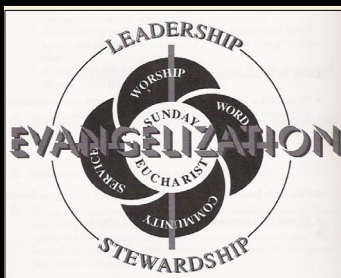

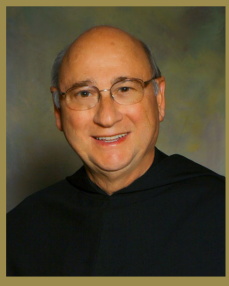

A few weeks ago I wrote about the air-conditioning draft blowing out the altar candles during Sunday Mass. Presently, we have aging candles that are not designed to withstand a draft. After some investigation I found out that the Religious Goods Company which supplies us with Church vessels and other liturgical articles has candles that are fitted with a draft protector. These new candles and stands listed at \$430 each seemed beyond our means at this time. The response to this request was swift and now we will be able to pay \$860 for the candles which are on order. They will arrive the middle of July. These will be used during the summer months and the present candles, while they last, will be stored and used during the winter months. The heating system does not seem to interfere with the flame.

Signs are appearing in church for the *Pennies from Heaven* annual collection for the support of our Respect Life program here at St. Juliana. Start saving your pennies and other loose coins now for this collection which will take place on August 24 & 25. Most parishes in the Orange Diocese have this fundraiser to help fund the three *Life Centers*, the six *Birth Choice* health clinics and the homes for pregnant mothers in need in Orange County. They rely on this collection for their annual operation costs. Children like to be included in this “fun” way of “fundraising” by saving some of their allowance during the summer months to help these unborn babies live. The parish *Respect Life* committee will be handing out baby bottles after Masses the weekend of August 10 & 11 for you to take home and fill with coins or paper money. They may be returned the weekend of August 24-25 and placed in the bins provided at the entrance of Church.

The Knights of Columbus is a Catholic Organization that does an amazing service to the Church and to local parishes where they have a council. Council 4018 meet here at St. Juliana and are involved in a variety of ministries. On Sunday, July 28, 2013 from 7:30 AM to 1:00 PM the *UC Irvine Medical Center Bloodmobile* will be here at the invitation of the Knights. The Knights continue to collaborate with the Blood Donor Center at UC Irvine. Response from parishioners continues to be very positive. Bulletin inserts and posters will be displayed closer to the date.

Unless you have a direct connection with the Vatican and Vatican News Service, I doubt you hear much about Pope Francis these days in comparison to his first few months as Pope. In my case I find that to be true. Every day I make a point to eye Catholic news media, magazines, and journals to find out the latest word from or about Pope Francis. In a recent papal address Pope Francis, true to his name, shared these words with his audience: *“Francis of Assisi tells us we should work to build peace. But there is no peace without truth! There cannot be true peace if everyone is his own criterion, if everyone can always claim exclusively his own rights, without at the same time caring for the good of others, of everyone, on the basis of the nature that unites every human being on this earth.”*

While speaking with the College of Cardinals Pope Francis said: *“Inspired also by the celebration of the Year of Faith, all of us*

together, pastors and members of the faithful, will strive to respond faithfully to the Church’s perennial mission: to bring Jesus Christ to mankind and to lead mankind to an encounter with Jesus Christ, the way, the truth, and the life, truly present in the church and also in every person.

In the *National Catholic Register* there appeared a series of testimonies recently written by brand-new converts to Catholicism. Last week I wrote about Tom Peterson, a former advertising executive who founded *Catholics Come Home*. Although technically not a convert, his faith was lukewarm and he found a renewed faith from his interaction with fellow Catholics who treated him with love and compassion.

A second story of conversion is that of Richard Lane, a former Lutheran who entered the Catholic Church in 2003. Today, he operates a full-time Catholic apostolate, *Qorban Ministries* (Qorban.net). For Lane, it was a caring attitude among Catholics he met that first attracted him to the Church. As a non-Catholic, he attended Our Lady of Lourdes Church in Oakland, CA, and recalled it as “one of the most loving and welcoming parishes I have ever been in.” He later accepted the invitation of a fellow Catholic to come into full communion with the Catholic Church.

Lane is excited that his apostolate has been an effective tool in leading many to a “deeper relationship with Christ.” He encourages his fellow Catholics to learn their faith and then “approach people in love and without fear. Do not approach them with an accusatory tone; approach in love and respect. Go and make disciples and preach the Gospel boldly!”

Last Thursday I happened to stop by the St. Vincent de Paul pantry as the volunteers were arranging food items to be distributed to needy families. In the past, food items were mainly non-perishable goods donated by parishioners in the wooden box at the entrance to the church. The St. Vincent de Paul ministry has expanded its outreach to include fresh food such as vegetables, fruit, and at certain times meat of various kinds. Needy folks from near and far come faithfully every Thursday and are received cordially and enthusiastically by all the volunteers. This outreach is a sign of our commitment here at St. Juliana to live the *Corporal Works of Mercy*. I wish to extend my gratitude to Paul Durning, Joe Campanella, and the volunteers for their dedication to this ministry and to all of the St. Juliana parishioners for supporting them by donating non-perishable food.

The author Tom Clancy wrote these words: *“The ultimate defense against growing old is your dream. Nothing is as real as a dream. Your dream is the path between the person you are and the person you hope to become. Success isn’t money. Success isn’t power. The criteria for your success are to be found in your dream, in yourself. Your dream is something to hold on to. It will always be your link with the person you are today, young and full of hope. If you hold on to it, you may grow old, but you will never be old, and that is the ultimate success.”*

"DISCOVERING CHRIST"

Article taken from "Sunday By Sunday: Year C ~ Lectionary"

"A friend once told me that he lives every day of his life looking for a chance to meet the Lord. I agreed that this was the way I led my life also, until one day when I discovered exactly what he meant. He had been traveling in my neighborhood and had come across a young man, with no shoes on his feet, who was asking people for money outside the local convenience store. He told the young man that he would do what he could to get him some shoes and fresh clothing. And where did he bring this young man to find these shoes and clothes? To my house! I was taken aback when the two arrived at my front door and my friend explained the situation. He told me how excited he was that another day had passed and he found this opportunity to meet the Lord. I was dumbfounded, yet profoundly humbled by the very presence of Christ in my home. I went to my dresser drawer and hesitated briefly as I drew out some clothes I hadn't worn in a long time. Something inside me said to go to the closet. There I pulled out my favorite jeans, a fairly new shirt and sweater, some new underclothes, a pair of shoes and socks. The young man went into the bathroom to change and when he emerged, his face was nothing less than radiant. In the meantime my friend had raided my refrigerator, had made up a "to-go" meal, and took the young man to a place where he could spend the night.

"This experience taught me so much about what it means to be someone who tries to follow Christ. I discovered that in order to get to know Christ more and more, we have to be the ones who are diligently searching for him in the people we encounter every single day of our lives. Today the Lord Jesus asks us to pray that the abundant harvest will have more laborers. Let us pray that more and more people will have the courage to search for Christ in their everyday lives. And perhaps some will hear the voice of the Lord calling them into ordained ministry."

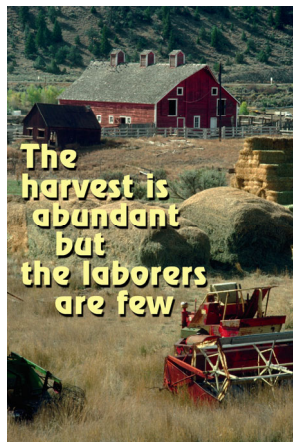

REFLECTING ON GOD'S WORD

Here's another line of thought for our consideration, the last line of the first reading this weekend: “**The LORD's power shall be known to his servants.**” That's us. The Lord's power is expressed, not in destruction, but in nourishment and warm comfort. We are the fortunate receivers of this kind of power. The line is the summary of a snippet in which Isaiah gives us an image of the city of Jerusalem as a nursing, comforting mother. Just knowing this lifts up the heart, makes the body grow. This is how the Lord's power is made manifest to Israel and to us.

In today's Gospel, Jesus sends seventy-two disciples out two by two. Where they will first go, he will follow. This is the opposite of what we usually think of when we think of disciples. The teacher normally goes first and the disciples follow. This is the order of missionary work—to continue the work the master has set out for them. But not in today's reading. Today, the disciples prepare the way for the master, who will come later.

Their own preparation is brief and to the point. They will go as sheep among wolves. That in itself seems to be a heart-stopper. Given this caution, the disciples might be expected to ask what defense they have. None, apparently. They are not to visit the unsuspecting population with messages and warnings. They are not to go well armed with thought-out arguments or skills of oratory and debate. They are to move about the countryside empty-handed and barefoot. They are to carry no supplies. They are to go as people expecting to be received. They are to knock on a door, any door. They are to wish the householder peace, *shalom*, God's healing salvation. They are to share in the hospitality offered them—no more, no less.

This, Jesus seems to imply, is the setting in which miracles can happen. The house of peace and generosity of spirit is precisely the place of God's saving presence. It hasn't to do with fine foods, aged wine, or a well-lit and warm room. It has to do with generosity of spirit and vulnerability.

“Hello! I’m Erin Thielke and I am so lucky to be the Music and Drama teacher at St. Juliana Falconieri School. I teach music to Kindergarten thru 5th grade and Drama to 6th, 7th and 8th. It is my passion to not only bring music and theatre into my students’ lives, but to empower them to share their own voices in the world.

“In music class, we learn about the elements of music, while focusing on how these elements help to tell the STORY of a song. A song is a story! We use tempo, rhythm, pitch, dynamics and instrumentation to create that story. Students are exposed to many different composers and styles of music. But most importantly, students are encouraged to believe in their own voices and sing out! In fact, a few times a year, each student actually sings by themselves in front of the class. They are so brave and expressive!

“At the center of our drama program is COMMUNICATION. Like all the arts, drama allows students to communicate with and understand others in new ways. Drama teaches about life. It encourages students to discover their God-given gifts, to overcome fears, to collaborate, to create and to acknowledge the beauty within themselves and each other. All of my drama students receive individualized instruction on how to unlock the power of their speaking voice, so that they can become more clear and effective communicators both on stage and off. They do scene work, monologues, and fun drama activities. Above all, students are given a safe forum in which they can discover their light, and let it shine.

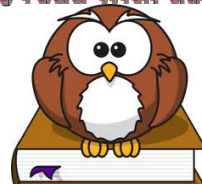
