

FROM THE PASTOR

The *Christ Forever Capital Campaign* is in full swing in parishes of the Diocese of Orange. This is the first Diocesan wide Capital Campaign conducted by the Diocese of Orange in the 37-year history of the Diocese. Here at St. Juliana we have been blessed with generous donors who have raised millions of dollars for our parish needs, our school

building and new Parish Center. We are pros when it comes to raising funds for causes we believe in. Next weekend we kick off our participation in this campaign.

The *Christ Forever Capital Campaign* is designed to support our future Christ Cathedral, local parishes in their designated projects, Catholic education, Priests retirement and Diocesan ministries. So you can see that there are a number of areas that potential donors can support.

Over the next few months, we will be involved in conducting our part in this Diocesan wide *Campaign*. In order to fully explain the magnitude if this endeavor, we will be hosting educational receptions designed to raise awareness about this project and to provide families with opportunities to ask questions. You will be receiving an invitation within the next couple of weeks. I would like to see every parishioner attend one of these receptions.

The diocesan goal for this campaign is \$100 million dollars and of that amount \$49 million has already been pledged by donors throughout the Diocese. Each and every Catholic in Orange County benefits from the campaign and that is a good thing. The new Christ Cathedral is only one aspect of the campaign. The website and the literature will go into the details, but a significant amount of funds we raise will come back to us. If we reach our goal of \$1.3 million, the rebate to St. Juliana will be approximately \$325,000 and the majority of this will go to paying off our own debt which at present is \$924, 240.26.

To reach our goal, we must find the "I" in "We." Taking personal responsibility will be the key to our success in raising money as in past campaigns. Each of us individually must discern for ourselves the right amount to give and we should all give something. If you have never given to our efforts here at St. Juliana or if you are new to the parish, I would encourage you to pray and decide how you will participate.

Next weekend Father Luke and I will speak briefly at homily time and then introduce Curtis Wesseln and members of the *Campaign Committee*. A short over-view of the Campaign will follow.

A few weeks ago I wrote about the possibility of purchasing *Magnificat* at a reduced rate if we had 40 subscriptions. So far seven requests have been called in. There may be a reduced rate even if we have less than 40. I will wait another week to see if more subscriptions come into the office. The plan is to order the subscriptions and send one check from St. Juliana. Individual checks will then be made out to St. Juliana. If you are interested in a subscription, please drop me an e-mail or call the office at (714)-879-1965.

I read an interesting interview with Chicago White Sox Catcher, Tyler Flowers in the National Catholic Register. The interview was conducted by Register correspondent Trent Beatie. Flowers is Catholic and his wife Nancy has been a tremendous influence on renewing the faith of his baptism. Tyler and Nancy were married in 2008, but didn't conceive any children for a couple of years. They saw Catholic doctors and found out that nothing was wrong with them physically, so their advice was to pray. Tyler said, "We took that to heart and regularly went to Eucharistic adoration. We also went to the sacrament of reconciliation more frequently. Then, once we started praying to St. Therese of Lisieux for help, we conceived. It must have been God's plan to use our lack of children as a way to get us closer to St. Therese. She is one of the greatest saints of the Church, so we can gain so much from her. Our biggest gain is our daughter Mia Therese Flowers who is almost 11 months old."

Later in the interview, Tyler talks about his Catholic faith and how it impacts his career as a baseball player. He says: "I do enjoy playing baseball, but the game's ups and downs can really get to you if you let them. It's easy to become selfish, which leads you down the road to temptations which you wouldn't otherwise notice....I love to pray Rosaries, which are very Christ-centered. In fact Jesus' name is literally at the center of the Hail Mary. It's been said that praying the Rosary is learning about Jesus at the school of Mary...When you become more devoted to Mary you will inevitably become more devoted to Jesus in the Eucharist. It's easy for me to attend Sunday Mass in Chicago because there's a Mass within the stadium available to players before the game...Participation in Mass keeps Christ not only on my mind, but also on my tongue and in my heart... God speaks to us not only through the consolations, but also the trials of life. I've experienced reality this season. I haven't had a year like the one I planned on having, so my plans and God's don't seem to be matching up in that regard. This means I need to quit making plans of my own and go where he leads me. I'm not sure where that will be, but I will keep working hard and keep my heart and ears open to see how I should do his work."

The Knights of Columbus have been faithful in sponsoring blood drives over the years. While the response last Sunday was small, our Knights gave their time and energy to provide an opportunity for blood to be collected to save lives. Thank you, Knights! Thank you to all who gave!

Our Respect Life commission will be handing out baby bottles next weekend to support Pro-Life programs in Orange County. I hope you will participate.

Registration for the School of Religious Education (SRE) is taking place at this time. Please register as soon as possible.

Father John Powell, S.J. wrote these words in his book, Will the Real Me Please Stand Up: "Somehow we sense that our lives seem to go about as well as our relationships. We are about as happy as our relationships are happy. A 'human loner' is a contradiction in terms. The existence of a human in isolation from others is like a plant trying to survive without sunlight or water. No new growth can occur and the life that does exist begins to wither and will slowly die. For us to be is to be with another or with others. The quality of our human existence is grounded in our relationships."




