

### FROM THE PASTOR



Our celebration of the Feast of Pentecost last weekend was truly marvelous and faith renewing. The preaching, readings, and inspirational singing by our cantors and especially our Choir and musicians at the 9am Mass was a fitting conclusion to the Easter Season and the commencement of *Ordinary Time* (ordered time.) We are so blessed as Catholics to have our sacred liturgy and

liturgical cycle. Some who have departed from the Catholic Faith and have embraced the evangelical/mega churches' spirituality will admit at times they miss the sacramental life of the Church as well as the Sunday liturgy with Holy Communion.

In his book *The Four Signs of a Dynamic Catholic* Matthew Kelly writes: "...the (Dynamic Catholics) place enormous importance on the role of grace in their lives, and the Eucharist is their primary source of that grace....They know they need God and his grace, and they need community. They come to Mass seeking this grace and community. For this reason and others, the Mass is central to their lives. Many of them identify it as the crown jewel of the spiritual life."

"...The liturgical prayer of Sunday Mass is the prayer of the whole Church gathered as a public proclamation of who we are as Catholics. What you bring to Mass on Sunday is your prayer life, and the deeper it is, the more deeply you can enter into the public expression of the faith of the church. The Mass is not simply about you; it is the whole Church gathered as a sign of hope to the world. A community at prayer is a beautiful thing."

Congratulations to Father Luke on the occasion of his 52<sup>nd</sup> anniversary of Servite priesthood this Monday, June 27<sup>th</sup>. Father Luke has faithfully served the Church and the Order these many years in multiple capacities. Most recently, Father served the Order as vicar provincial, an office he has assumed a number of times in the past. His kindly presence and gentle disposition endears him to parishioners and Servites. I am grateful for his companionship, service to the parish, and his counsel.

In the Vatican II Decree on the Ministry and Life of Priests promulgated on December 7, 1965 the Council Fathers conclude the Decree with this fraternal admonition: "Let priests remember that in carrying out their task they are never alone but are supported by the almighty power of God. Believing in Christ who has called them to share in his priesthood, let them devote themselves to their office with all trust, knowing that God is powerful to increase charity in them. Let them remember too that they have their brothers in the priesthood and indeed the faithful of the entire world, as allies."

The late Jesuit writer and gifted speaker, Father Anthony De Mello, S.J., was a master story teller and collector of stories, mostly from Eastern spirituality. Recently I was paging through his book, *Taking flight, A Book of Story Meditations*. I share this story with you because it struck a chord in me. I sometimes feel that busyness eats too much into my prayer time. In a section devoted to prayer Fr. De Mello tells this story: *A cobbler came to Rabbi Isaac of Ger and said, "Tell me what to do about my morning prayer. My customers are poor men who have only one* 

pair of shoes. I pick up their shoes late in the evening and work on them most of the night; at dawn there is still work to be done if the men are to have their shoes ready before they go to work. Now my question is: What should I do about my morning prayer?"

"What have you been doing till now?" the Rabbi asked.

"Sometimes I rush through the prayer quickly and get back to my work---but then I feel bad about it. At other times I let the hour of prayer go by. Then too I feel a sense of loss and every now and then, as I raise my hammer from the shoes, I can almost hear my heart sigh, 'What an unlucky man I am, that I am not able to make my morning prayer.'"

Said the Rabbi, "If I were God I would value that sigh more than the prayer."

The school *Spring Sing* under the direction of Erin Thielke is a yearly pageant that showcases the musical and acting talent of our children. From the little ones in kindergarten to our Eighth grade "graduates to be," the musical numbers and skits are simply delightful. The "ooh's" and "aahs" of proud teachers, parents, and extended family members add a tuneful background to the show at hand. Just simply wonderful! The staging, sound system, and lighting in the Parish Center gave last Friday evening a theatrical feel, and the performance of our children lived up to the expectations of everyone.

This brings me to my gratitude to our parishioners who believe in Catholic education and the financial stability of our school. I am sure you know that funds have been put aside for helping needy families with meeting their tuition obligation. These funds are replenished by benefactors, fundraisers, and the monthly second collection at weekend Masses. It is my hope that when the basket passes your way at Mass, you will consider a gift no matter how small to help keep our school secure for years to come.

This Monday we celebrate *Memorial Day*. Over the past century, more that 35 million men and women answered the call to arms in World War I, World War II, Korea, Vietnam, the Persian Gulf, Iraq and countless military engagements. More than a half a million of them never came home. Some died in battle, others in captivity; all dead too soon.

Some ways we can observe this *Day*: 1) By visiting cemeteries and placing flags or flowers on the graves of our fallen heroes; 2) By flying the U.S. flag at half-staff until noon; 3) By attending morning Mass at 8 a.m. or ones sponsored by the diocese; 4) by visiting memorials; 5) By participating in a "National Moment of Remembrance" at 3:00 pm local time; 6) By renewing a pledge to aid the widows and orphans of our fallen dead, and to aid the disabled veterans.

I was looking at the tomato plants in the rectory garden. They are almost five feet high with an abundance of flowers. While watering the other day I thought of this saying by an unknown author: "*As the garden grows, so grows the gardener.*"



Years ago, a teacher tried to explain the Holy Trinity to her class of grade-school children by using a shamrock as an example.
