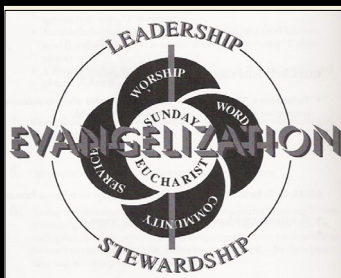

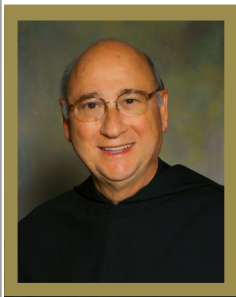

SUMMARY OF TODAY'S GOSPEL
from Matthew 3:13-17

This passage is about baptism and righteousness — being in a right relationship with God. Baptism and righteousness are related. Righteousness begins with our decision to seek relationship with God, and baptism marks that decision point. Both baptism and righteousness continue with our aggressively waiting for a second “baptism” that can only come from God.

RIGHTEOUSNESS RIPS THE SKY

“Jesus came from Galilee to John” The decision to make that journey was Jesus’ own. It’s important that we realize that.

There is, perhaps, left-over radioactivity from an early church explosion: There may have been controversy at first over whether John was the Messiah or Jesus was — after all, John came first; his ministry of baptism had a profound impact upon the Jewish culture of the time. In this text, however, Matthew intends to lay that to rest once and for all. Verb construction in the original Greek indicates that Jesus had decided, while in Galilee, to go and present himself to John. So he may have, early on in his adult life, presented himself to John for baptism; nevertheless, he himself decided to do this, in accordance with his own purposes, and thus, throughout the scene, Jesus is the one in charge.

This understanding is nailed down by John’s reported reaction: “I need to be baptized by you, and do you come to me?” In that statement, we are shown John’s clear understanding that Jesus and what he represents are superior to himself and what he represents. And Jesus’ response shows that he is indeed in charge of the situation: No, let us continue! It is “proper for us in this way to fulfill all righteousness.” Jesus will submit to John’s baptism, for it is his choice to do so — his prerogative, within his power. And after this fulfillment of righteousness, Jesus arises out of the waters of John’s baptism, and then the “heavens are opened” (other portrayals of this scene go so far as to say that the heavens are “torn apart”¹). Then the very Spirit of God descends upon Jesus, and the voice of God intones, “This is my Son, the Beloved, with whom I am well pleased.” *Excerpt taken from “Proclaim Sermons”, on-line Homily Notes*

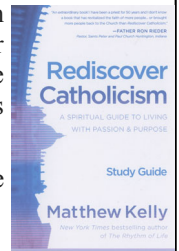


CALLED TO SERVE

The status of God’s beloved Son is not one he clings to. It is one he shares. All of us are called to be sons and daughters of God. In Jesus, we can all claim God’s favor. The second reading makes this clear. Here we read of the baptism of Cornelius and his household. Peter’s speech recalls the anointing of Jesus by the Holy Spirit and the great power that swept through Israel and onto the doorstep of the Gentile Cornelius. As for his household, so for us. There is an end to our work on earth, to our baptismal vocation and the honorable work we do. But there is no end to the saving life given to us through baptism. There is no end to the life of the children of God; there is no end to God’s compassion, which we know in Christ Jesus. There is no end to our status as chosen and beloved people of God. Because of Jesus’ life, death, and resurrection, we are forever among those on whom God’s favor rests.

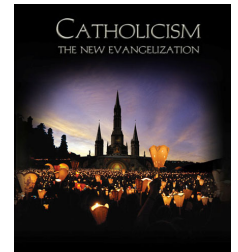

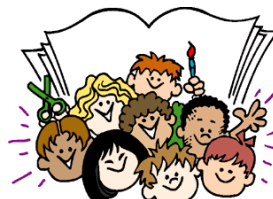

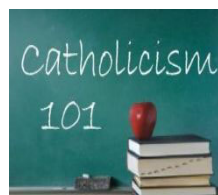

DIOCESE OF ORANGE FOR CHRIST FOREVER CAMPAIGN

Pledge Totals Surpass \$845,880 at St. Juliana Falconieri!

Our For Christ Forever Campaign Committee would like to thank all the families and individuals who have contributed so far and have made the diocesan campaign a great success. We have received **\$845,880** in pledges from 283 parish individuals and families. At this time, we are awaiting a response from over 1,100 of our parish families. Currently, we are at **62% of goal** from only 19% of our parish. Please keep in mind that since we have surpassed our 2013 PSA goal in cash, we will now receive 25% of all monies collected up to our campaign target of \$1,287,473. Our rebate will be used to pay down the Parish Center loan that currently stands at **\$816,744.68** and make some roof repairs to the Church and rectory.

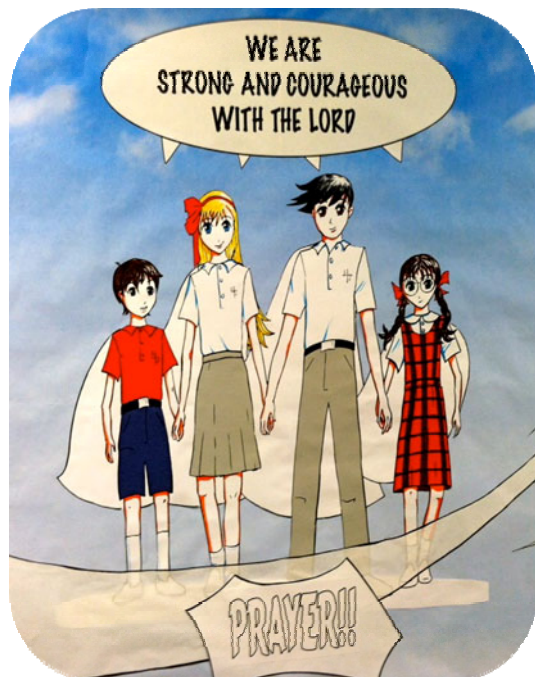

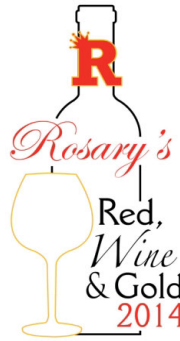

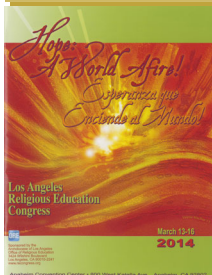
