

FROM THE PASTOR



Today, Sunday, September 8, 2013 we welcome members of FIMA (Fullerton Interfaith Ministerial Association) to the *Interfaith Religious Fair* to be held in our Parish Center from 1pm to 3 pm. FIMA member faith communities along with non-members will be present at tables positioned around the interior perimeter of the Parish Center to share information and hand out printed mate-

rials highlighting the basic tenets and practices of their faith. Beside the main line Christian Churches, there will be non-Christian representatives from the Buddhist, Muslim, Sikh, and Jewish communities along with the Unitarian Universalist Congregation and the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints.

The highlight of the day will be the presentation by Dr. Paul J. Levesque, professor and chair of the Department of Comparative Religion at CSU Fullerton. He teaches courses in religion and politics, world religions, Christian thought, and methods of studying religion. His research interests are animated by questioning the role and possibility of religion in today's pluralistic world, including issues surrounding the relationship between church and state in the U.S.

Dr. Levesque has presented papers at the 2nd International Louvain Encounters in Theology Conference in Louvain, Belgium, and at the national meetings of the American Academy of Religion, the American Association of Higher Education, the Association for the Sociology of Religion, and the Society for the Study of Social Problems. Dr. Levesque has also participated in numerous local and regional conferences throughout Southern California.

School Masses have begun on a regular basis. This year children will attend the 8 am parish Mass on Tuesday, Wednesday, and Friday. They will not attend on those days when there is a special feast day and on the first Friday of every month. Some designated Sundays, the children will attend Mass by grouping of grade levels. On Sunday, September 15 (the feast day of Our Lady of Sorrows) K, 4, & 8 grades will attend the 7:30 am Mass. It is my hope and the fervent desire of the school administration that a closer alliance and partnership will be fostered between parishioners, students, parents and school community. "One Faith, One Baptism, One Lord, One Family".

Next weekend we celebrate the Feast of Our Lady of Sorrows. What is wonderful this year is that the actual feast day in the church calendar, September 15th, falls on a Sunday. Even when it falls on a weekday, the Servite Order has the privilege of celebrating the feast day on the closest Sunday.

In the latter part of the 16th/17th centuries, devotion to Mary at the foot of the cross under her title, "Our Lady of Sorrows" became a popular devotion. Over time the devotion expanded to embrace all the sorrowful moments of Mary's life described or implied in the New Testament. These moments came to be known collectively as, *The Seven Sorrows of Mary*. They are: *The Prophecy of Simeon; The Flight into Egypt; The Loss of the Child Jesus in the Temple; Mary Meets Jesus Carrying His Cross; Mary Stands beneath the Cross of Jesus; Mary Receives the Dead Body of Jesus; Jesus is Laid in the Tomb.* This Marian devotion is entirely Scripture based.

In 1997 Servite Sister, Joyce Rupp, O.S.M. wrote a wonderful book entitled, "Your Sorrow is My Sorrow." In the introduction

she writes these words: "The intensity of someone's painful situation can be so demanding that it swallows our emotional life for a time...I believe this happened to Mary of Nazareth in her seven great sorrows. Each one threw her off balance. Each one demanded her full attention. She gave herself totally to the hurts associated with her son, but she also knew how to dip deeply inside and draw from the strength that the Holy One gave her. Mary's life contained piercing hurts, but it also held a vast reservoir of faith. Suffering sears us and compassion transforms us. After the storm has passed and the pain has ceased, wisdom and tenderness often bloom in the garden of our hearts. These flowers of compassion begin to bud when we are at the foot of the cross. The juice of our steadfast faithfulness and generous presence fills the buds and eventually opens them in fullness."

In the Epilogue of her book she describes a time when she gathered with 72 other people of faith for a retreat with a strong Marian component. She writes: "As we stood before Mary, our leader invited each of us to come and lay our troubles and sorrows at her feet, to 'let them go,' to 'give them to Mary.' What happened next also astounded me. A young woman stood by the side of Mary and began to wail. Several men bent down before Mary and opened their arms to empty their burdens and each began to weep. They remained there for some time. I saw and heard more and more tears as each person bent to give their burdens to Mary. It was a powerful moment for me, to see how deeply the connection with Mary's sorrow had touched their hearts. Surely each one who left their sorrows and heartaches at the feet of Mary that day had a sense of how Mary had suffered and how deep was her compassionate understanding and love."

The *Fall Festival* is three weeks away and there are still openings for volunteers. The sign-up board in church lists opportunities for you to fill. While the *Festival* is a formidable commitment for volunteers, there are moments when you can take a break, relax, and enjoy the festivities.

Our *For Christ Forever* Capital Campaign is progressing nicely. The positive response has been encouraging to the committee and the outlook for reaching our goal is promising. Remember to keep in mind the spiritual dimension of this Campaign. There are five distinct goals. The development of the *Christ Cathedral Campus* is only one of the goals and not at the top of the list.

What a surprise! The phone rings and on the other line is Bishop Kevin Vann's secretary. "Hello, Father Frank Falco, this is Bishop Vann's office calling. The Bishop would like to come to St. Juliana on Sunday, September 22, 2013 and celebrate the 9 am Mass with the parishioners." "Yes, of course," I said, "we will be honored." I believe this call may have been in response to a conversation with the bishop I had about six months ago. During one of the meetings with Bishop Vann I approached him and after a short conversation asked him if he would come to St. Juliana for a pastoral visit. He seemed interested and eager to respond. He shared with me his good experiences with Servites back in Illinois. Bishop Vann is a native of Springfield, Illinois. I know that all of our parishioners, school parents, children and parish leaders will welcome Bishop Vann.


COMPUTER NEWS!

Background

• SB 131 is proposed legislation authored by state Senator Jim Beall (D-Campbell) and supported by trial attorneys that seeks to amend the current California statute of limitations as it relates to the filing of civil lawsuits concerning the abuse of minors by again opening another one-year window for those alleging long past abuse to sue not only the Church, but also the YMCA, Little League, AYSO, Big Brothers and Sisters Clubs and hundreds of other private service organizations that care for children.

• Supporters of SB 131 were able to garner the minimum number of votes (21) needed for the bill's passage in the State Senate in face of vociferous opposition by many concerned Catholics and Californians that worked tirelessly opposing this bill, thinking this legislation is poorly written, does not adequately protect children and unduly impacts the Church and other not-for-profit organizations.

• The bill was voted down in the Assembly Appropriations Committee on August 14th, but the fight is not over. The bill was later passed out of the committee through a parliamentary maneuver and will be voted on this coming week.

• If enacted, this bill would expose the Church and other not-for-profit organizations to unlimited liability while offering no further protections to children or increasing criminal penalties for abusers.

Poorly written legislation does not advance efforts to protect children

• According to the bill's author, this legislation was introduced to help victims, protect children and prevent abuse. The Catholic Church strongly supports these aims and has worked tirelessly over the past decade to advance such efforts.

• But the Church does not support SB 131 in its current form because it does not extend any added protection to the 90 percent of children who attend public school, while unduly targeting not-for-profit service organizations, such as our Church.

• Dioceses throughout California have worked to atone for past mistakes and have implemented robust procedures to ensure children and young people are as safe as we can make them. They have also pressed for changes in law and society to ensure children and young people are protected.

• SB 131 does little to help advance this critical work. Existing law protects public schools, city recreation leagues and other local governments from being sued for any abuse that took place before 2009.

• Additionally, SB 131 does nothing to encourage prosecutions of alleged abuse in criminal court and does not increase penalties for abusers or extend the criminal statute of limitations.

Bill discriminates against the Church and other not-for-profits

• The changes within the proposed law will only affect private employers such as churches, youth leagues, the YMCA, foster homes and private schools by opening up yet another
