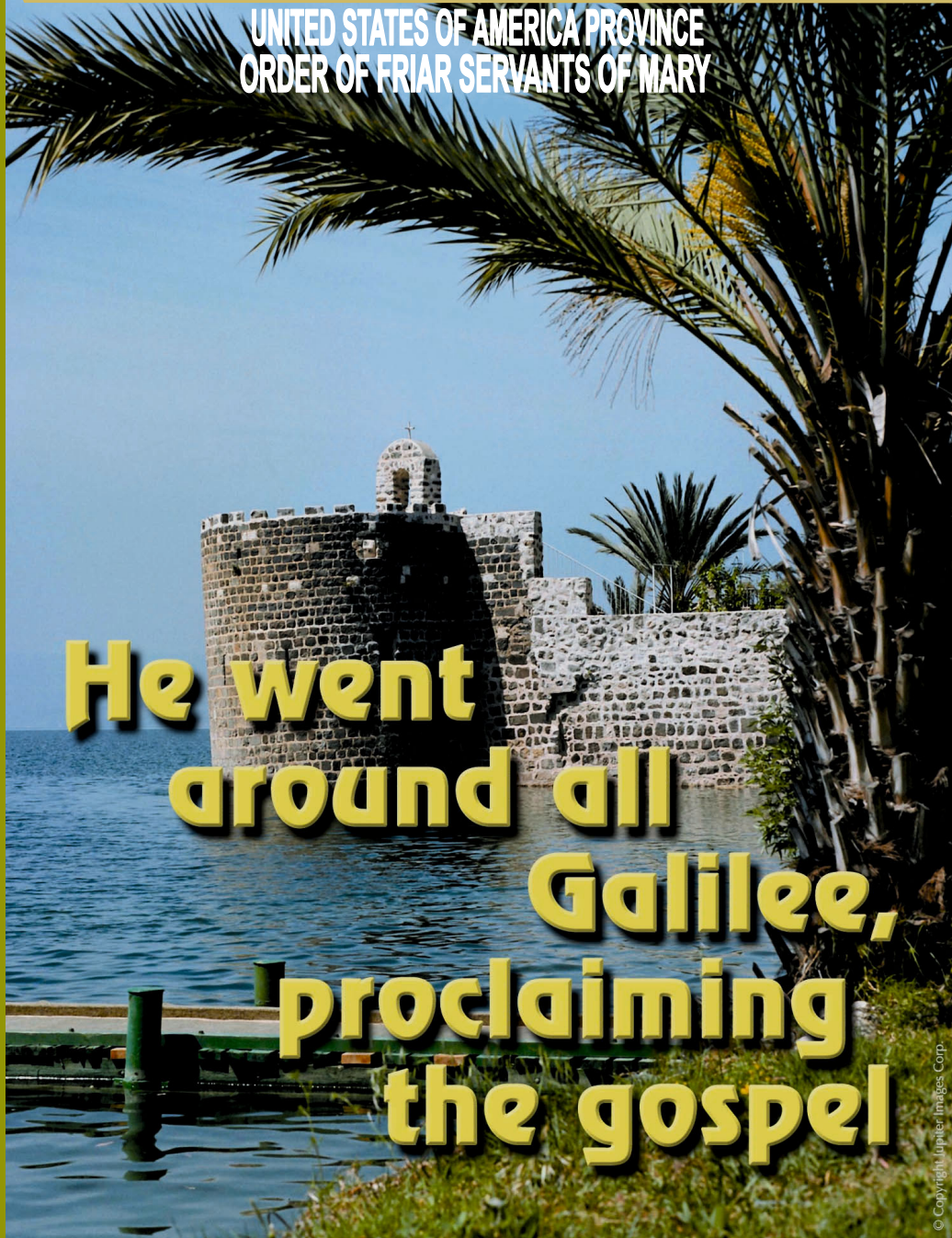

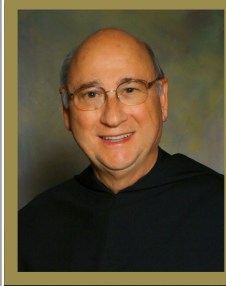

I'm happy to be home after a long absence from the parish, almost three weeks. My home visit to the Chicago area and the pilgrimage to the Holy Land were wonderful experiences but exhausting.

As reported in the newspaper and on the News, the Midwest has been and still is in a winter freeze with temperatures below zero and numerous snow storms. The

week I spent with my cousin and his wife in Roselle, Illinois was exciting for me since the snowfall created a lovely winter wonderland. While shoveling snow and having to bundle up with layers of winter clothes created many inconveniences, it was a welcome change for me. Snow and Christmas seem to go together.

The weather was a concern for me toward the end of my home visit since I needed to fly from O'Hare airport to Newark and then on to Tel-Aviv, Israel.

The Saturday of my departure turned out to be the only day the weather cleared both in the Chicago area and the east coast. So my flights were routine and thankfully I made all my connections and arrived in Israel to link up with my pilgrimage group.

During the next few weeks I'll be working with Suzie, our parish secretary to transfer my photos to a CD

with commentary on the religious sites I visited during my pilgrimage. This will be a slow process. As soon as we finish, I'll choose a time when I can make a presentation to the parish for those who may be interested.

You may have read in the Newspaper our Governor Jerry Brown has declared a state of emergency for California in the face of record dryness, a thin snow pack and increased wildfire risk. The proclamation, the paper relates, triggers a variety of measures aimed at water conservation and management, and asks California residents to voluntarily cut back on water use. Both state and local agencies plan to step up a campaign urging the public to save water.

I remind myself often to be conscious of wasting water. Sometimes while shaving or washing dishes I find myself turning the faucet on and off instead of letting a steady stream of water trickle down the drain wasting a precious resource that we as Americans generally take for granted. Like recycling and other forms of environmental protection, we need to be more intentional about protecting these life-giving assests.

We begin Catholic Schools Week this weekend with the pres-

ence of our children, teachers, and parents at the 9 am Mass followed by open house in the School building. Our parish school has much to offer those who desire a Catholic Education. While I have great respect for the public school system in Fullerton, Catholic Education is a unique ministry we as Catholics render to both Catholic and Non-Catholic families by adding moral discipline, faith-based education, and formation leading to higher education. Our parish school is a stable institution with excellent technology, curriculum to prepare students for the next step in their education, and financial solidness due to the commitment of parents, benefactors, and generous parishioners. Our school will remain solid and viable keeping in mind that it is part of the parish of St. Juliana and not a separate entity. Parents, students, staff, and extended families are expected to take an active part in parish life, including Sunday Mass and parish sponsored activities. Reciprocally, parishioners are encouraged to take an active interest in the school and school sponsored ventures.

Scott Kambak has planned a number of activities for our Junior High Students in February. I want to encourage out students to attend the annual fifties, sixties, seventies Valentine Dance on Friday, February 7th from 7:00 to 10:00 pm in the Parish Center. Only registered members of St. Juliana's Junior High Youth Ministry in costume will be admitted. Choose your style from the fifties (rock'n roll), sixties (hippies), or seventies (disco) eras! Admission is \$5 at the door. Refreshments will be served. Sounds like a fun evening!

On Wednesday, February 12th from 7:30 to 9:00 pm in the Seven Holy Founders room in the Parish Center Scott has arranged for a speaker from "BirthChoice," a diocesan-approved respect life organization, to present a program on *Personal Responsibility*. I hope parents will remind their teens to attend.

A program, long-standing among our parish ministries and in need of revitalization and additional membership is our *Welcoming and Belonging* committee. The present membership has directed this program for many years and needs younger members. Are you a natural host or hostess? Or just like meeting new people? How would you like to be part of the *Welcoming and Belonging* committee? This ministry is currently looking for 8-12 individuals to join the team. The time commitment would not be huge: 2-4 meetings a year; 2-4 activities a year. These will be divided among the entire group. Please take note of the *Adult Faith Formation* flyer in the bulletin this weekend. Mike McHenry has outlined a number of adult programs designed to help parishioners grow in their Catholic Faith. 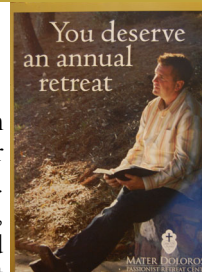

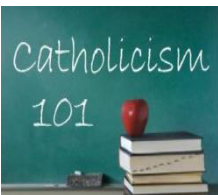

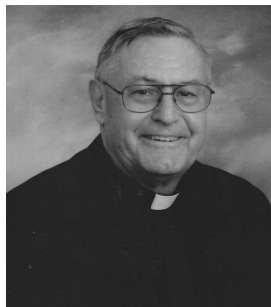

DIOCESE OF ORANGE FOR CHRIST FOREVER CAMPAIGN

Pledge Totals Surpass \$870,345 at St. Juliana Falconieri!

Our For Christ Forever Campaign Committee would like to thank all the families and individuals who have contributed so far and have made the diocesan campaign a great success. We have received **\$870,345** in pledges from 294 parish individuals and families. At this time, we are awaiting a response from over 1,100 of our parish families. Currently, we are at **64% of goal** from only 19% of our parish. Please keep in mind that since we have surpassed our 2013 PSA goal in cash, we will now receive 25% of all monies collected up to our campaign target of \$1,287,473. Our rebate will be used to pay down the Parish Center loan that currently stands at **\$800,037.92** and make some roof repairs to the Church and rectory.

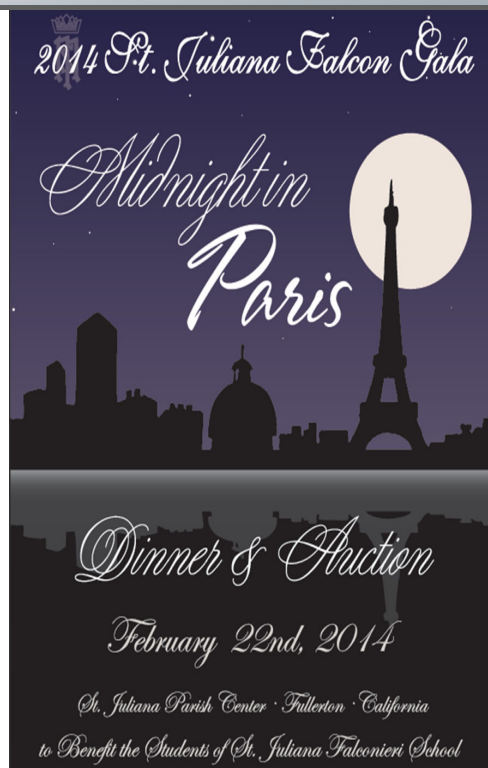
