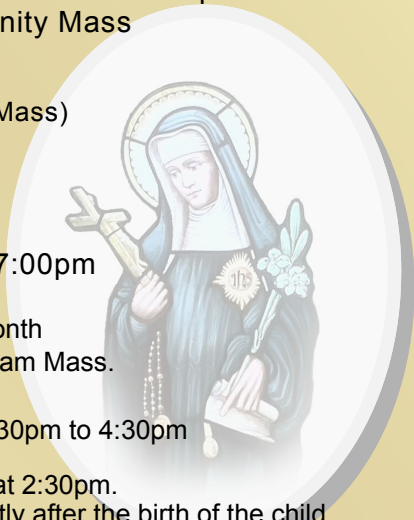

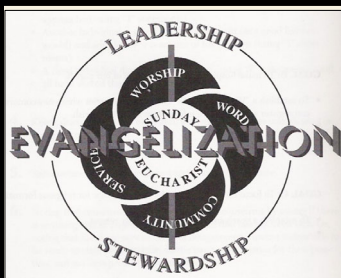

Celebrating the Sacraments is always a joyful occasion for our parish. First Eucharist last Saturday was beautifully executed. The children's choir and cantors under the direction of Claudia Kellogg were in good voice and added a personal touch to the Liturgy. The First Communicants were well prepared thanks to their teachers and catechists: Kayla

Arabia, Debbie Barker, Sheila McHenry and Jennifer Duck along with their aides.

This last Saturday Bishop Dominic Luong was with us to confer the Sacrament of Confirmation on our High School ministry candidates. They too have been well instructed and prepared by the ministry team under the leadership of Kerry and Maura Condon. The days ahead hopefully will be filled with conviction and fidelity to our Catholic Faith by our teens.

In the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* we read: "*The purpose of the sacraments is to sanctify men, to build up the Body of Christ and, finally, to give worship to God. Because they are signs they also instruct. They not only presuppose faith, but by words and objects they also nourish, strengthen, and express it. That is why they are called 'sacraments of faith.'*"

The Grotto blessing last Sunday brought excitement and elation to all who attended. The Grotto, graced with the image of a very young *Myriam (Mary) of Nazareth*, Mother of the Lord and *Our Lady of Grace* seems like it has always been at the side of the church. There is a subtle symbolism where the Grotto is located. As the Grotto is placed on the side of the church, so Blessed Mary is at the side of the Church as the Body of Christ, the People of God. May the presence of this Grotto bring us closer together and attract many to come to believe in Jesus, Son of God and Son of Mary.

I extend a blessing to all the women in the parish who are mothers or like mothers to others on this Mother's Day weekend. The tradition began through the efforts of Anna M. Jarvis (1864-1938) with church services in Grafton, West Virginia, and Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, in honor of Anna Jarvis's own mother. In 1910, the governor of Oklahoma issued the first Mother's Day proclamation. The following year all the states did so. Congress and the Executive Office cooperated in 1913 in a national resolution establishing the second Sunday of May as *Mother's Day*. Thank you, Respect Life Commission, for providing flowers for sale this weekend to help support the Respect Life ministry.

In the bulletin this week you will find a copy of *Christopher News Notes*. The topic contained in the *Notes* centers around *Choosing Faith over Fear*. The opening paragraph summarizes the theme in these words: "*Every time life hands us something new or difficult or just plain scary, fear seems to be waiting in the wings, ready to pounce on our serenity. Try as we might to ward it off on our own, there really is only one thing that can keep us from cowering in the darkness when we should be dancing in the light, and that is faith in God.*"

I hope you will read and study this simple brochure and perhaps

pass it on to another. Part of the *New Evangelization* is to share not only our Catholic Faith but our dreams, hopes, courage, forbearance, and charity with others both Catholic and non-Catholic. It is a tall order, but we can do it!

This weekend we celebrate the *Ascension of Our Lord*. Next weekend the celebration of the *Feast of Pentecost* brings the Easter season to a close and we begin the prolonged season of *Ordinary Time*, that is, "ordered time" in between liturgical seasons.

The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* describes the Ascension of Our Lord in lofty terms. In paragraph 662 we read: "*'And I, when I am lifted up from the earth, will draw all men to myself.'* *The lifting up of Jesus on the cross signifies and announces his lifting up by his Ascension into heaven, and indeed begins it. Jesus Christ, the one priest of the new and eternal Covenant, 'entered, not into a sanctuary made by human hands...but into heaven itself, now to appear in the presence of God on our behalf.'* *There Christ permanently exercised his priesthood, for he 'always lives to make intercession' for 'those who draw near to God through him'. As 'high priest of the good things to come' he is the center and the principal actor of the liturgy that honors the Father in heaven.'*"

Pentecost, the birth of the church and the coming of the Holy Spirit is described in paragraph 737 of the *Catechism* in these words: "*The mission of Christ and the Holy Spirit is brought to completion in the Church, which is the Body of Christ and the Temple of the Holy Spirit....The Spirit prepares all and goes out to them with his grace, in order to draw them to Christ. The Spirit manifests the risen Lord to them, recalls his word to them and opens their minds to the understanding of his Death and Resurrection. He makes present the mystery of Christ, supremely in the Eucharist, in order to reconcile them, to bring them into communion with God, that they may 'bear much fruit.'*"

Two weeks ago I attended the National Day of Prayer held at Chapman University in Orange. Mike McHenry accompanied me and a number of pastors from FIMA also participated. The Fish Interfaith Chapel at Chapman is an impressive building and its architecture is conducive to quiet meditation. I am not sure how many students utilize it on a daily basis but it could be a soothing comfort to harried students especially at exam time. Prayer experiences along with music were conducted by leaders from Muslim, Christian, Buddhist, Sikh and Sufi religions. What impressed me most was the universal theme of compassion. People of faith have so much in common. I am hoping that the Interfaith Faire planned by FIMA in September here at St. Juliana will be successful and a vehicle of education and shared religious experience.

Please take a copy of May, 2013 edition of *The Catholic Worker* in Church. This edition celebrates the 80th anniversary of the movement. There are short excerpts from 1933 to the present time with an explanation of the vision and mission of CW.

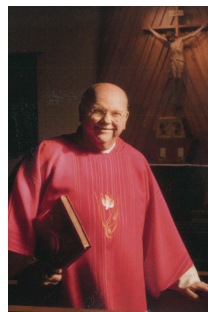

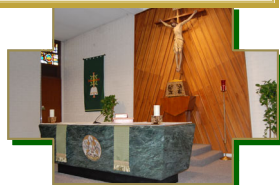

### CATHOLICISM 101

The elevation of Christ into heaven by His own power in presence of His disciples the fortieth day after His Resurrection. It is narrated in Mark 16:19, Luke 24:51, and in the first chapter of the Acts of the Apostles. Although the place of the Ascension is not distinctly stated, it would appear from the Acts that it was Mount Olivet. Since after the Ascension the disciples are described as returning to Jerusalem from the mount that is called *Olivet*, which is near Jerusalem.
