

FROM THE PASTOR

August 25, 2013



School opens this Tuesday and we begin the 2013-2014 school year. Welcome back to our students, faculty, staff and parents! After a long summer recess, the opening of the new school year brings a sigh of relief from parents; and from the students, a mostly joyous anticipation to see their classmates and hit the books. Every new school year brings an element of hopefulness. With our updated

technology, new learning materials, and teacher formation, the new school year promises to be a time of academic excellence and faith formation.

Besides the educational formation of our children in secular subjects, the school community is committed to the spiritual formation of our children as well. The parish school is an integral partner with the larger parish community in the spiritual and intellectual life of the Church. We are a *Catholic School* and both the school and parish are mutually supportive. If the school community drifts away from active participation in parish life and vice-versa, there is a danger that over time, the school will begin to loose students and eventually close. This has happened in our Diocese and especially our Deanery. I will be asking both the school community and parishioners to take an active interest in each other and rally around the plans and activities that develop during the coming days.

By now you surely have heard of *Brew Fest*. A group of funloving, hard-working, children-loving and parish-loving young professional men decided that they would create a fundraiser to help needy school families and fund educational related needs of St. Juliana students. *Brew Fest* is the creation of C.L.I.F. (Catholic Lithuanian Irish Federation). This enjoyable evening happens this Saturday from 6-11pm in the Parish Center. If you are reading this after Mass on Saturday, why not come back and sample the various brews and foods. 100% of the proceeds go to St. Juliana School.

Now that we have had a chance to hear some of the details associated with the *For Christ Forever* Capital Campaign, I hope you will attend one the upcoming campaign receptions. The schedule is as follows: September 18 at 9am in the Parish Center; September 19 at 6:30pm in the Seven Holy Founders meeting room; September 22 at 6:15pm in the Parish Center. These dates and times will appear in future bulletins as well.

This Diocesan-wide Capital Campaign is not only our first Capital Campaign as a Diocesan community, but it also takes place during the *Year of Faith* in which we are invited to rediscover our faith and profess our renewed conviction. This is an opportunity to grow in covenant with God and one another. By joining together today, we will show our unity as we continue the work of Christ here in our own Catholic community in Orange County. The book by Matthew Kelly, *Four signs of a Dynamic Catholic,* which you received is meant to help develop a more engaged Catholic, especially in understanding the virtue of generosity which is one of the four signs.

On September 16, 1992 Father Henri Nouwen, an internationally renowned author, respected professor, and beloved pastor delivered an address *On the Spirituality of Fundraising*. I would like to quote some of his words from time to time in this space. In the opening pages of his address he writes, "*From the perspective of the gospel, fundraising is not a response to a crisis. Fundraising is, first and foremost, a form of ministry. It is a way* of announcing our vision and inviting other people into our mission. Vision and mission are so central to the life of God's people that without vision we perish and without mission lose our way. Vision also shows us new directions and opportunities for our mission. Vision gives us courage to speak when we might want to remain silent. Fundraising is proclaiming what we believe in such a way that we offer other people an opportunity to participate with us in our vision and mission. Fundraising is precisely the opposite of begging. When we seek to raise funds we are not saying, 'Please, could you help us out because lately it's been hard.' Rather, we are declaring, 'We have a vision that is amazing and exciting. We are inviting you to invest yourself through the resources that God has given you---your energy, vour pravers, and vour money----in this work to which God has called us.' Our invitation is clear and confident because we trust that our vision and mission are like 'trees planted by streams of water, which yield their fruit in its season, and their leaves do not wilt. (Ps.1:3)'"

St. Juliana is one of 16 parishes in U.S. Representative Ed Royce's district. On this Tuesday, August 27, 2013 from 6:30 pm-8:30pm, St. Juliana parishioners are invited to join with parishioners in the Diocese of Orange, Archdiocese of L.A. and the Diocese San Bernardino to participate in a historic, prayerful religious procession hosted by St. Angela Merici Church to Rep. Royce's office in Brea to urge Rep Royce to lead on and to vote for just, compassionate and Comprehensive Immigration Reform, with an earned pathway to citizenship. This initiative is sponsored by the Diocese of Orange, Respect Life, Justice & Peace. I have asked our Knights of Columbus and leaders of parish organizations to represent St. Juliana. *(see page 11 for more info)*

For the past four years I have had the opportunity to participate as a member of the Fullerton Interfaith Ministerial Association (FIMA) representing St. Juliana Church and the Catholic Faith. A few months ago I suggested to the members that we plan and hold an Interfaith Religious Fair and we would host it in our Parish Center. I am happy to say that the Fair will be held here on Sunday, September 8, 2012 from 1pm to 3pm. Dr. Paul Levesque, professor and chair of the Department of comparative Religion at CSU Fullerton will speak at 2 pm. There will be 10-15 faith communities represented from various Christian, Jewish, Sikh, Buddist, Muslim, and Independent religious communities. Each will have a booth with free materials and representatives to answer questions. This will be an opportunity for everyone to get to know each other and learn more about the diversity of belief. I am so thrilled that this will take place here at St. Juliana and hope you will attend. *(see page 5 for more info)*

This weekend we celebrate the feast of St. Philip Benizi, O.S.M. with the blessing of water and bread. This blessing recalls the time Philip and a companion visited the Servite friars in Arezzo during a famine. The food ran out and Philip prayed with the friars for relief. Mysteriously baskets of bread and jugs of water appeared at the door. From that time this miracle has been associated with his feastday. St. Philip was born in

Florence in 1233. He was ordained a priest and in 1267 elected Prior General of the Order. He is most noted for his wisdom and courage as he enacted laws governing the growth of the Order. Because of his \in strong influence, he has been considered a "father of the Order." In died in 1285 at Todi and canonized by Pope Clement X in 1671.

My name is **Krista Mead** and I teach technology skills to the students at St. Juliana Falconieri School.

Students come to the lab once or twice a week depending on their grade level. Students work on curriculum-based projects utilizing



a variety of software applications including word processing, spreadsheet, desktop publishing, presentation, and web-based applications. Students are continually refining their technological skills throughout the year.

My hope for the stu-

dents is that they are able to develop the skills necessary to succeed in our technological world.

Hello, my name is **Jan Young** and I am the Librarian at St. Juliana Falconieri. I am passionate about libraries, technology and sharing this with the students!

Our library is a warm and inviting environment with couches, chairs and plenty of study tables. Each grade has a weekly scheduled library time. Students may also visit the library before school, recess and lunch recess.



The students visiting the library may take Accelerated Reading quizzes, search for quiz information, check-in or out books, ask for a readers advisory, read quietly or work on homework. SJS utilizes the Accelerated Reading program, this is a reading comprehension program used to enhance students literary skills. Accelerated Reading guizzes are available through our school library only. Having quizzes in the library alleviates the classroom teacher in monitoring quiz taking in the classroom. I work closely with the classroom teacher, regarding student's progress and assisting students in need. Students achieving their Star Reader goals are recognized at the end of the school year for their reading achievements. Our school library is open throughout the summer allowing students to check-in/out books, and take AR guizzes early. Next year I will team up with our 7th/8th grade Literature/Language Arts Teacher, Mrs. Ryan, and we will be adding to Internet Research skills by utilizing databases, and evaluating Internet resources. To access a variety of databases we will ask students to sign-up for a library card at their local public library. We have recently purchased ebooks, this will be an enhancement to our fiction collection, and students technology skills.




