FROM THE PASTOR



Welcome Bishop Kevin Vann to St. Juliana parish this weekend! We are happy to celebrate Mass with you on the occasion of your first pastoral visit to the Parish! Be assured of our deepest respect and loyalty as the chief shepherd of the Diocese of Orange!

In the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* a number of articles are devoted to explaining the office of Bishop, his ministry and rela-

tionship to the Pope, Bishop of Rome. Article 886 reads: "The individual bishops are the visible source and foundation of unity in their own particular Churches. As such, they exercise their pastoral office over the portion of the People of God assigned to them, assisted by priests and deacons. But, as a member of the episcopal college, each bishop shares in the concern for all the Churches." Article 888 reads: "Bishops, with priests as coworkers, have as their first task to preach the Gospel of God to all men (and women), in keeping with the Lord's command. They are heralds of faith, who draw new disciples to Christ; they are authentic teachers of the apostolic faith endowed with the authority of Christ." Article 893 reads: "The bishop is the steward of the grace of the supreme priesthood, especially in the Eucharist which he offers personally or whose offering he assures through the priests, his co-workers. The Eucharist is the center of the life of the particular Church. The bishop and priests sanctify the church by their prayer and work, by their ministry of the word and of the sacraments. Lastly, Article 896 states: "The Good Shepherd ought to be the model and form of the bishop's pastoral office. Conscious of his own weaknesses, the bishop...can have compassion for those who are ignorant and erring. He should not refuse to listen to his subjects whose welfare he promotes as of his very own children....the faithful....should be closely attached to the bishop as the Church is to Jesus Christ and as Jesus Christ is to the Father."

I am so grateful to St. Juliana parishioners who were so generous with their thoughts and prayers during my recent hospitalization. I tried to be as visible as possible last weekend at most of the Masses and in the Parish Center during coffee and donuts. The cards I received, the calls, and the well wishes of so many, were and are a source of comfort to me. I begin cardiac rehab in a few weeks. Since this is the second time through this experience, I am familiar with the diet, exercise and rehab routine. My added thoughts of deep gratitude go also to Father Luke, the parish staff, and visitors who stopped by the hospital. On November 30th it will be one year since I broke my shoulder. I still do not have complete mobility and at times I'm in some pain. At the time I broke my shoulder, I never thought I would have to go through another period of time under doctor's care so soon

A well-wisher advised me to relax and lessen any stress in my life. My doctors assured me that a broken shoulder and a clogged artery are not the result of stress, although stress doesn't help. Please know that I love my life, my work, my Servite community, and the wonderful parishioners I have the privilege of serving these past 4 ½ years. Stress rarely saps my energy. After forty-seven years of priestly ministry and a four-time pastor I am fully aware not only of my shortcomings but also my gifts and talents which I have shared abundantly in four very different parish communities. What the future holds is unclear, but I plan on being as healthy as I can in the meantime.

The school children and staff outdid themselves with affection.

My office was inundated with bouquets of flowers and home-made "get-well" cards. I stopped by the school this past week and thanked everyone personally. I love the children and our exceptional school community.

Last weekend's celebration of the feast of Our Lady of Sorrows was truly inspiring. I am glad that I had the chance to share with you a personal story of how devoted I have been for most of my life to this special devotion. I found this "Recipe" which I would like to share with you. It is called, "A Saintly Recipe for a Woman of Faith." Ingredients: 3 cups of prayer; 2½ cups of faith; 1½ cups of struggle; ¼ cup of comfort; ¼ cup of caretaking; 2 Tb of inspiration; 2Tb of grief; 1 oz. of loss; 1 Lb. of family. Directions: Gently fold Family together until firm, slowly adding Comfort and Caretaking. In a separate bowl, mix Struggle with Prayer, Grief, and Loss. Pour mixture over Family, adding a healthy amount of Inspiration and Faith. Bake at 365 degrees for one lifetime. Give Thanks and Enjoy! Recommended but not required: Add chocolate, cups of tea and laughter to taste.

A separate column from Todd Helm, our longtime choir director and music director debuts on page five in this bulletin. Todd has graciously expanded his role as music director to include not only directing the choir but overseeing and developing all aspects of music ministry for Sunday worship and special celebrations.

Todd has been Director of Music here at St. Juliana since 1994. He is in his 30th year teaching choral music at Bonita High School in La Verne where he directs 300 students in five performing choirs. The Bonita choirs have attended music festivals all across the country and most recently performed in Carnegie Hall and St. Patrick's Cathedral in New York City. Todd holds a BA in Music from UCLA and a Master's of Music in Choral Conducting from CSUF. He also worked as musical director/conductor for the Fullerton Civic Light Opera for over 20 years. He and his wife, Carmel, live in Yorba Linda and have two children who are pursuing careers in the Arts.

I always enjoy sharing stories of faith with you. This story appeared in the *National Catholic Register* about a Catholic mom and business leader by the name of Paige Barry of Atlanta. Paige is a 43 year-old mother of two who has been married for 15 years. She is senior vice president with a Fortune 500 global technology provider serving the financial services industry. In addition to her career and busy home life, she is actively involved in her parish and runs the successful career ministry at her church.

Paige explains, "My Catholic faith is instrumental to every aspect of my career...I use daily prayer to prepare me for difficult conversations. I pray for the individuals who work for me who are struggling in their jobs; and I ask God for guidance in my big career decisions. As a Catholic business leader, I feel I have a responsibility to see God in everyone I work with...I enjoy sharing prayers with my staff who I know are open to a relationship with God; and I find myself in frequent conversations answering questions about our Catholic faith."

Festival weekend is near. My deepest appreciation and blessing to the festival committee under the leadership of John Kohaut and to all the volunteers as we prepare for the *Fall Festival* next weekend.

NOTES FROM MUSIC MINISTRY By Todd Helm, Director of Music

Why We Sing

According to The Music Documents of the National Conference of Catholic Bishops, "Among the many signs and symbols used by the Church to celebrate its faith, MUSIC is of preeminent importance. As sacred song is united to words, it forms a necessary or integral part of the solemn liturgy". Over the next several weeks, I will be discussing the music of our Church, and specifically the parish of St. Juliana. It is my goal to familiarize our parish with our music ministry, introduce the "players", give you a behind-the-scenes glimpse of what is involved in preparing our music for our weekly and special celebrations, and I am going to start the discussion by focusing on the most important players in this ministry, which is the congregation.

Catholics have an unfortunate reputation of being a Christian community of reluctant singers, especially when compared with our brothers and sisters in some Protestant communities. Why is this? One can put partial blame on the pre-Vatican II Mass being non-participatory and we are still recovering from this (although I question that a recovery period should last 50 years), the lack of choral music in our schools, or the theory that due to the audio/video revolution, we have become a society of listeners and watchers, instead of participants. When I ask members of our parish why they don't sing, the responses are varied, with the most common being, 1.)"No one wants to hear MY voice", 2.)"I don't know/like the songs that are chosen" or 3.)"the music is too high for me". This week, I would like to address the first reply.

Singing can be a very intimidating activity for the untrained vocalist. But, we sometimes forget that singing is a natural form of expression for humans, - we have been singing as long as we have been speaking. In the immortal words of Harold Hill in "The Music Man" - "...singing is merely sustained speech." My father was tone-deaf, but sang at the top of his lungs in church every Sunday because he loved to sing. I remember the stares from people around us, but as I have spent my professional career teaching choral music, I have come to realize that my dad had the right idea. My advice for all of you reluctant vocalists - be confident. Don't be concerned with what those around may be thinking. If every single person at Mass sang, no one would be intimidated. Singing is a gift from God - we all need to use that gift at every Mass. When one says "No one wants to hear my voice", I disagree. God wants to hear your voice. Psalm 96 says" Sing to the Lord a new song. Sing to the Lord all the earth." It does not conclude with "...but only if your voice is trained and perfectly in tune". Singing is the most solemn form of prayer and the Mass is meant to be sung, not spoken. Do not be timid about letting your voice be heard! On behalf of the Music Ministry, we ask you to participate vocally and encourage your family to do likewise. There have been many studies recently claiming the mental and physical health benefits from group singing. Singing makes you feel good. We want St. Juliana to be a singing parish!

Next week I will be discussing the relationship between the cantor/choir and congregation and the specific roles they play in the music of the Mass. Let us sing confidently to the Lord!




