen minutes. It is understandable that we are busy and weekends are often the only time we have to run errands and catch up on chores. So, if you have not come over to the Center lately or ever, please reconsider and help keep this "family tradition" viable. It is also important that we take one donut per person until everyone has had a donut. Only then we can have seconds or thirds. I hope you understand the reasoning.

The Knights of Columbus have been a strong voice in support of the right-to-life and religious liberty. Nationally, Knights have contributed large sums of money and countless prayers as well as time and talent in upholding Catholic teaching and causes. Here at St. Juliana our Knights have devoted money and man power to the Armory, St. Vincent de Paul, parish support, the blood drive and other projects large and small.

A few months ago I was asked by the Knights if they would be allowed to replace the Mary grotto that had to be dismantled due to the construction of the Parish Center. The site has been chosen on the side of the church facing the parking lot. Some of the shrubbery has been removed and soon the ground will be prepared for the first phase of construction. The Knights have filed for a permit with the city of Fullerton to construct the grotto to honor Mother Mary on the parish grounds. The statue will replace the previous one the Knights provided but was destroyed during the construction of the Parish Center. This new statue and its grotto-like enclosure have been donated by parishioner

Leon Valenzuela and his family. The architectural services of Keith Wismer to design the structure and of James Tuchscher to provide the structural review have been donated to the parish. West Coast Arbor has removed the shrubbery on the site as a gift to the parish. Construction of the concrete pedestal, rock-facing and concrete walkway will be accomplished at cost of materials and labor by C.R. Heimlich & Son. As a donation to the parish, they will not charge any overhead or profit. The cost of materials and labor will be funded by the Knights. More information will follow as the project unfolds.

Wednesday, February 13th is Ash Wednesday. The schedule of Liturgical services is printed in this bulletin. Please be mindful that the imposition of ashes will take place only at the scheduled services. You will find the directives for fasting and abstinence in this bulletin.

In a booklet entitled, *Pastoral Patterns* used at Mass, there are a few paragraphs I would like to share with you which I believe summarize our Lenten journey toward the Easter Sacraments. We read: *With Joel's trumpet as a spiritual "call to arms," the Church summons the whole community to Lenten "battle stations." All ages and occupations, married, single, ordained, vowed: we embrace the outward fast that signals our inward conversion. Catholic tradition defines this "fasting" broadly: "More sparing, therefore, let us make the words we speak, the food we take, our sleep, our laughter, every sense learn peace through holy penitence." But Lent is an "acceptable time" not because we offer token sacrifices or undertake personal self-improvement, but because we pledge to rebuild broken relationships with God and neighbor, right past wrongs, chart a new future, renew our discipleship. Jesus not only names Lent's spiritual "weapons"---almsgiving, prayer, fasting---he instructs us on their proper "deployment": no showing off to impress God or others. Rather, as we wash off the blessed ashes, we begin cleansing our hearts.....we recognize the pattern of Jesus' self-sacrificing love that marks our lives, as winter-locked February begins to blossom into a Lenten spring warmed by our renewed devotion to prayer, self-control, and practical charity.*

Next Sunday, February 17th, is the calendar feast day of the Seven Holy Founders of the Servite Order (Friar Servants of Mary). Since it is the first Sunday of Lent the celebration is moved to Monday, February 18th. We will have a commemoration prayer on Sunday and the full Mass of the Founders at the 6:30am and 8am Masses on Monday. Following the 8am Mass we will serve coffee and donuts outside of Church near the St. Juliana shrine door. I will need two or three volunteers to set-up and serve the coffee and donuts. Members of our Servite Secular Order will serve coffee and donuts at the usual time on Sunday.

As we prepare to celebrate *Valentine's Day* this Thursday don't forget to tell that special someone how much you love and care for him/her. St. Paul's words have special meaning for Christian lovers: *"Love is patient, love is kind.....There are in the end three things that last: faith, hope, and love, and the greatest of these is love."*

FASTING AND ABSTINENCE INFO

Catholics who are over the age of 18 and under the age of 60 are required to fast on Ash Wednesday, which means that they can eat only one complete meal and two smaller ones during the day, with no food in between. Catholics who are over the age of 14 are required to refrain from eating any meat, or any food made with meat, on a day of fast and abstinence.

LENT - PRAYER, FASTING AND ALMSGIVING

Lent begins this week, on Ash Wednesday, February 13th. Masses are at 6:30am, 8:00am, 11:00am (school Mass) and 7:00pm. Ash Wednesday is not a Holy Day of Obligation. It is, however, a day of fasting and abstinence. (See info above.)

The Lenten "Little Black Books" - for prayer and reflection, are available after all Masses this weekend.

Catholic Relief Services *Rice Bowls* are also available after all Masses. Thank you for considering *Rice Bowls* as part of your Lenten practice.

Lent is a time for us to renew our prayer life, to fast and sacrifice in ways that will bring us closer to God, and to share our love and treasure with the poor. During Lent we try to ... 'give up' ... 'give back' ... and 'give in'.

Give Up Traditionally we choose something to 'give up' for Lent. Each time we don't watch our favorite TV show, don't buy that candy bar or forgo that favorite snack we remind ourselves of Jesus' sacrifice on the cross. It helps us to keep God in our hearts and minds during Lent.

Give Back When we serve the poor, we love God. When we use the time, talent & treasure that is given to us by God to help those less fortunate, we become the hands and feet of God in our world. Service to the needy - almsgiving- is an essential part of our Lenten devotion and Catholic tradition.

Give In The most important contribution we can make to our spiritual lives is a complete surrender to God - giving in to God's unending love, letting it transform us in new ways. In fasting, charity and prayer, our hearts and minds open to God's life-giving grace. Give in to God's love!

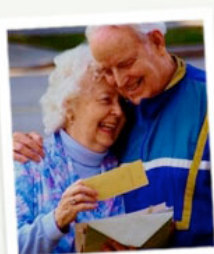
WORLD MARRIAGE DAY

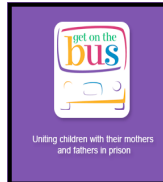

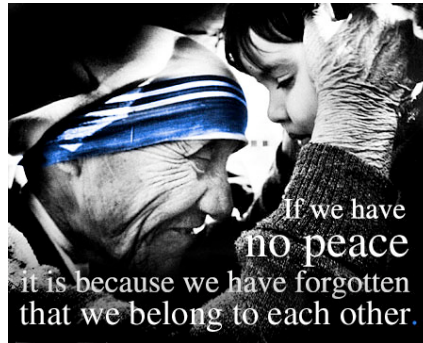

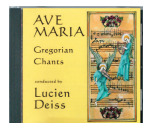
