



FROM THE PASTOR

My special thanks to Mike McHenry and his Vacation Bible School team for the very successful *Kingdom Rock* program for our children this past week. *Kingdom Rock: Where Kids Stand Strong for God* is a totally Catholic bible-based summer program that utilizes bible stories and imagination to help our children grow in their Catholic faith

joyfully. Over ninety children participated.

The first day of VBS the children read Psalm 23. King David wrote this Psalm as a song of trust. David trusted in God and the sheep relied on David to care for them. In the Old Testament time, God is often portrayed as the good shepherd. On day two the children read the story of Queen Esther. The foreign King Xerxes was willing to pay a sum of 10,000 talents of silver which today would equal nearly six hundred tons of silver. This price showed how determined the King was to annihilate God's people. But Queen Esther intervened and God's people were saved. On the third day the children read the story of Nehemiah who helped rebuild the walls around Jerusalem after they were destroyed by the King of Babylon. On the fourth day the children read the account of the Passion of Jesus: his death and resurrection. On the fifth day the children read about King Josiah and how he follows God's way and draws the people back to God.

I received word recently from the Director of the Office of the Diaconate for the Diocese of Orange, that parishioner Pete Lauder who has been participating in the pre-Diaconate program and education for the past two years is now officially a candidate for the Diaconate. He and his wife Jan have been faithfully attending the formation program, and on Friday, October 18, 2013, he will take part in the Rite of Candidacy at Christ Our Savior Parish. Congratulations to Pete and Jan! We look forward to the day Pete will join with deacons, Gerhard, Bill and Chuck in the ministry of the Diaconate for the Diocese of Orange.

A few weeks ago I read in the Fullerton News Tribune that "CSUF Librarian to Retire July 31." The article submitted by Cal State Fullerton highlighted the 26 years Richard Pollard (parishioner) served as university librarian. Richard is looking forward to a new chapter in his life.

Since 1987, Richard has been at the helm of a library with modest beginning in 1959 that grew to become a major institution serving 37,000 students and 2,100 full and part-time faculty members. Richard is the fourth full-time university librarian. He started his career at Stanford University and then held administrative positions at the University of Tennessee and the University of Chicago before accepting the CSUF position.

"I would be less than honest if I didn't admit to some qualms about giving it all up....I will miss the daily challenges and camaraderie that accompanies an academic life, especially as the campus is experiencing new and vibrant leadership."

Richard and his wife Simone are active parishioners here at St. Juliana. Richard is a lector and Simone is a Eucharistic Minister. Both give generously of their time and talents to the parish.

Magnificat is a wonderful prayer aid published monthly which includes daily Mass, morning and evening prayer modeled on the Liturgy of the Hours, and biographical notes. I have been

using this handsome prayer book for about seven years and find it both practical and beneficial in my private prayer time and preparing for Mass..

I know that many of our parishioners subscribe to *Magnificat*. Many would like to subscribe to this monthly prayer book but the \$44.95 price per year is expensive and beyond those with fixed incomes. If we can get 40 parishioners to subscribe, the price per year is only \$29.95. Are you interested? If yes, please drop me a note with your name and address, and once we get 40 parishioners to sign-up, I will apply for a bulk discount. The subscription price will need to be made out to St. Juliana. Then we will coordinate the group rate through the parish office.

I celebrated the 6:30am Mass on Thursday, July 11th, the feast of St. Benedict. St. Benedict was born in 480 in Nursia, Italy. He was educated in Rome but then later decided to live a solitary life in mountainous Subiaco, in a cave. He lived there for three years. Later he organized a form of monastic life in twelve monasteries. The monks who joined St. Benedict devoted themselves to work and prayer. In the great abbey of Monte Casino, which he founded, he wrote his Rule, which wonderfully combines the Roman genius with the monastic wisdom of the Christian East. He was proclaimed *Patron of Europe* by Pope Paul VI because of his influence in the formation of Christendom in the Middle Ages. He died in 547.

The Gospel reading that day was taken from the tenth chapter of St. Matthew. The verse that stands out in that reading and which certainly describes the great gift of St. Benedict reads: "Without cost you have received; without cost you are to give."

The author Paul Pennick, in the monthly booklet, Living Faith: Daily Catholic Devotions writes "At the heart of our faith is the principle of stewardship. All that we have, every ounce of our intelligence, our energy and our enthusiasm, our gifts and our treasure----all of it came from God. For some it is not an easy concept to believe or understand. We go to school. We study. We grow up. We work hard. We land a job. And little by little we build our lives, raising our children and accumulating material goods. It all seems inextricably tied to our individual efforts. Yet if we really think about it, we know by faith that those individual talents and traits that are with us through life were given by God. All that we have is a gift from God, given freely "without cost." Can we give back the same?"

I hope you will support the Knights of Columbus blood drive next Sunday. There is more information about the blood drive in this bulletin. Thank you Knights for sponsoring this.

You may have noticed that there is a donation basket on the donut table in the Parish Center on Sunday mornings. I hope you understand that no one is being charged for a donut(s). This is a free-will offering to help with the expense. There is absolutely no obligation to pay for a donut. If you choose to leave a gift, it is to offset the expense which is about \$6,500 per year. This also includes coffee, sugar, creamer and paper goods. Please feel welcome. Enjoy the donut and coffee, milk, and juice. The fellowship is far more important. We especially welcome new families and friends to join us and hopefully we will get to know each better.



RCIA

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS

RCIA is a process by which the community initiates into its midst non-baptized adults, baptized adults from another faith seeking full communion with the Catholic Church, and those preparing for full initiation through the Sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist.
