



~ From the Pastor ~



Father Pat Donovan's death last Sunday morning came as a startle to everyone. When I announced it at the 11am and 5pm Masses there was a hush in Church. Fr. Pat lived in a board and care home in Irvine and was very happy with his accommodations and care. Fr. Paul and I helped to move him to his new home last April and visited with him once he settled in. When Fr. Luke ar-

rived he visited him a number of times along with parishioners and close friends of Fr. Pat.

A vigil service will take place this Sunday evening at 7pm in church with the recitation of the Office of the Dead from the Servite ritual. Our Vicar Provincial, Father Jerry Horan, O.S.M. will be the main celebrant of the Funeral Mass on Monday morning at 10am. Father Michael Pontarelli, O.S.M. will preach. Following Mass, there will be a reception in the Parish Center and the burial will follow at the Servite burial plot at Holy Sepulcher Cemetery.

Fr. Pat lived a relatively long and healthy life. His response when asked, "How are you doing?" was always the same, "Very well, thank you!" He was a determined person in whatever project he was engaged in. Once he made up his mind he hardly ever wavered. Devoted to his teaching career and the success of his students, Fr. Pat gave generously of his time and talent to his professional career that spanned over 40 years. May he rest in peace!

On this Third Sunday of Lent we hear the Gospel words: "Sir, let this fig tree alone for one more year." Jerry Welte in his pamphlet, "Lent the Healing Season" writes: We've heard the plea countless times in movies and TV shows: "Give me another chance!" Second chances are a precious, saving gift in relationships of all kinds. Friends, spouses, siblings, students, and employees have all benefited from the mercy and faith that bids a person to give us one more opportunity to come through and bear fruit. God is our ultimate role model in this, for each of us has been given countless second chances after failing to live up to our potential or the gospel. Let us pray this Sunday: "Patient God, in our weakness we fail you, but you offer us forgiveness. Help us to share the grace of your second chances."

However, the number present on the three evenings was less than anticipated. This is certainly indicative of the times we live in when we are too busy and overcommitted. I believe our guest speakers were well prepared, interesting, uplifting, and genuinely sincere.

There is still time to come to morning Mass on a regular basis in the remaining weeks of Lent and beyond. The Stations of the Cross, a traditional devotion, teaches us to love God and to "Turn away from Sin and be Faithful to the Gospel" as we relive the last hours of Jesus' life on earth.

After months of preparation, the time has come this weekend for our Third Annual *Get On the Bus* dinner and auction. The committee formed by St. Juliana and First Congregational Church has worked hard and long. It is our hope and prayer that this fundraiser will be successful. I am sure we will have a report to share with you in a future bulletin.

You will find the latest edition of *The Catholic Worker* Newspaper on the bulletin shelves in church. Please take a copy home with you. The following are titles of some of the articles you will find: "*Iraq: Hope amid Sorrow*," "*The Church and Climate Change*," "*Our Humanity is at Stake*," "*Workers in Gaza under Seige*".

Theologian Karl Rahner in, "The Great Church Year: The Best of Karl Rahner's Homilies, Sermons, and Meditations" writes this Lenten reflection: The Gospel tells us what came as the result of Jesus' fast in the desert---his temptation by the devil. Its place in our Lord's life is at the beginning of the messianic activity. Before he begins to announce the kingdom of God has come in his person, before he begins to preach, he prays... Before he mingles with the multitude, he enters the solitude. Before he seeks out men and women, he first seeks the face of his Father in heaven. And he fasts....Jesus goes into the desert... (where) he leaves behind everything else that a man needs even for bare existence, so that for this once, not just in the depths of his heart but in the whole range of his being, he can do and say what is the first and last duty of humankind---to find God, to seek God, to belong to God to the exclusion of everything else that makes up human life. And therefore he fasts. Therefore through this cruelly hard act, this denial of all comfort, this refusal of food and drink, through the solitude and abandonment of the desert, through everything else that involves a rejection, a self-denial of the world and all earthly company, through all these he proclaims this fact: one thing only is necessary, that I be with God, that I find God, and everything else, no matter how great or beautiful, is secondary and subordinate and must be sacrificed, if needs be, to this ultimate movement of heart and spirit.

A parting thought from Nancy Thayer: "The universe is always speaking to us...sending us little messages, causing coincidences and serendipities, reminding us to stop, to look around to believe in something else, something more."

FR. PATRICK DONOVAN, O.S.M. ~ MARCH 7, 1927 - FEBRUARY 24, 2013

Fr. Patrick J. (Michael) Donovan was a Servite Friar of the United States of America Province. He was born to Patrick and Julia (Cullinane) Donovan on March 7, 1927 in Vancouver, British Columbia. He entered the Novitiate of the Servite Order at Mt. St. Philip (Granville, WI) on 22 August 1948. He professed Solemn Vows on September 21, 1952 and was ordained to the priesthood on May 15, 1955. He had an MA (History) and an MA (Education, Administration and Supervision) from Loyola University (Chicago).

> He served the church in Orange County for 41 of his 57 Years of Priestly Ministry. Father Patrick was a Catholic educator for 31 years. He taught 10 years at St. Philip Basilica High School (Chicago, IL). He came to Servite Priory (Anaheim, CA) in 1965. He served as Assistant Principal, Social Studies Department Chair and History Instructor at Servite High School for 18 years. He also served as principal of Servite High School from 1988 to 1991. From 1992-2012, he served in the parishes of St. Philip Benizi and St. Juliana Falconieri. He was Newman Chaplain at California State University, Fullerton until retirement in 2011. For the past year, he has resided at Irvine Cottages, where he received excellent care. He died peacefully at St. Joseph Hospital, (Orange, CA). He is survived by his brother John Donovan (Wife: Perla) and his sister Kay Kleinen (Husband: Rae), 3 Nephews (Paul, Dan and Patrick), 1 Niece (Linda Orvick) and 10 Great Nephews and Nieces.

Warmly welcome the visiting Servite Friars and Fr. Pat's family, who are with us to celebrate his life with a Servite Vigil Service this Sunday evening at 7pm, in the church, and Funeral Mass on Monday, March 4th at 10am at St. Juliana's.
