

~ From the Pastor ~



I wake up to music every morning on my clock radio. Classical music is my preference. It's not as jolting as most popular music which defies description and the News which is generally negative and depressing. Lately, I have been trying to catch a few extra minutes of lazy time. My shoulder still hurts and most nights my sleep is interrupted. The extra few

minutes affords me the illusion of extended rest but I am still blurry eyed.

The other morning when I finally got up to prepare for the 6:30 a.m. weekday Mass I opened both windows in my room and to my delight I heard a loud, clear, and vigorous medley of bird songs. This choral ensemble appeared unexpectedly and I enjoyed every minute of the soothing chirps, whistles, and melodies. What a way to start the day.

This made me think of all the wonderful surprises that await us every day. Unfortunately I have practiced the art of distraction, preoccupation, worry, and fearful anticipation for so many years, that I frequently miss out on the simple pleasures. I let slip by the God-given gifts that come without warning and are meant to revive my weary spirit and prepare me for whatever the new day brings in my work and family life. Of course this is not intentional but occurs nonetheless.

The antidote to living an obtuse life is to "wake-up" and begin to intentionally notice the commonplace.....trees, smells, the sun and moon, clouds, chirps, smiles, laughter, even our own breathing. I wish I could be better at this. I know it's possible but I forget.

In a series of Lenten reflections written by Father Henri Nouwen there is a reflection entitled, "Embracing Silence" based on the text from Saint Matthew, 26:40: "So, could you not stay awake with me one hour?" He writes: "Have you ever tried to spend a whole hour doing nothing but listening to the voice that dwells deep in your heart? When there is no radio to listen to, no TV to watch, no book to read, no person to talk to, no project to finish, no phone call to make, how does that make you feel? Often it does no more than make us so aware of how much there is still to do that we haven't done yet that we decide to leave the fearful silence and go back to work! It is not easy to enter into the silence and reach beyond the many boisterous and demanding voices of our world and to discover there the small intimate voice saying: 'You are my Beloved Child, on you my favor rests.' Still, if we dare to embrace our solitude and befriend our silence, we will come to know that voice. I do not want to suggest to you that one day you will hear that voice with your bodily ears. I am not speaking about a hallucinatory voice, but about a voice that can be heard by the ear of faith, the ear of the inner heart "

The Stations of the Cross devotion is a true Lenten treasure. There are many versions of this visual aid. The underlying theme is that Jesus freely chose to suffer for us in order to teach us that when our daily walk produces pain, disappointment, adversity or the like, we are to embrace it with courage and forbearance. Unpleasant as it may seem, momentary pain and suffering can strengthen us in all sorts of unforeseen circumstances. The Redemptive work of Jesus on the cross makes it possible to see beyond the moment to the victory. The walk to Calvary was not Jesus' plan. However, he never wavered from the blessed assurance that for those who remain faithful only good awaits them.

One of the Stations dear to me but not explicitly found in the "Way of the Cross" as recorded in Scripture is when "Jesus Meets His Mother on the Way to Calvary." For centuries Catholic Tradition has upheld the Compassion of Mary. What Mother would not be beside her dying son? For this reason next Friday we will substitute the Stations for *The Desolata of Mary* or the Compassion of Mary. This Servite devotion traces Mary's presence with Jesus during the last day of his life. I hope you will come to pray and reflect with me as we prepare for Palm Sunday and Holy Week.

Operation Rice bowl sponsored by *Catholic Relief Services* (CRS) comes to end next Sunday. Our school children and teens have been very faithful to this Lenten almsgiving program. Your Lenten gifts to this Corporal Work of Mercy make a big difference. Just think of these statistics: *\$10 provides two weeks* of food for a family of 6; *\$25 affords health exams for 13 kids; \$50 delivers clean water for 500 families a day; \$100 immuniz-es 157 newborn.* What you gave up for Lent changes lives. Converting coin to paper money will help the office staff process your gifts to send them to CRS.

The Papal *Good Friday Collection* makes possible the programs that support Christians and pilgrims in the Holy Land. For 800 years the Holy See (Vatican) has entrusted to the Franciscans the care of the Holy Places for the benefit of the Christians who live there and all who come as pilgrims from around the world. In 2011 it cost over 18 million dollars to: 1) Maintain the Holy Places; 2) Social and charitable enterprises; 3) Pastoral activities; 4) Educational and scientific endeavors; 5) Liturgical, Ecumenical and Communications programs. This special collection will be taken up at the Good Friday Liturgical service.

Next Sunday Churches everywhere will overflow with worshipers who come to receive blessed Palms. The first Palm Sunday crowds gathered to see Jesus as he entered Jerusalem. In their excitement they cut branches and waved vigorously. Once the cortege passed by, many returned home unaffected. As we relive this moment in our history, the Church needs cheerleaders: *Ambassadors for Christ*, in *St.* Paul's words. With so much negativity, cynicism, and disappointment directed toward the Catholic Church in social media, we who faithfully participate in church worship and ministry need to be the hands, mouthpiece, eyes and ears of the Risen Christ. It is our responsibility to encourage those who have left the practice of their Catholic faith with words that express our experience.

Saying the rosary and meditating on the mysteries allows us to become aware of the life of Jesus, as witnessed in the eyes of his Mother.


