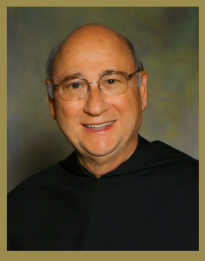

Last weekend's Capital Campaign "Kick-off" was an outstanding success. The presentations by Curtis Wesseln and Bob Dietterle on some of the details of our *For Christ Forever* Campaign were well prepared and presented. I wish to thank Curtis and Bob, committee members, and pastoral council councilors for being present at all the Masses and helping with the distribution of Matthew Kelly's book, *Four Signs of a Dynamic Catholic*. Over 900 copies were given out after all the Masses. The Respect Life ladies were also present after Mass to hand out baby bottles for the *Pennies From Heaven* collection in support of our Respect Life ministry. And, thanks to Jack Galliher and his volunteers, raffle books for our annual *Fall Festival* in September were available for pick-up. You can see it was an energetic and hardworking weekend.

In the church pews are *Volunteer Cards* which I hope you will take with you when you come to Mass. There are no special qualifications necessary to volunteer except a willingness to sacrifice a small amount of your time, and a desire to contribute to the achievement of our target. This is your parish, and I am asking you to be involved. Matthew Kelly touches on this theme of engagement in the opening pages of his book. As you read those pages, see where you find yourself.

We have a strong Campaign Committee who will lead us through this project, but we need a lot more help to ensure our success here at St. Juliana. Donating your time and talents will prove to be a rewarding experience for you and a meaningful contribution for your parish, for the Catholic community in our neighborhood, and for our future.

As you prayerfully consider how you will participate in this first-time-ever Diocesan Capital Campaign, remember that this Campaign is not concerned solely with the renovation and expansion of the Christ Cathedral campus. There are four other components that are included and equally as important. Our rebate will significantly impact our parish debt and some of the repairs needed in the church. Our church bathrooms are in dire need of renovation. The carpeting in church is getting threadbare in places and despite our efforts to keep it clean, continues to be an eye-sore. The doors of the church are more suitable for a factory or industrial building than a church and are difficult to open even by the heartiest seniors.

Let's be frank about it! This Campaign is certainly about money. Money, in a sense, is life. It is life because we spend a great deal of our lives getting it for the purpose of staying alive and for improving our condition. If we understand our Catholic Faith and take seriously the words of Matthew Kelly, we will also give money so that others may live and live better than they otherwise would without our help.

In St. Paul's second letter to the Church of Corinth he encourages Christians to be "*Cheerful Givers*." He says: "*Brothers and sisters: Whoever sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and whoever sows bountifully will also reap bountifully. Each must do as already determined, without sadness or compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver. Moreover, God is able to make every grace abundant for you, so that in all things, always having all you need, you may have an abundance for every good work.*" Imagine the impact of those words on the success of our

endeavors as a community of faith, if we took them to heart as truly God's word.

There is no sin in owning and enjoying things. We were made by God, designed by our Creator to desire material prosperity and enjoy the fruits of our labor. But as persons of faith we cannot be rich in our possessions and at the same time turn our backs to the needs of the church. As Catholics, giving stands closely tied in with our relationship to Jesus. We are unmistakably called by God to use our gifts, our treasure lovingly to serve the needs of others. Our Lord tells us in St. Luke's Gospel, "*Where your treasure is, there will your heart be also.*" Then he goes on to demonstrate that loving and giving go hand-in hand. In fact God so loved the world, he gave us his only son as our example.

Less than 25 percent of active Catholics donate here in the United States and less than 3 percent of Catholics give worldwide. In recent studies conducted by Catholic Social and Pastoral Research Initiative at the University of Notre Dame, American Catholics are less likely than the rest of the population to report giving 10 percent or more of their income as voluntary contributions, and are less likely to report donating money specifically to religious causes in the past 12 months.

The data show that the single most important factor explaining these findings is a lack of spiritual engagement with money on the part of most American Catholics. Rather than seeing their use of money and possessions as part of their spiritual life, as a part of Christian formation and faithfulness, American Catholics tend to compartmentalize, to separate money from matters of faith, to think that money and material possessions do not have much to do with spirituality or one's faith.

These facts, however, in no way minimize the impact of the generosity of St. Juliana families who give an extraordinary amount of their treasure to the parish on a consistent basis. Nor do these statistics lessen the impact of the unparalleled and largehearted generosity of parishioners who raised over 9 million dollars in the last 14 years resulting in our parish school renovation and our new Parish Center.

I know that this Capital Campaign will take some convincing. Hopefully, you received the letter from Bishop Kevin Vann. Toward the end of the month you will receive a second letter from the committee inviting you to attend a reception to learn more about this important endeavor.

Our parish festival is about six weeks away. The festival committee has been meeting regularly to plan the festival. This year we have a new Carnival company that promises great rides for our children and a colorful Midway. Raffle books are available and if you sell your book early you will be eligible for the early bird drawing. Also don't forget to bring your used books to the container in church for the book sale. The festival book sale is always financially successful.

School opens in a few weeks and it will be good to see and hear our children both in the parish school and our School of Religious Education (SRE). One of the goals of the Capital Campaign is support of Catholic Education. With Rosary High School and Acacia School opening, remember to allow extra time in the morning for the 8am Mass.

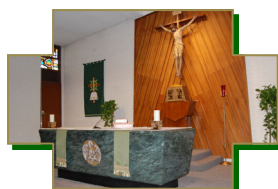

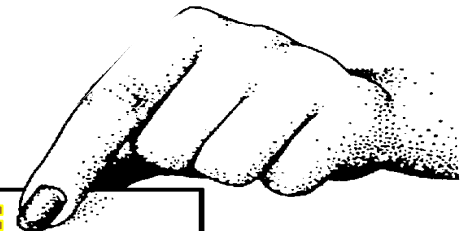

Saying the rosary and meditating on the mysteries allows us to become aware of the life of Jesus, as witnessed in the eyes of his Mother.

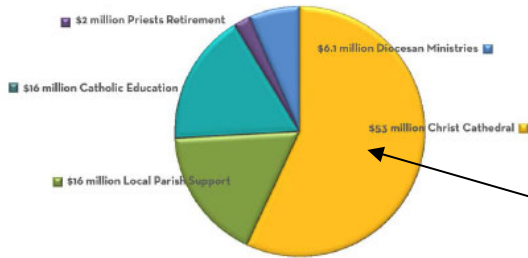

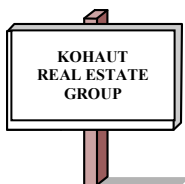

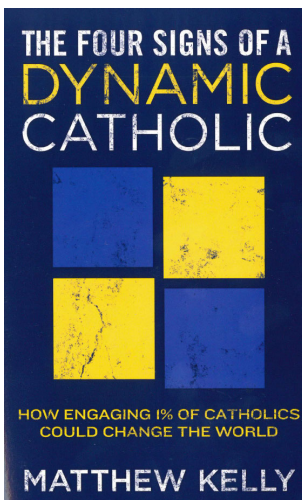
