

#### FROM THE PASTOR

Preparations have been on-going the past two months in anticipation of the parish *Fall Festival*. At this early planning stage you can assist by donating your "previously read" books that may be gathering dust on your book shelves or taking up room in your garage. A box will be available at the entrance to the church and outside of the Parish Center facilities'

office where you can deposit the books which will then be sorted for sale at the festival. I wish to extend my thanks to James Tanaka and the Tanaka family for the hours they devote every year to sorting and pricing the books. The proceeds from the book sale help greatly in the overall success of the Festival.

This weekend is the conclusion of *World Youth Day* in Rio de Janeiro. Our Holy Father, Pope Francis, returned to his native South America to celebrate with youth from all over the world. Catholic News Service estimates that Rio is preparing to welcome two million pilgrims.

According to the U.S. Catholic Bishops, around 9,330 U.S. participants will attend *WYD*. One participant this year is Luke DelVecchio who is again leading young pilgrims form the Boston area. Luke was 19 years old when he attended his first *WYD* in Rome in 2000. Luke is now 32 and a married father. He said the consistent factor in every World Youth Day is the joyful attitude of participants----a joy they bring to the host city's inhabitants. "They don't know this sort of tidal wave of joy is about to hit them," said DelVecchio.

A news item in the National Catholic Register reports that more than 165 young people and leaders from the Boston Archdiocese are attending *WYD*. And Father Shawn Carey, the director of the Deaf Apostolate for the Archdiocese of Boston, is co-leading a national group of about 20 deaf participants and leaders, along with hearing interpreters. Father Carey, who is also deaf, said it's important for deaf people in the U.S. to witness other deaf Catholics from other countries, even though they do not share the same signing system. "It's just good to see that we have one faith, different languages. It's a good experience---that's very special; that's unique," said Father Carey, signing to an interpreter.

It is my hope that when the new school year begins and our High School Youth Ministry is in full gear, that we will make plans for some of our teens from St. Juliana to attend the next World Youth Day. I have asked Mike McHenry, our director of Faith Formation, to work with Kerry and Maura Condon and the youth ministry team to investigate this possibility.

I wish to extend my gratitude to the Knights of Columbus for hosting the Blood Drive this Sunday after the morning Masses. If you were able to give blood, then may you be blessed for giving the gift of life to a needy person.

Don't forget to take a copy of the *Orange County Catholic* newspaper as you leave Church. You will find copies in the shelves at the entrances of the Church and in the metal newspaper stand. Bring a copy to a friend or shut-in.

Members of our Respect life commission will be passing out baby bottles for the annual *Pennies from Heaven* collection on August 10 & 11. You are asked to take the bottle home and fill it with your

loose change or paper money. The bottles will then be collected the following Sunday and the proceeds sent to the three Life Centers, the six Birth Choice Health Clinics and the Home for Pregnant Mothers in Orange County.

In this Year of Faith our Holy Father Pope Francis has preached a long list of homilies highlighting one or another aspect of the New Evangelization. In a recent homily Pope Francis writes: "May you also be true evangelizers! May your initiatives be 'bridges,' means of bringing others to Christ, so as to journey together with him. And in this spirit may you always be attentive to charity. Each individual Christian and every community is missionary to the extent that they bring to others and live the Gospel, and testify to God's love for all, especially those experiencing difficulties."

The experience of most parishes during the summer months is the noticeable drop in Sunday Mass attendance. It is understandable that families take vacations and are away from the parish. Children can be reluctant to give up summer play to come to Mass. All of us have a right to some laziness during the relaxed summer schedule. I hope that on those days when you travel or spend time at your special "get away place" that you do your best to pray daily and attend Mass where possible. I am always amazed at the loyalty of parishioners who remember to turn in their offertory envelopes or electronic pay for the Sundays they are away. Thank you for your consistent support and devotion to your Catholic Faith.

The word *cancer* brings to mind scary and often hopeless thoughts. So many good and wonderful people who fall victim to this dreaded disease believe cancer is a *death sentence* instead of a *diagnosis*. Believe it or not, many cancers are curable and some go into remission permanently to the surprise of both patient and physician. It can be very confusing. Nevertheless, the one sure way to rise above the fear and hopelessness is to place our lives in God's embrace. Faith is the antidote to dread and fright. Henry L Stimson wrote these words: "Honor begets honor; trust begets trust; faith begets faith; and hope is the mainspring of life."

One way people of faith cope with an active cancer is through intercessory prayer. They pray their hearts out; day in and day out. Some days the pain and discomfort are manageable and on those days words flow effortlessly. Other days are darker and prayers are more difficult. In either case, faith is a powerful healing tonic.

The power of intercessory prayer by those who are experiencing the diagnosis of cancer or who are gratefully in remission is most evident here at St. Juliana on the first Saturday of the month following the 8 a.m. Mass. At that time the faithful gather to pray through the intercession of St. Peregrine Laziosi, O.S.M. who was miraculously cured of cancer after a night of prayer before the image of our Crucified Lord. Through the prayers of the faithful and the blessing with the relic of St. Peregrine many experience healing and hope. St. Peregrine prayed in his time: "O Redeemer of the human race, you willed to undergo the torment of the cross and a most painful death to wipe away our sins...Deign, O Lord, my God, to free this leg of mine from this incurable disease."

#### TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITIONS

Apart from the period from Thanksgiving through Christmas, the summer is a favored time for family reunions. We trace family trees and recall our origins. Worship has a family tree as well, and the way we celebrate today has been influenced by various styles and customs through the centuries. We are Western Christians of the Latin Rite. By far, we are the most numerous Western Christians, but there are other ritual families as well. The Archdiocese of Milan in Italy follows the Ambrosian Rite, Toledo in Spain preserves the Mozarabic Rite and the Arab language, and Lyons in France is home to the Gallican Rite. Other liturgical families, such as the Celtic in Ireland and the Sarum in England, faded away after the Reformation. Until recent times, members of some ancient religious orders such as Carmelites and Trappists followed a pattern of Mass that varied slightly from the plan observed in Latin Rite parishes.

Isn't the Catholic Church the same everywhere? Not at all. It never has been! The existence of so many liturgical families in the West reminds us that unity, not uniformity, is what the Church seeks to achieve among her children. We are united in faith, but wonderfully diverse in rituals, ceremonies, languages, customs, and spirituality.



# RCIA RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS

RCIA is a process by which the community initiates into its midst non-baptized adults, baptized adults from another faith seeking full communion with the Catholic Church, and those preparing for full initiation through the Sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist. RCIA is primarily a journey of faith that begins with wondering, asking, and seeking; continues through hearing God's word, studying, discussing, and praying; and leads to a commitment through the sacraments of initiation to a life of faith and love in communion with Catholics throughout the world.

# AUXILIARY TEACHER SPOTLIGHT— LEARNING SUPPORT TEAM - MARY PEREZ AND HEATHER MOLINA



In an article written for a cooperate company based in Hawaii the author Ka'po Ho uses the analogy of a canoe to symbolize the roles that each person portrays working as a team player. At St. Juliana School this analogy can exemplify the responsibility and time it takes to pull the canoe and set the pace for a smooth journey.

My name is **Mary Perez** and I work in conjunction with the Learning Support Team as the school counselor. My job includes individual and group counseling, parent support, social groups, academic counseling and social programs for the classroom. My role in this analogy would be a fifth paddler or a steersperson who supports those who have a weak moment and need some help steering the canoe.

I am one small part (or paddler) of the most amazing Learning Support Team, which includes Mrs. Molina and Mrs. Flynn (also steerspersons) who accommodate students

with classroom curriculum, ILP's, and individual support. Character development is introduced in Kindergarten which piggy backs on to the social skills program taught in 1<sup>st</sup> grade with "Super flex", a blue caped superhero guiding students through missteps and foibles. One program that sustains students with individual support is our after school-tutoring program. This program utilizes the students from our neighboring all girls' catholic high school.

Most of our auxiliary staff symbolizes the second and the fifth paddlers who according to Ho are the primary strength that pulls the canoe across the water. I help them with programs like character development here at St. Juliana School. With second and fifth paddlers we sometimes call out changes to the rest of the team. This might be our children's literature program where we read books to all grade levels and introduce a quote every month that coincides with our virtue. We celebrate two students each month from every classroom with a certificate that signifies their outstanding behavior with a particular virtue. They are photographed and their picture is displayed in the hall and the front office. All of this is possible because we have a sixth paddler who is the overall captain of the steersperson and must provide our team with support and corroboration.

My work as a fifth paddler could not be possible without our sixth paddler. She takes charge in rough water and calls out to our team to give direction and guidance on our way to the shore. This strong sixth paddler may vary from time to time. It may be are our 8<sup>th</sup> grade teacher who will make our banner, the art teacher who takes pictures, our Vice Principle who sends out monthly reminders or our librarian who may suggest literature and continually produces bookmarks with our quote of the month.

According to St. Paul there are different kinds of spiritual gifts in the same Spirit. And when we work together for one purpose one part may be honored, yet all the parts share in its joy. The Hawaiian word Laulima means many hands working together. Our virtue for the month of September was caring. Our quote taken from Anthony J.D' Angelo states that without a sense of caring there can be no sense of community. Needless to say there is a sense of community at St. Juliana Falconieri School. Whether we are first paddler alaka'i at the front of the canoe or third or fourth paddler in the middle. We all support the journey, rowing and following the lead from our fellow workers who head the word to be firm, steadfast, always fully devoted to the work of the Lord, knowing that in the Lord your labor is not in vain (1Corinthians 15:58).

My name is **Heather Molina.** I am part of the Learning Support team. We collaborate to write ILP's for each child we work with. We help to figure out when students are struggling and may be in need of assistance.



My job is to support the needs of students and teachers. I give support to students' strengths and weaknesses. Mary Perez and I head up the After School Tutoring Program. The tutoring program consists of our students who need a little more help and the talent of Rosary girls sharing their knowledge. The Rosary girls help those students understand and gain confidence in the subject areas of Math and Language Arts.

I teach 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grade math for students working at grade level. My intention for these math classes is to combine math with real life experiences. They learn a lot and have fun with math.

I feel very blessed to be working here at St. Juliana's and to have a job I truly love!

#### REFLECTING ON GOD'S WORD

Prayer has always been part of the Christian heritage. The book of Psalms long ago became the prayer book of the church, along with some hymns and canticles from other books of the Bible, both Old and New Testaments. Among the most beautiful prayers we have are the *Magnificat* of Mary, the *Benedictus* of Zechariah, and the *Nunc Dimittis* of Simeon, all in the Gospel of Luke (Luke 1:46–55; 1:68–79; 2:29–32).

Most importantly, Jesus prayed. Think about that for a moment. Jesus, the Son of God, the Word made flesh, the only begotten Son, prayed. We know that he went off by himself to pray. He did this before some of the most important moments in his ministry, like before he chose those who would be with him. But it is safe to assume that he did it as a habit.

So when one of the disciples asked him to teach them to pray and Jesus responded with the Our Father, it deserves our attention. This prayer reveals the heart of Jesus, and tells us how we should speak to the Father. The prayer has two parts: blessing the Father and calling for his presence in the world, then turning to God for our basic needs of food, forgiveness, and fidelity.

The parables that follow call us to persevere and persist in prayer because God is a Father who will give us his life-blood, in this case, the Holy Spirit, to all who ask. Continue to knock, continue to ask. God will respond.


