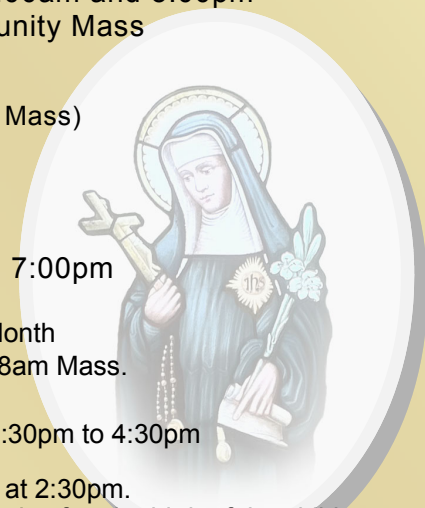

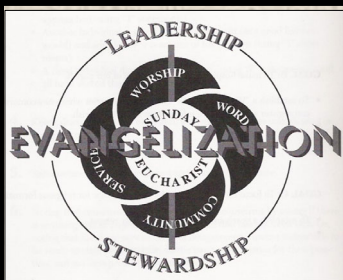

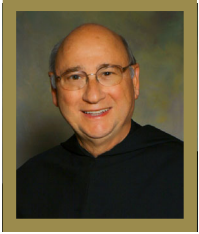

Easter continues for us but our Orthodox brothers and sisters celebrate Palm Sunday this weekend and Easter next weekend, May 4-5, 2013. The separate dates happen most years because of two different calendars: the Gregorian and the Julian calendars. Some years we are together. Both the Eastern Church and the Church of the West have tried for many years to come to some agreement on one Easter date but to no avail. You might say that from an ecumenical point of view both churches are “stuck.”

Our celebration of St. Peregrine with Father Chris Krymski, O.S.M. from the National Shrine in Chicago was a great success. Anointing of the sick followed the homily and the blessing with the relic of St. Peregrine came after Mass. Nearly 100 devotees attended. Most were from outside the parish with the largest ethnic group, Filipinos. St. Peregrine has a significant following in the Philippines. The Servite parish near Manila has an impressive shrine in his honor. Our monthly devotions take place this Saturday, May 4th at 8am. It is also First Communion Saturday. I hope you will come and bring someone you feel will profit from the devotion and blessing with the relic.

A few weeks ago our Junior High Youth Ministry directed by Scott Kambak invited members of *Dream Catchers* based at Brea High School to the monthly meeting. Four students made a power point presentation to our junior high students explaining the work of *Dream Catchers*. Similar to *Make a Wish Foundation* which works with seriously ill children to grant them a final wish, *Dream Catchers* was founded by a teenage girl to grant a final wish to terminally ill young and senior adults. Our children were in awe of the presentation and when asked if they had ever done something for an elderly person, one boy responded, “I had a neighbor who was real sick and I knew he liked music so one day I brought over my guitar and played for about an hour.” Another student told how he had a garage sale to raise money for a senior neighbor who was having financial worries. One by one our teens told stories of how they helped others. It was a magic, powerful moment of sharing. The Brea students were really impressed with St. Juliana teens. If you would like to learn more about this nationwide organization with over 200 chapters, their website is: dreamcatchers1.com.

The dedication of the *Our Lady of Grace Grotto* is next Sunday, May 5th following the 9 am Mass. As you know, the Knights of Columbus Council 4018 has raised the money for this project. A plaque honoring the Knights will be placed on the Grotto.

At the last meeting of the *Fullerton Interfaith Ministerial Association* (FIMA), members voted favorably to sponsor the first *INTERFAITH FAIRE* to be held here at St. Juliana in the Parish Center on Sunday, September 8th from 1pm to 4pm. More information will follow at a later date. The *Faire* will be an opportunity for all Faiths to share their history, theology and practice along with written hand-outs. There will be a key-note speaker, music, food, and displays. Details about this event will be shared later.

On April 21st the Jewish World Watch (JWW) sponsored a day

of prayer and a *Walk to End Genocide* in Fountain Valley. This day was dedicated to the three million people displaced from their villages in Sudan, the over 200,000 men, women, and children surviving in refugee camps in Chad since 2003, and the families of the estimated 45,000 people who lose their lives each month in the Congo. The JWW’s mission is to mobilize the community in response to genocide and mass atrocities worldwide, through education, advocacy and humanitarian relief. JWW was established in 2004 and is both nonsectarian and nonpartisan.

A representative of JWW spoke at the last meeting of FIMA. Unfortunately the bulletin went to press before I could alert you to this worthy cause. Because refugees do not have access to cooking materials, JWW provides solar cookers. A donation of \$40 can provide one family with two solar cookers for one year. Donations may also be used to provide tin sheeting for a roof; one hour of radio mentorship; provide books for classes. The Safe Motherhood Program organizes women into collectives, teaching them how to cultivate fields, providing them with tools, supplies, training in small business management, agriculture techniques and veterinary skills. The prophet Micah in the Hebrew Scriptures exhorts people: “*He (God) has shown you, O mortal, what is good. And what does the Lord require of you? To act justly and to love mercy and to walk humbly with your God.*” Micah, 6:8.

The Alzheimer’s Association is sponsoring a Spring Training 2013: *Enhancing Dementia Care through the Healing Arts* on May 29 at First Christian Church of Huntington Beach from 9:00 am-1:30 pm; May 30 at St. Jude Hospital, Fullerton from 8:00 am-12:30 pm; and June 6 at the Alzheimer’s Association, Irvine from 4:00 pm-8:30 pm. The workshop will explore the positive and therapeutic benefits of music therapy, massage, facilitated art activities, laughter yoga, Healing Touch, and the use of alternative medicine in caring for persons with dementia. Discover the practical applications of these techniques for use in at-home and professional care situations. The workshop is for health professionals and Family caregivers. LETTER FROM BISHOP VANN**

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Nothing is more important than protecting our children and youth. Since 2002 we have focused our efforts to better achieve that sacred duty. As a result of the Charter for the Protection of Children and Youth People, many policies and procedures were put in place. But those are just words on a page without the commitment of so many dedicated to ministry as you in the Body of Christ who minister with, and support, the ministry of the Diocesan Bishop. As a Parish Safe Environment Coordinator you provide this vital service that will restore the confidence and faith in the Body of Christ that was weakened and nearly shattered for so many. I worked very closely with the Safe Environment Coordinator and her co-workers in Fort Worth during my years as Bishop there, and I am very grateful to work with, and minister with you here in Orange. For that, and so much else, I thank you.

I learned of the Covenant with the Faithful before I was ever assigned here to Orange when it was first established by Bishop Brown, Bishop Soto, and Bishop Luong. I have studied it, and spoken with them about it, and in fact see it every time I celebrate Mass at Holy Family Cathedral. Now, as the fourth Bishop of Orange, I affirm the seven theses of the covenant and pledge to you and to our community that I will do all in my power to see that the most beloved and vulnerable of our members, our children, are protected from harm. We certainly remember the words of Our Lord in St. Mark's Gospel, often heard in the Rite of Baptism for Infants, which say, "Let the children come to me, and do not hinder them."

Thank you for the many hours that you devote to this important and necessary ministry. I recognize that for most of you this is just one of the many pastoral responsibilities you carry and live. I very much appreciate your caring, patient, and loving work!

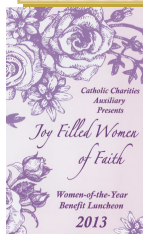


