

FROM THE PASTOR

April 21, 2013



I would like to extend my appreciation and thanks to Mr. Ed Murphy for speaking at all Masses this weekend about vocations. Ed was recently appointed as a lay team member of the Servite Friars' vocation program. He offers great insight to vocations. Thank you for being with us this weekend.

The lilies have faded and are now gone, but the Easter Season endures. We will continue to replenish some flowers but they will be less glorious. Your generosity in the flower collection at Christmas and Easter makes it possible to decorate the altar and sanctuary with seasonal flora. The environment ministry directed by Catherine Haydon will keep on assuring us of liturgically appropriate adornment.

Mr. Ed Murphy from Servite High School and lay member of the Servite Vocation team have helped us celebrate *Vocation Weekend*. Thank you for welcoming him to our parish. Our local vocation ministry under the direction of John McElligott has also participated in celebrating this weekend. Other members of this ministry are: Father Luke, Jack and Terri Duffin, Dave Bigley, Mike McGranahan, Mike McHenry & Curtis Wesseln.

The school Gala/Auction this weekend is a major fundraiser for our parish school. Our hope is that this year the Gala will be as successful as in previous years. I am encouraged to see so many parishioners attend whose children are grown and no longer attend St. Juliana School. It is important for both parish and school to be one ministry.

Next weekend is the annual Crop Walk to help raise money for local and national food banks. St. Juliana parish will participate as we did last year. Unfortunately, I will be out of town. I walked last year and enjoyed giving witness. Our parish is the largest participant in this Fullerton Chapter. Our attendance at the actual walk is small. Perhaps you will consider donating and walking. You can call the office for more information.

The Pastoral Plan written by the Pastoral Council has been distributed. Extra copies are in the pamphlet rack in the back of church. If you do not have a copy, please take one. The new council for 2013-2014 will take up and help implement the Plan. All parishioners and parish organizations will be asked to take the Plan and apply it to their domain.

The Parish Center meeting rooms have been renamed. I ask that these rooms be referred to by their new names and not their numbers. The former Room One is *Seven Holy Founders Room;* Room Two is *St. Philip Room;* Room Three is *St. Juliana Room;* Room Four is *St. Alexis Room.* The glass on each door has the name of the room so there will not be confusion.

A free-bee magazine arrived in my mail box a few weeks ago. It was the spring 2013 edition of *Illuminate*, a magazine published biannually of *Endow* (Educating on the Nature and Dignity of Women). *Endow* is a Catholic study program that engages the intellect of women and teenage girls to help them understand their God-given dignity and respond to our culture's desperate need for an authentic feminine presence to transform every aspect of life and society.

The Executive Director and Co-Founder of Endow, Therese A.

Polakovic writes: "Dear Mothers and Daughters, Sisters and Friends: It is with a grateful heart that during this Year of Faith, Endow is celebrating its tenth anniversary. During the past 10 years, we have witnessed thousands of women and teenage girls embrace their **feminine genius** as they have grown closer to Christ and His Church, through the Endow program. This growth has equipped them to engage with the culture, and to exert a positive, direct, and lasting influence on society. Proudly, Endow is making a difference. With this in mind, let us unite in thanksgiving for all of the lives that have been positively affected during these past ten years. We are grateful that God had entrusted us with this important work, and we are blessed by your witness."

A contributor by the name of Michelle Schmidt who facilitates Endow Groups in Livonia, Michigan writes a column in this spring edition of *Illuminate* entitled: "Defining Moments." She writes: "I've always defined myself as just a lousy girl---not the son my father hoped for. And I carried a broken heart for far too long. My defining moment came when I read "Letter to Women" written by Pope John Paul II and discovered that I am God's beautiful daughter. That's why I want all my sisters--other Catholic women like me---to learn the truth that our heavenly Father loves us and longs to heal our hearts. I am so grateful for Endow and their message. I have learned to love my Catholic faith, and Endow has helped me to do that. Through leading Endow groups, I am helping to transform the culture one woman at a time"

Endow's Spiritual Advisor is Most Rev. Jose H. Gomez, S.T.D., Archbishop of Los Angeles. The address is 6021 S. Syracuse Way, Suite 220, Greenwood Village, CO 80111. The website is: <u>www.EndowGroups.org</u>. I would love for us to investigate if there is interest in pursuing more information about establishing an Endow group in our parish. Let me know.

The National media as well as Catholic periodicals and newspapers have done a remarkable job covering the recent events in Catholic life and culture. Pope Francis has been the topic of conversation both written and spoken: in cafés and barbershops; around dinner tables and sports events; in casual encounters and ministry groups. The excitement is understandable and the potential for good is outstanding.

One event covered by the media which was of special interest to me was the ecumenical meeting with members of different religions, including Greek Orthodox Patriarch Bartholomew on March 20th at the Clementine Hall of the Apostolic Palace. He also addressed other Christian groups and Jews and Muslims as well. Pope Francis, seated on an armchair instead of the throne usually reserved for the Pope, addressed them in these words: *"The Church is aware of the importance of the promotion of friendship and respect between men and women of different religious traditions...In this, we feel the closeness also of those men and women who, while not belonging to any religious tradition, feel, however, the need to search for the truth, the goodness and the beauty of God...The more we are faithful to [God's] will, in thoughts, in words and in deeds, the more we will truly and substantially walk towards unity."*


