

#### ~ From the Pastor ~

#### March 10, 2013



Thank you for your patient listening last weekend at all the Masses. Fr. Gary Norman, from *Food For the Poor* spoke a little too long at homily time. However, I believe his message came across well and I am confident that St. Juliana parishioners will support this corporal work of mercy.

I am so happy that our Lenten Stations of the Cross devotion has steadily increased these past few Fridays. Some are coming as a family and introducing this traditional devotion to their children. Why not include the Stations when you come to the Fish Fry?

How is your Operation Rice Bowl coming along? This weekend we begin the fourth week of Lent. Some things you may not know or have forgotten about Catholic Relief Services Rice Bowl program: 75% of your gift supports CRS' programs around the world; agriculture projects help farmers improve harvests; water projects bring clean water to communities; microfinance projects support small businesses; mother and child health projects offer health and nutrition services; education projects provide resources and training; 25% of your gift supports local hunger and poverty alleviation in the Diocese of Orange.

In the remaining weeks of Lent, let us pray these intentions: "Loving God, we pray for the 925 million people in our world who don't have enough food;" "Loving God, we pray for the 1.4 billion people in our world who live on less than \$1.25 per day;" "Loving God, we pray for our brothers and sisters who fall ill from preventable diseases;" "Loving God, we pray for the 101 million elementary school-aged children in our world who are not enrolled in school;" "Loving God, we pray for the 894 million people worldwide who don't have access to clean water." Amen!

In a leaflet published by *The Christophers* entitled: "Positive Attitude-Positive Choices" the author writes these words worth noting: "*Thomas Alva Edison, the renowned creator of the light bulb, the phonograph, and other inventions, had a huge laboratory complex in New Jersey. The day after it was destroyed by fire, he said, 'There is great value in disaster. All our mistakes are burned up. Thank God we can start anew.' He rebuilt and went on to acquire an amazing 1,093 patents in his lifetime. Attitude is more than how we look at life; it's how we choose to live. Whether we consider ourselves born optimists or have to struggle to see a glass that's half-full, we can always choose to start anew. Being positive not only helps us accomplish our goals, but also seek happiness."* 

Time is so precious. We are told that Lent is a time for reflection and introspection. How many of us have the time or discipline? Do you find it hard to sit still? To stop running here and there? To sit quietly without a cell phone, I-Pad, or CD playing? I suspect most of us would reply in the affirmative. Henri Nouwen in a collection of Lenten reflections entitled, "*Journey* of the Heart" shared his experience with dealing with the multitude of distractions that sabotage our tranquility and ability to be reflective. He writes: "While being so busy running my own life, I become oblivious to the gentle movements of the Spirit of God within me, pointing me in directions quite different from my own. It requires a lot of inner solitude and silence to become aware of these divine movements. God does not shout, scream, or push. The Spirit of God is soft and gentle like a small voice or a light breeze. It is the spirit of love. Maybe we still do not fully believe that God's Spirit is, indeed, the Spirit of love, always leading us deeper into love. Maybe we still distrust the Spirit, afraid to be led to places where our freedom is taken away. Maybe we still think of God's Spirit as an enemy who wants something of us that is not good for us. But God is love, only love, and God's Spirit is the Spirit of love longing to guide us to the place where the deepest desires of our heart can be fulfilled."

Mr. Scott Kambak, the director of our Junior High Youth Ministry, writes in his latest "The Good News" Newsletter: "Ah, Springtime! Time of renewal and growth....and hope. We hope that you (students) will take advantage of all of the opportunities that we provide for your renewal and growth this Spring. We urge you to come on out for our important meetings and our exciting activities...."

I hope parents will read this and encourage their Junior High children to participate. Unfortunately, I was unable to attend the February meeting/program on Cesar Chavez because it was Ash Wednesday night. I hope to attend the March 13<sup>th</sup> presentation by Fullerton Police Corporal J. DiCaprio, the department's homeless liaison officer, in the Parish Center Seven Holy Founders' meeting room. He will share his experience and the city's efforts to help the homeless, the poor, etc. The presentation is from 7:30 to 9:00pm.

Winter copies of *The Catholic Worker* are on the bulletin shelves in church. Please feel free to take one. When you have finished reading this social action newspaper, please share it with someone or leave if for someone to pick up and read.

The St. Patrick's Day dinner dance is just around the corner. This annual event is being sponsored by the Knights of Columbus. There are pre-sale tickets available this weekend.

You will find a copy of *Servites Today* Newsletter in the bulletin this weekend. Like all the publications we set aside, feel free to share with others outside the parish.

Father Anthony de Mello, S.J. tells a story he entitled "Grace." He writes: "A man was lost in a desert. Later, when describing his ordeal to his friends, he told how, in sheer despair, he had knelt down and cried out to God to help him. "And did God answer your prayer?" he was asked. "Oh, no! Before He could, an explorer appeared and showed me the way."






