

FROM THE PASTOR



I read a daily devotional each morning before Mass. Usually the author takes a few sentences from the Mass readings and writes a short reflection. Jennifer Christ, the author wrote a reflection on the biblical sentence in the book of Exodus 20:11: "On the seventh day God rested." I would like to share this helpful reflection with you. She writes: 'I have come to appreciate 'spaces' in my life: a clean stretch of countertop, fifteen minutes between appointments in my spiritual direc-

tion practice, a moment to notice the change of afternoon light in my garden, a quiet pause in a conversation. I am even becoming aware of spaces in my mind: times of not thinking, just being. God is so thoroughly present in the spaces. My husband loves Sundays. We go to early church, take a morning hike or bike ride, have a simple lunch, then comes the Sunday paper. The comforting aroma of coffee, papers mussed on the floor, maybe a little snooze...aaah, Sabbath! It is good to labor, but it is equally good to rest! God commands it. Plan for some intentional Sabbath time this Sunday, but also find the spaces in every day. Sit on the garden bench, go for a walk, enjoy the birds having their 3pm fly-in at the feeder. Savor the times of non-doing. Feel God loving you!"

Sundays for many contemporary families have become chaotic at times. Grocery shopping, catching up on housework, paying bills, car-pooling to sporting events, and job commitments often prevent us from celebrating the Sabbath Rest. In this regard, the author Jane Beach quoted in Bits and Pieces Publication writes: "Have you ever noticed how plants turn to face the sun? They instinctively know what is best for them, and they seek it. They bask in the sunlight, stretching, growing, to be all they can be."

The Catholic Worker Isaiah House is in great need of the following goods: paper napkins, gallon freezer bags, plastic forks and spoons, feminine hygiene products, toilet tissue, gently used clothes and shoes, gift cards from Smart and Final, Costco, or Target. Dorothy Day along with Peter Maurin founded the Catholic Worker Movement. Dorothy's faith was lived out in service to---and in solidarity with---the poor. They established numerous houses of hospitality, such as Isaiah House, to serve the needy. Blessed Mother Teresa of Calcutta once said: "I believe in person to person. Every person is Christ for me, and since there is only one Jesus, that person is the one person in the world at that moment. I see Christ in every person I touch. It is as simple as that."

Copies of the *Catholic Worker* newspaper are on the bulletin shelves in Church. Please take one with you as you leave Mass.

The Fullerton Chapter of *NAIM* for Catholic Widows and Widowers meets here at St. Juliana on the first Saturday of the month in the Parish Center meeting room at 2:30 p.m. The Chapter celebrated its 25th anniversary on July 6th. The minutes of the first meeting 25 years ago stated that Chapter members were from the following parishes: St. Philip Benizi, St. Mary, St. Juliana, St. Joseph, St. Angela Merci, St. Martin de Porres, San Antonio de Padua, and Our Lady of Guadalupe. At that time Eileen Shannon, the present president, was corresponding secretary. Eileen writes now: "Our Fullerton Chapter is the only NAIM group in the Diocese of Orange still meeting. We plan a worthwhile program each month, one that will

educate, inspire or entertain. In 25 years we have never had a 'no-show' speaker. However, we always have a video program available just in case...We invite guests to come to our programs so that family members or visitors may attend. We are not meeting August 3rd; our next meeting will be September 7th. We close each meeting with a prayer for vocations, the Apostolate of NAIM."

We heard an important message at all of our Masses this weekend. Today we embark on a Diocesan-wide Capital Campaign, the first in the history of the Diocese of Orange, that will be transformative for Orange County and fund a number of initiatives that include direct support of our parish, help for our school, assistance for retired priests, funds for Catholic Charities and Catholic causes, and the renovation of the new Christ Cathedral.

You might be interested to know that in Matthew, Mark, and Luke, of the twenty-nine parables Jesus told, sixteen deal with a person and his money. So for those of you who may grow weary from the topic, you are likely not alone. Many of the followers of Jesus may have felt the same way. But why did Jesus hit this topic so forcefully and so consistently? I think he knew all too well the corrosive effects of "wealth without a conscience" on the world. And he also understood the extraordinarily positive impact of a gift well given and a gift well received. As Catholics, we are unmistakably called by God to use our gifts, our treasure lovingly to serve the needs of others.

For Catholics, giving stands closely tied in with our relationship to Jesus. It is an outward expression of an inward devotion. Our Lord tells us, "Where your treasure is, there will your heart be also." And he goes on to demonstrate that loving and giving go hand-in-hand. In fact God so loved the world, that he gave us his only son as our example.

When our Diocese is faced with a challenge, the parish is also faced with that challenge. This Capital Campaign effort is taking place in every parish in the Diocese of Orange. When the Diocese asks the parishioners in our 62 parishes and centers for our help, I believe it is our duty to respond as members of our Diocesan family.

After hearing about the details of the campaign, I ask that you please support our campaign to the best of your ability. I especially encourage new parishioners and those who have not given in the past to prayerfully consider supporting this campaign.

The baby bottles you received this weekend may be returned next weekend and placed in the collection containers at the entrance to the church. I wish to thank Barbara Legas and the parish Respect Life Commission for organizing *Pennies from Heaven*. Most parishes in the diocese have this fundraiser to help fund the three *Life Centers*, the six *Birth Choice Health Clinics*, and the *Homes for Pregnant Mothers In Need* in Orange County. We encourage our children to save their pennies as well and participate with their parents as a family project. Beside pennies and loose change you may also insert paper money or checks in the bottles.

Pope Francis has certainly shown the truth these days of a homily he preached a few months ago. He said then, "Help one another: This is what Jesus teaches us, and this is what I am doing---and doing with all my heart---because it is my duty. As a priest and a bishop, I must be at your service. But it is a duty that comes from my heart. I love it."





REFLECTING ON GOD'S WORD

It's tempting to wish that our faith in God enabled us to have an unfailing trust that God will take us where we want to be. It would free us from diddling with decisions, vacillating and second-guessing. Only that wouldn't be faith because it would be our own script we'd have God carrying out.

Faith in God surrenders the script. It also surrenders the outcome, which is why Abraham, when asked by God to pack up kin and belongings and move to another land, did just that without knowing where or how he'd eventually settle in. And much later, like the unpredictable thread of a good novel, Abraham's story finds him and Sarah with child when they are 100 and 90 years old. A decade or so later, Abraham again finds himself without any sensible or sane understanding of the storyline as he leads young Isaac up a sacrificial mountain to what would seem to be a failure of God's promise to Abraham to father countless generations. Once more God rewrites the ending. Throughout Abraham's life it is God's script that Abraham lives out, not his own.

Faith is unpredictable, like good novels that twist and turn and keep us in suspense. If novels are well written, they keep us up long into the night. On the other hand, we like our lives quite the opposite. The appearance of the unpredictable tends to unsettle and undo our living. We presume that good lives, unlike a good novel, are interesting and engaging but always deliberately focused and free of unwarranted surprises. And so we expect good novels and good lives to be like the tracks of the railroad—parallel, but never touching or crossing lest someone or something be derailed.
