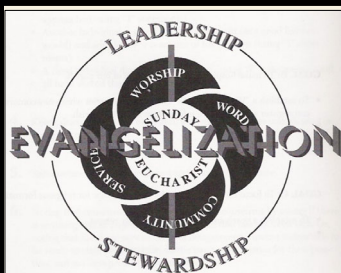

A NOTE FROM FR. MIKE



Perhaps you go to the **PARISH ADVENT PENANCE SERVICE ON WEDNESDAY, DECEMBER 10 AT 7PM** or you go to the Sacrament of Penance at another time...or not. There might be something you don't like about confession. The Sacrament of Penance, that's what it's called, is time when we realize that we have missed the mark, sinned, and return to God our Father. It's that time when we turn away from sin and move toward conversion. We do this by taking steps to change

wrong into right. When we confess our wrong, we admit that we need to change. We ask forgiveness and find pardon and peace. When we leave the confessional we are once again reconciled with God, neighbor, and ourselves.

How might we prepare ourselves for all of these acts? I suggest we review virtues. What is it that we need to do to be the best humans and Christians? This time, don't look so much at the Ten Commandments as you examine the choices you have made, the acts you have done. Examine your life with the virtues as the goal to "the best life."

So much of what we do in church is up-lifting. Then there is that little dark room. It is in this room that we expose our dark selves to a man wearing usually dark colors. Sometimes that darkness is really big and horribly dark, mortal sin. Other times it's only a shade of grey and barely wrong. And some believe that sin has gone the way of black vestments.

This time, pause. Take some time. Examine your life against the virtue of mercy. It is a popular word these days. Really, it's been a popular word since Vatican II. Define it this way: mercy, the willingness to enter into the chaos of others. The image of the Good Samaritan entering into the chaos of that person wounded but left alone. Is there someone who is hurting but you just walk past, perhaps even in ridicule?

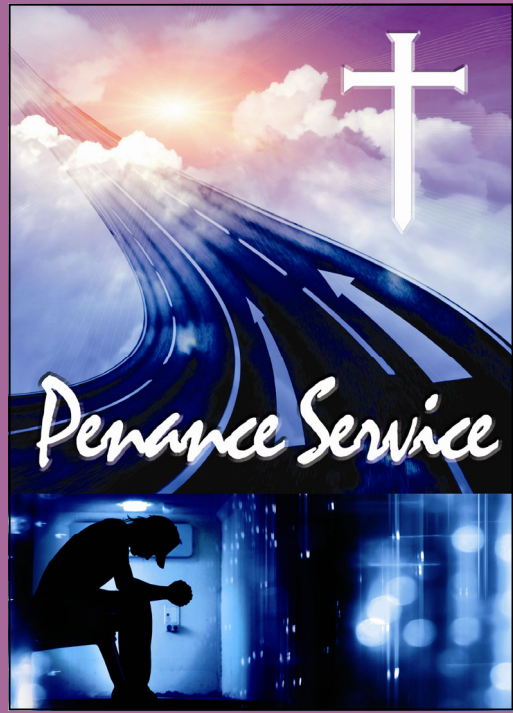
Mercy is the act of God entering into the chaos of human existence by the Incarnation. Mercy is the experience we have of God. God entered into the chaos of man and rescued us by Noah, Abraham, Moses, and Jesus is full of mercy. When we are at our best, we too are merciful. Christians have always aimed at imitating their Christ. Our actions unite us with Christ and define us no longer as only humans but also divinized humanity, that is, as Christians.

Mercy is the act of God rescuing us. Shouldn't we rescue others?

Advent is the season of preparation and waiting. It's the theme of the readings, songs, and candles on the Advent wreath. Preparation and waiting – for the kids to come home from and return to school. When you are buying a present ask: what will really help that person this time? That question has a twin: how can I enter into the life of another?

How have you entered into the life of another and really helped that person along? Give thanks, you do it more often than not. When have I not been merciful, when have I not been an experience of Christ for another? The Christ child himself needed shelter at his birth. When did I fail in mercy? Ask pardon and try to do better. With God's grace you will.

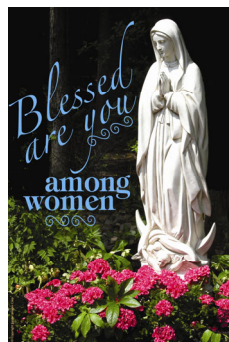

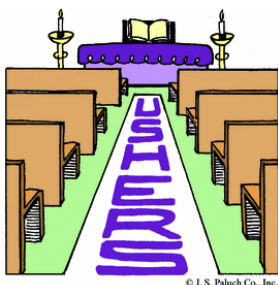

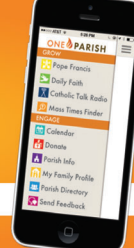
