

FROM THE PASTOR

The excessive heat lately is a dramatic reminder of how blessed we are for the "gift" of air-conditioning. While most days here in southern California are pleasant enough not to need continuous air-conditioning, it is nice to know it is available. I think you would agree.

I wish to thank those ushers who are in compliance with my directive to please keep the doors of the church closed before and after Mass during the summer months. The reason for this directive is to protect the air-conditioning equipment, which is aging, and to be good stewards of our finances. Another reason for keeping the doors closed is that open doors toward the end of Mass especially give the impression that it is okay to leave early. If you find a door open before or after Mass, please close it behind you. This is important during weekday Masses when ushers are not present.

Vacation Bible School (VBS) begins this Monday and it promises to be the most exciting summer religious program for our children in recent years. VBS is a bible based summer program that is fun, educational, and faith building for our children. The official title for VBS is, *Kingdom Rock: Where Kids Stand Strong for God.* Each day has a specific theme and activities for the children. Day One: God's love helps us stand strong; Day Two: Family and friends help us stand strong; Day Four: Trusting God helps us stand strong; Day Five: The Bible helps us stand strong.

I ask everyone to pray this week for the kids who will attend *Kingdom Rock Totally Catholic VBS.* God can reach kids with the life-changing message of his love....yes, even through games! Ask God to prepare the hearts of the kids and leaders who will be part of VBS.

In the chapter on Personal Renewal in his book, Bounce: Living the Resilient Life, the author Robert J. Wicks, PsyD writes: "There are basic elements of a self-care protocol or renewal program that most of us need in order to replenish ourselves and reinforce our resilience on an ongoing basis. It really doesn't require too much to take a step back from our work or family routine to become refreshed in order to regain perspective. Some basic elements might include: Quiet walks by yourself; Time and space for meditation; Some light exercise; a hobby

such as gardening or knitting; Visiting a park or hiking; Going to a mega-bookstore to have coffee and a scone, and taking time to peruse the magazines; Taking a bath rather than a quick shower; Daydreaming; Listening to a book on tape; Staying in bed later than usual on a day off; Watching an old movie; Going to a diner or small restaurant and having a cup of tea and a piece of pie; Journaling each day as a way of unwinding." These are just a few of the self-care suggestions Dr. Wicks makes. I would add: Going to daily Mass and or daily rosary.

An article I read recently in *Tidings* magazine written by Tony Agnesi entitled, "When My Children have Lost the Faith" interested me and I would like to share some of his suggestions with you.

Tony Agnesi is a radio broadcast executive and consultant and is also involved in Catholic radio, jail ministry, and ministry to the homeless. He is a father of two grown sons. He and his wife of 40 years reside in Wadsworth, Ohio.

Tony has these suggestions to share: 1) Do not argue with your children! Frankly, it only makes it worse, and pushes them farther away; 2) Remain faithful! Do not let their falling away from the faith discourage you or make you suppress your beliefs....We must remain faithful and not be afraid to show the joy of the Lord in our lives; 3) Prayers and Sacrifices! Saint Monica prayed for decades for her son, Saint Augustine, to return to the faith. Not only did he return to the faith but he became a doctor of the Church; 4) Pray that God brings someone else (beside you) into their lives. Then we must trust God to do it; 5) Study and learn to defend the faith! As we learn more about the faith ourselves we are better equipped to answer questions and defend what we believe; 6) Love them and do not push them away! Let them see your joy and happiness and want to be part of it.

Lately, there has been a great deal of discussion about homelessness and how best to help those who have nowhere to call home. Christopher News Notes has a short article about a lady called the "Egg Lady." Every morning on the streets of Austin, Texas she hands out hard-boiled eggs. She also runs Mary House, the Catholic Worker residence in that city. She drives homeless people to AA meetings, lets them shower or even live at Mary House, gives them clothes, and offers them prayers. Her name is Lynn Goodman-Strauss.



"My name is Linda Augustin and I am the Art teacher at St. Juliana Falconieri School. I love art and I love teaching art.




"St. Juliana students come to my class each week. They learn to appreciate artists and genres they will meet again during other classroom studies or outside of school time. Design elements they use in cultural or historical context bring history and social studies lessons into focus in a tangible way.

"Students in my classes create an alphabet book that teaches hieroglyphics, a Chinese Lion Dancer to move with, illuminated words brilliantly worked into a Day Planner, Greek art and architecture printed from collage. Student artists design and make rosaries and beautiful chalk portraits of the saints. These hang in our church for All Saints Day Mass. Many artists are introduced in various grades. Paul Klee, Eric Carle, Vincent Van Gogh, Piet Mondrian, Andy Warhol and Tim Burton are a few who make learning the elements and principles of art fascinating.

"Student artists show courage by making mistakes and turning them into "new ideas"! We are all striving to appreciate our differing abilities and unique ways of seeing the world while encouraging each other to put forth our best efforts in each project. Many of my students spend recess in their 'right brain', too. All of this, our art room, supplies and a thriving art program is possible because of the consistent support of the school parents.

"To quote one recess artist, 'Art is Life!"




Using an inquiry-based curriculum, the St. Juliana science



program strives to develop students' understanding, appreciation, and life long respect for science and the world they live in. Each grade level now focuses on three to four areas of science in much more depth. Hands-on science incorporates all learning styles and is beneficial to those students who learn best in non-traditional ways. An important element

of our curriculum is the use of a science notebook as both a record of the work done by a student and as an important assessment tool of the concepts learned. Our students have not only improved in their writing skills, but have become better observers, critical thinkers, communicators, and collaborative workers. Science has become more "real" to them and they see it incorporate the other subjects of their school day: math, technology, current events, literature, physical education, and art. We have been blessed to be a part of the Beckman@Science program for over 12 years, as well as the generous support of our Parent Club.
