

FROM THE PASTOR



The Easter season continues. Let us sing and pray with gusto. Even if you do not like to sing or pray out loud, please take a hymnal in hand and follow along with the words. Hymns during Easter are filled with joy and spirit. They contain theology and teaching to strengthen our faith and challenge our intellect.

Divine Mercy Sunday devotion has gained wide appeal among Catholics. Last Sunday our parish celebrated the devotion with dignity and reverence. I wish to thank Donna Dostalik, Christine Parker, Maureen Harry and the Divine Mercy volunteers for their efforts in promoting Divine Mercy and organizing the details. If you attended, I am sure you will agree that our celebration had a definite spiritual impact. May all who came last Sunday to pray, continue to grow in their faith and serve the people of God.

Father Andrew Apostoli, a Franciscan Friar of the Renewal, wrote an article in the March 24-April 6, 2013 edition of the National Catholic Register on the topic of *Popular Piety*. He writes: "We've been blessed with this Year Of Faith in which we're being encouraged to renew our faith and grow in it so that our relationship to God will deepen and our growth in holiness will be strengthened....Because we are creatures of body and soul, we need concrete expressions of our faith that make the things we believe in that are unseen become somewhat more tangible through external signs and helps to our devotion. That is why we have devotions in the Catholic Church....We need these expressions so that the mysteries or teachings of our Church do not remain merely intellectual beliefs. They must affect us in our whole being, and that's where devotion is such a strong impetus."

Mr. Ed Murphy, who was appointed recently as a lay team member of the Servite Friars' vocation program will be with us to talk at all the Masses next weekend about the vocation of a Servite Friar. Please extend a warm welcome to Ed.

Every year since the dedication of the Parish Center, the coffee and donut fellowship has dwindled. When the Center was built, the extra space to hold parish meetings and events engendered great enthusiasm among parishioners. It seems that this novelty for the most part has worn thin and only a small contingent faithfully mingles with fellow parishioners over coffee and donuts. The idea of Sunday Fellowship is to afford St. Juliana parishioners the opportunity to speak to one another and enjoy each other's company and to greet new parishioners to welcome them to our family. I see many come to the Center and leave almost immediately once they have a cup of coffee and one or two donuts in hand. There may be a hundred reasons why this happens. I suspect the most common reason is busyness. I suggested to leadership that we have coffee and donuts once a month in order to bring back some of the newness but I was advised not to suggest that. So I leave it in your hands. Hopefully, more will see the value in Sunday Fellowship and participate more consistently.

The Our Lady of Grace grotto is almost finished. The prayer benches and the landscaping will be installed shortly. The date of the dedication will be May 5, 2013. This date is the day after our children receive their first Holy Communion. It is ideal. The month of May is Mary's month and the dedication will be memorable for our children. Those children who are able can participate wearing their First Communion dresses and suits. This short service will take place after the 9am Mass.

I would like to share with you a story that touched my heart. It appeared in a small publication I've used in the past called, *Bits and Pieces* published by Lawrence Regan Communications, Inc., March 2013 edition.

A young boy was walking down the street when he came upon an old cathedral. He could hear banging and clanging coming from within and decided to open the door to find out what was going on.

Inside, an old man worked on a huge block of marble with a chisel and a hammer. The old man never noticed the young boy, and after a few minutes the boy wandered off unimpressed by what he saw.

Many days later, the boy was once again passing by the cathedral. This time it was the silence that stoked his curiosity, and he peeked in to see why things were so quiet. The old man was still at work, but instead of a hammer and chisel he held a soft cloth that he used to polish a large angelic figure that had once been the block of marble.

The little boy stood in amazement of what he saw, and after several minutes he asked the old man, "How did you know that angel was inside that block of marble?" The old man turned to the boy and said: "There is an angel inside us all. All you need to do is chip away at those little hard pieces that do not resemble one, and you will release the angel that is inside you."

While this story touches on an old idea that we have great potential inside of us, the realization of that potential requires sacrifice and hard work. Chipping away at all that hides or buries our gifts is a tedious process. Those who are initially enthused begin to lose heart and what seemed so promising at the start begins to fade. Does that seem real to you? Have you ever been excited about your talents and then became disappointed when you are not recognized or encouraged?




