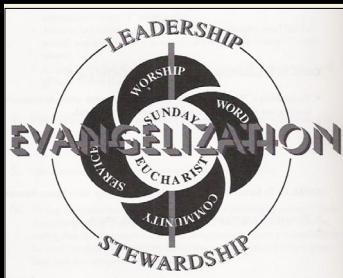

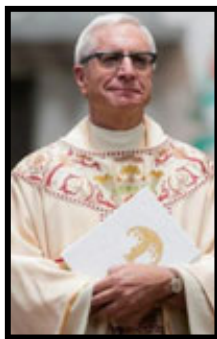

A NOTE FROM FR. MIKE



Stop! Wait a minute! What is going on? I've had enough! Can't take any more. I am doing strange, really strange things. Hauling a tree into the house. I just put up an artificial tree in my home. Decorations. Greeting cards. Shopping, spending money. People are coming over to eat. Gotta bake cookies for classrooms of students, offices of employees, and my volunteer group. Now look—a rose colored, pink, candle on the Advent wreath. Today the

priest may wear either a rose or violet colored vestment. What's all this happiness? What's all this joy?

The Sunday of the Third Week of Advent is called **Gaudete Sunday**. "*Gaudete in Domino semper: iterum dico, gaudete. Dominus enim prope est.*" Says St. Paul's letter to the Philippians 4:4-5. "Rejoice in the Lord always; again I say, rejoice. Indeed, the Lord is near."

Joy? Happiness? Considering all I have to do? Bah humbug! Joy, happiness, blah. Happy, he's one of the Seven Dwarfs, right. Joy, she works at the diner on Wednesday night! Right now, don't tell me joy or happy; I'm Grumpy! Aren't the two words the same – interchangeable.

Might be a tough call, no they aren't. Happiness is.... A warm dog, a singing bird (as long as it doesn't keep you awake), a bowl of pasta, new watch...stop me when I'm close. Happiness is the feeling given to us usually from outside of ourselves. We really can't control these gifts or uncontrolled forces.

Joy on the other hand is a much deeper river flowing from within. Real joy gives us nourishment that cookies or even diamonds cannot satiate. Are you really happy giving that gift that you know will be cheaper the day after it is opened – or obsolete the month before it was bought? We know the joy, the love, that sustains us when stuff fails. No matter what people or nature gives us, joy cannot be taken away. All is well within the soul of the joy-filled person.

A person who is in pain can be filled with joy but not necessarily happy.

I recall a seminary class on spirituality which I dreaded attending. It was offered in the fall session, it ended just at Christmas time. The assignment: "Which verse of any Christmas song is the most meaningful to you? Prepare to share it with the class." UGH! A classmate asked me which I was had chosen. "Easy for me!" I answered. "Fa, la, la, la, la, la, la, la, la!" Those silly lyrics do bring happiness. Try to sing them without at least a cynic's smile. More meaningful and joy-filled, soul enriching are "Silent Night" or "Il Est Ne, Le Divin Enfant." Disneyland's Christmas Small World might make you happy – the Candle-light Parade is joy.

Find out if it isn't the case that joy is caused by love.

Rejoice and be glad, God is present. He is also the present of this season. May your actions be a present expression of your love for God, others, and yourselves. Rejoice! Be Glad. Let's say it again and again.

~ MORE THAN DISCIPLES ~ REFLECTION ON READINGS

Each of today's four scriptural roles—disciple, prophet, apostle, herald—forms a facet of our life in Christ as we live it day by day. Isaiah tells us that a prophet is anointed, as we were anointed at our baptism in water and the Spirit, to bring glad tidings and to promote God's reign of healing, justice, and peace. An apostle, like Paul, is one who is "sent." Each of us, in his or her own way, is sent by Christ to be a voice of rejoicing, to encourage prophetic voices in the world, and to make sure that the work of the Spirit thrives. John the Baptist shows us the job of the herald, making the Lord's way straight, announcing the coming of the Light of the world.

Today we also hear from Mary, the model disciple. Her song, the Magnificat, shows us the world we must believe in and work for: one in which God is praised, where God's favor is bestowed on the humble, where the hungry are filled and the rich are sent away empty, a world that continues to know and rejoice in the mercy of God that lasts for all ages. *Copyright © J.
