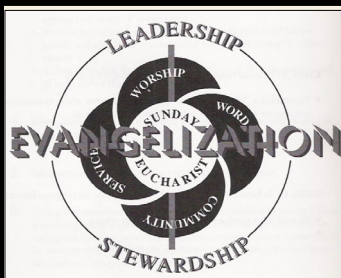

A NOTE FROM FR. MIKE



Back to “it takes a village” theme. It’s important to act in such a way as to want that act to be imitated by others. We end Mass with: “Go and Glorify the Lord by the way you live your life.” We want the younger generation to know the appropriate things to do and words to say because they see those generous acts and hear those gracious words from their elders. Do as I say and not as I do is bad direction.

In our village we have a SUPER GREAT way of celebrating life; in this note I will speak of the way we celebrate the entrance of one of our own into Eternal Life. If you want to know what people believe, listen to the way they pray. If you want to know what are important actions, watch what people do, again and again, such acts are called rituals.

November is the month in which we remember all those who have died. For the Christian at death, life is changed not ended. Death is a comma, never a period. Resurrection to new life is our sure and certain hope. With all of the prayers that we say and work of love and hospitality that we do, death is still very difficult. It takes time to heal the pain; it takes time to grieve the loss of one who was close to us. It also takes people to help us over the uncertain times, a bridge over grief and pain. A community who imitates Jesus will compassionately care for those who grieve. We come together as a community and celebrate the life that was and the people who are. We come together to divide the grief and multiply the joy.

Those who make all of this happen are the Bereavement Committee. This committee ministers with a whole village of the office staff, priests, deacons, choir, altar servers, and professional funeral directors to celebrate a soul going back to God.

The celebration of the passage from death to new life in our parish of St. Juliana is powerful. Not to single out any one funeral but to notice the care each funeral is given reminds me and us, that we Christians are an Easter people and ALLELUIA is our song. So is our song: *When The Saints Come Marching In*, played New Orleans jazz style with slide trombone and blaring trumpet.

To all who minister to families and the community at the time of a funeral, THANK YOU. You, the Bereavement Committee are wonderful Christians. To say that you are compassionate is to under-state the obvious. You, the Choir – from *Ave Maria* to *Soon And Very Soon*, music adds life to the liturgy and THANK YOU only begins to show gratitude. For those who prepare worship aids, who set up and take down tables and chairs and remove the trash – we at St. Juliana say:

“THANK YOU.” Truly you continue and you imitate the kindness of Joseph of Arimathea who provided a burial for Jesus and helped Mary on Good Friday.

Indeed, as we pray every soul to God, we glorify the Resurrected Lord by the way we care for those who are left behind. Don’t we all hope that the coming generation will imitate the good that they witness by this community? AND DO IT BETTER!

For all who have died – may God’s mighty arm reach out and bring them to Himself for all of eternity – we pray to the Lord. Shine your eternal light onto them oh, Lord. May the souls of all the faithful departed, especially on this All Souls Day from St. Juliana Parish, rest in peace. AMEN.

CATHOLICISM 101



November 1st is the Feast of All Saints, the day on which Catholics celebrate all the saints, known and unknown. It is a surprisingly old feast. It arose out of the Christian tradition of celebrating the martyrdom of saints on the anniversary of their martyrdom. Then Pope Gregory IV (827-844) extended the feast to the entire Church and ordered it to be celebrated on November 1.

The vigil or eve of the feast, October 31, is commonly known as All Hallows Eve, or Halloween. Despite concerns among some Christians (including some Catholics) in recent years about the "pagan origins" of Halloween, the vigil was celebrated from the beginning—long before Irish practices, stripped of their pagan origins (just as the Christmas tree was stripped of similar connotations), were incorporated into popular celebrations of the feast. So feast away this year as a remembrance of all those men and women who built our faith on solid ground. Your homework is to look up St. Maximillian Kolbe and find out what being a saint is all about!

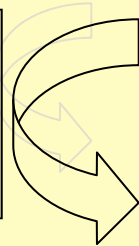

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITIONS

For those of Mexican heritage, November 2 means celebration of el Dia de Los Muertos, or “the Day of the Dead.” One of the most important days of the year for many, they join All Saints and All Souls together, visiting the graves of babies and children on All Saints, since they are santitos (little saints) or angelitos (little angels). Flowers, their favorite toys, favorite music, and so on, are taken to them. The following day, people spend time—some of them all day—at the cemetery with their loved ones who have died. From the ancient customs of the Indians, the families pray, talk with them, and take them their favorite food. It is a most solemn but joyful day. It is a day to celebrate Christ’s victory over death: “Death, where is your sting?” There is a mocking of death as people make skeletons, candy that represents death, and Pan de los Muertos (bread of the dead) and consume them in a kind of role reversal. One of the customs is to build an altarcito (little altar) where one places mementos and pictures of those who have died. There are also favorite foods, candles, statues or pictures of favorite saints, books, and Bibles. Some parishes have begun to build an altarcito where all parishioners can join in honoring the deceased. A remembrance book can be placed to write names in. The altarcito is traditionally left up for the month of November. —Rev. James Field, Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co
