



It was extended to the universal church by Pius VII in 1814, and the date was fixed by Pius X as the day after the feast of the <i>Exaltation of the Holy Cross</i> , that is September 15 th . "PENNIES FROM HEAVEN" COLLECTION REPORT

As of Sept 8, the total of donations for the Pennies From Heaven collection is \$6,402.74. That is about \$1,200 more than last year. Thank you all so very much for your generosity. There are still about 100 bottles that have not been returned. Some people have indicated that they are holding on to them to fill during the year. That is fine. We just want to make sure we have enough bottles on hand to pass out next year. The return basket will be in the vestibule just until next weekend. The final figure from the Diocese for last years collection from all parishes was \$251,206. That figure is twice what it was before the parishes started using baby bottles for the collection. But, now there are more crisis pregnancy Life Centers, Birth Choice Clinics and Homes in Orange County that depend on this collection for their yearly operating costs. Their are 15 facilities that receive funding from this collection each year.
