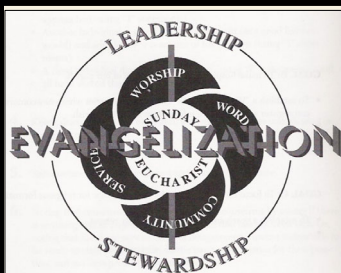

A NOTE FROM FR. MIKE



What sorts of days are coming? Black Friday, Cyber Monday – yikes! Run! Take cover! Stores and malls are all decorated for “the holidays”. And the music: “It’s Beginning to Look A Lot Like Christmas”, “Silver Bells”. Of course merchants are singing: “Oh, What a Friend We Have in Jesus.”

Here in the community called Church we are in the season of Advent. We simply put up and bless a wreath with four candles. Three purple candles and one pink candle, the best we do for decoration. As for songs: “On Jordan’s Bank”, “People, Look East”, and of course “O Come, O Come, Emmanuel” – especially during the final days when the “O” antiphons assist our prayerful watch for Jesus, the Savior.

“Advent” is a different word from “shop until you drop.” It can be used for the arrival of a new thing, something important, as in: “The advent of a new Apple product” or “the advent of the young consumer looking at new products.” In church we capitalize the word Advent giving it a religious meaning, referring to the period of four Sundays that announce and await the birth of Jesus, December 25. The first Sunday of Advent is the first day of the new Church year as January 1 is the first day of the new calendar year.

Remember that Jesus has already come. Jesus has already lived his life. Jesus has already proclaimed the Good News of our salvation. He has already suffered, died, and he has risen from the grave. We allow Jesus to come fresh into our lives and celebrate the way his birth changes our lives.

The season of Advent has an interesting vocabulary in its readings; daily Mass and Sunday celebrations. “Be watchful! Be alert! You do not know when the time will come.” Not for the next reduction in price of a purchase you want to make but in the manner in which you live your life. “They shall beat their swords into plowshares and their spears into pruning hooks.” He is the Prince of Peace. “The wolf shall be a guest of the lamb, and the leopard shall lie down with the kid; the calf and the young lion shall browse together, with a little child to guide them”. Something out of the ordinary is about to happen.

The characters of Advent are St. John The Baptist whom we admire if for no other reason than he knew his place. He announced the main act, warmed up the crowd, he was not the head-liner nor did he pretend to be. Mary, Joseph, Elizabeth, and Zechariah, all of them, very common people who were chosen by God to participate in the un-common acts of salvation history.

What sort of days are coming? Hectic ones! Days that demand that we carve out some time to reflect on what is meaningful and how to make the meaningful present in our lives. We do have a friend in Jesus. And more than a friend we have our savior.

Let us, during these days also reflect on gifts and gift giving. Perhaps the most important lesson I ever learned in Catholic education is the lesson I have never forgotten: “What is the most important gift that God has given His People?” was a question taught by a very favorite teacher of mine. Years later as I was teaching some students came and asked me that question. I told them, “Go back and tell Mr. Cotton who no doubt sent you to me: “The most important gift that God has given to his people is Jesus, who has let us in on the secret of who God is and what He is all about.”

What is the most important gift you will give or receive? Might I steer you toward your Church community? Please know of my gratitude if you would make an extra payment in helping us pay down our remaining balance of the Parish Center loan with the Diocese of Orange. Your past generosity has brought that balance to \$600,000. Quite an amazing accomplishment from such an amazing community and faith family! 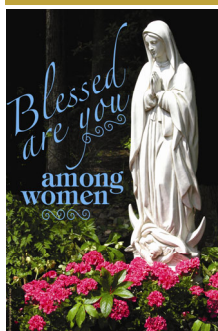


ADORATION TUESDAY, DECEMBER 2ND

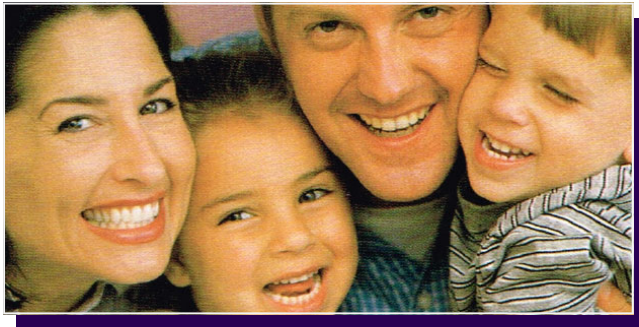
SPECIAL CHILDREN...NEED SPECIAL FAMILIES

Holy Family Services is with us this Sunday **November 30th** with information about the oldest, private, non-profit, faith-based adoption agency in Southern California. In the US today, there are 400,000 children in Foster Care, and of that number, 56,000 of the children are here in California. This shows the urgent need we are in to create homes for kids.

Holy Family Services Adoption and Foster Care is with us this weekend to recruit families to consider Foster care or being a Foster-adopt home for their children in need. As Catholics, we urge women to not have abortions - it is imperative that we offer a solution such as foster care and adoption.

Note: Holy Family Adoption and Foster Care is going on their 65th year of service.
