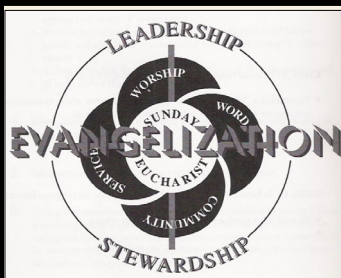

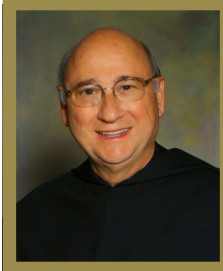

Happy and blessed *Father's Day* to all the dads in the parish! I am confident that your family and loved ones will make sure that this day is special for you.

In my favorite little publication, *Bits and Pieces*, published by Lawrence Regan Communications, Inc., I found these three quotes I would like to share with you on this *Father's Day* weekend. The writer Kuki Gallman writes: "*My father had the gift of making me believe, and of believing himself, that there is always a new adventure, something waiting to be discovered, if we can only find the time to look for it, and the courage to jump.*" Pat Brown writes: "*Dads don't need to be tall and broad-shouldered and clever---love makes them so.*" An unknown author writes: "*To really know a father, observe his behavior with a lady, a flat tire, and a child.*"

*Father's Day* was founded in Spokane, Washington at the YMCA in 1910 by Sonora Smart Dodd, who was born in Arkansas. Her father, the Civil War veteran William Jackson Smart, was a single parent who raised six children there. After hearing a sermon about Anna Jarvis Mother's Day in 1909, she told her pastor that fathers should have a similar holiday honoring them. The third Sunday of June was chosen as the day for fathers. It did not have much success initially. In the 1920's, Dodd stopped promoting the celebration because she was studying in the Art Institute of Chicago, and it faded into relative obscurity, even in Spokane.

In the 1930's Dodd returned to Spokane and started promoting the celebration again, raising awareness at a national level. A bill to accord national recognition of the holiday was introduced in 1913. US President Calvin Coolidge recommended in 1924 that the day be observed by the nation, but stopped short of issuing a national proclamation. In 1966, President Lyndon B. Johnson issued the first presidential proclamation honoring fathers, designating the third Sunday of June as *Father's Day*. Six years later, the day was made a permanent national holiday when President Richard Nixon signed it into law in 1972.

The *Spirit Group* at the 11am Sunday Mass is in the process of restructuring. Donna Farrington directed the group and after almost twenty years has stepped down. We are grateful to Donna for her dedication to this ministry and service to the parish. Over the years, the *Spirit Group* of musicians and singers varied in size. In a group photo taken in 1998 there were six members: three singers and three musicians with Donna doubling as singer and guitarist. In 2003 there were eight members. In recent years the group has had three regular singers/musicians and one or two occasional singers. At present the *Spirit Group* is comprised of *Claudia Kellogg, Tim Carter, and Joan Wismer*. Auditions will be held soon for anyone interested in singing at the 11am Mass.

Our parish choir under the direction of Todd Helm will go on summer recess this Sunday. The choir's presence at the 9am Mass will be missed. However, after a much needed break I am sure they will return in the fall with renewed enthusiasm and love for the church's Liturgy.

During the summer months you may have noticed that the wicks on the altar candles go out due to the draft caused by the air-conditioning. A glass wind protector will not fit on these altar candles. However, I would like to purchase a set of similar candles that are fitted with a wind protector to protect the candle from going out during Mass. These will be used during the summer months and the present candles would be stored until the heating season. The draft from the heat does not seem to affect the candles. The brass candle holder, candle, and tempered glass wind protector comes in a kit and each kit (we will need two) costs \$430. If you would like to help pay for one or both candle

kits please let me know. Parishioners often ask me to inform them if we need something for the church. Thank you for considering this.

Once a year Servite Friars from various communities throughout the United States gather for our annual Provincial chapter. Mater Dolorosa Retreat House in Sierra Madre will host this year's chapter which opens Monday afternoon, June 17<sup>th</sup>. Father Luke and I as well as other SoCal Servites will attend. This means we will not be available for parish business and ministry. Father Aaron and Father Seamus Glynn will cover most of the daily Masses. Some mornings there will be a communion service conducted by Deacon Gerhard. Please consult the bulletin.

The feast day of St. Juliana in the Servite calendar falls on Wednesday, June 19<sup>th</sup>. However, we will celebrate the Mass in honor of St. Juliana the weekend of June 22/23. Parish feast days may be celebrated on the closest Sunday to the actual designated day. This affords the opportunity for those parishioners who work during the week to attend.

In order to add an element of excitement and serendipity to the liturgical celebration, a wonderful afternoon of fun, games, good food and entertainment will take place on the church "Green" following the 11 am Mass. A special surprise visit by the Fullerton Police and Fire Departments will add an extra thrill for our children. There will be balloons and face painting; hot dogs and chili; sweets and sodas. New this year will be "*THE EXPRESS TRAIN.*" Riders will have the adventure of touring about in a colorful 16 passenger train. The train is designed to carry both children and adults. *All Aboard!!!* So come as you are. Bring your e-z ups and coolers, lawn chairs and blankets. Those with hearty appetites may need to bring extra food and snacks. We'll all share and no one will leave hungry. As we prepare for our parish feast day I think of the quote by Leigh Hunt: "*There are two worlds: the world that we can measure with line and rule, and the world that we feel with our hearts and imagination.*" Let our imagination soar next weekend!

We bid farewell to our school children and faculty as summer recess begins. A well-deserved vacation is in store for everyone. It will be a little quieter around St. Juliana for the next two months. Thank you parents for the sacrifices you make, the unnoticed generosity that you share, the quiet support, loyalty, friendship, and love that is *St. Juliana School Community*.

Last week I attended the monthly meeting of FIMA (Fullerton Interfaith Ministerial Association). The committee planning the first ever *Interfaith Fair* to be held here at St. Juliana in the Parish Center on September 8, 2013 reported that Dr. Paul J Levesque, chair and associate professor in the Department of Comparative Religion at Cal-State Fullerton will be the guest speaker. More information will follow about this historic gathering of clergy/leaders from all the local Christian, Moslem, Jewish, Sikh, Unitarian, Buddhist and other religious communities to share with all who attend the basic tenets of their faith and programs of outreach to the larger community. Save the date. More information will follow.

I would like to share with you a quote from Pope Francis given in his April 24<sup>th</sup> weekly audience. He said: "*In this period of crisis, today, it is important not to turn in on ourselves, burying our own talent, our spiritual, intellectual, and material riches, everything that the Lord has given us, but, rather to open ourselves, to be supportive, to be attentive to others...Set your stakes on great ideals, the ideals that enlarge the heart, the ideals of service that make your talents fruitful. Life is not given to us to be jealously guarded for ourselves, but is given to us so that we may give it in turn.*"

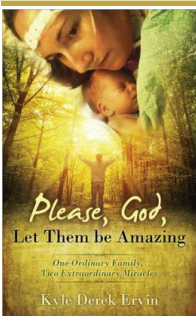

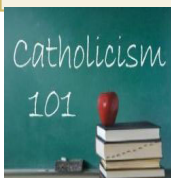
## RCIA

### Saint Joseph

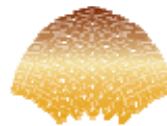

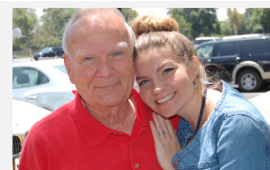
