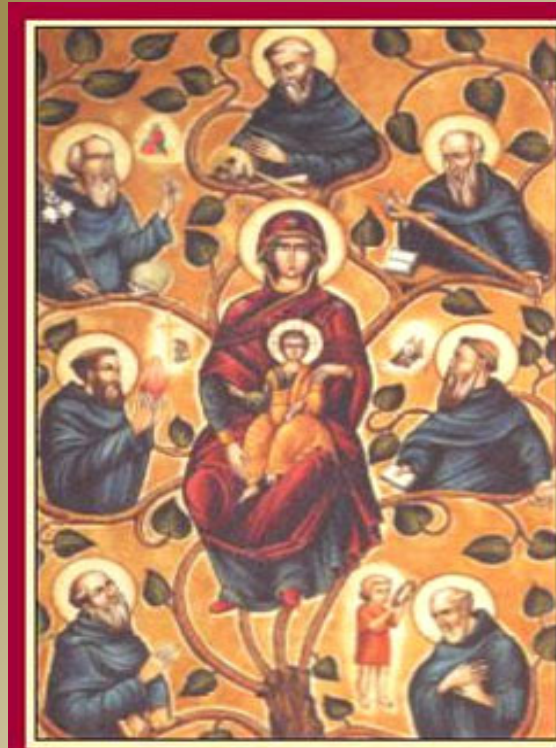

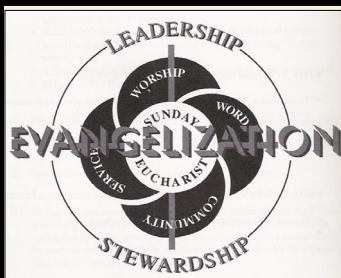

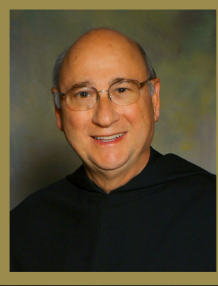

Happy *Seven Holy Founders* weekend! Servites on all continents are celebrating this annual observance with community prayer and festive social gatherings. SoCal Servites will be together and enjoy companionship as did our *Seven Holy Founders* in their day. I am sure all of St. Juliana parishioners will join us in prayer and best wishes.

The story of the Servite Order begins in thirteenth century Florence when seven cloth merchants exchanged wealth and political opportunity for a life of prayer and poverty. These men are known as the *Seven Holy Founders of the Servite Order*.

The oldest history of the Order is the *Legenda de origine Ordinis Fratrum Servorum*, which was edited in its final form about the year 1318 and draws most probably from earlier accounts.

The *Legenda* is the story of the survival of a small religious community. During the first sixty years of their existence, they were restricted in their activities, threatened with absorption into other religious Orders, even with outright suppression. But survive they did. In the year 1304, the Holy See finally recognized the Servants of Mary as a new religious Order in the Church alongside of the *Augustinians, Carmelites, Franciscans, and Dominicans*. The Orders are collectively known as *Mendicant Orders*. Mendicant Orders in the thirteenth century were defined as those religious who begged for alms and who renounced by vow all possessions, common or individual.

The seven men who were to become the founders of the Order were originally wool merchants. And the middle years of thirteenth century Florence was a very good time to be a merchant. The *Legenda* records that some of these seven merchants were married, others were single or widowed. It asserts that their shared interests through the penitential and Marian movements helped to build up in them strong ties of friendship, a desire to break their ties with the world and to live together as a community, supporting one another in word and deed. They provided for their families and then distributing the remainder to the poor and to the Church. They decided to leave absolutely nothing for themselves.

Devotion to the Virgin Mary extended back before the Servants of Mary came together to live a community life. As well as being members of a penitential group, they had also dedicated their lives to Mary. In medieval times, Christians looked to Mary as a mediator on their behalf making up for their own shortcomings before God. And they often showed their gratitude to her for this intercession by becoming her "servant." As servants they took care of churches and altars dedicated to her, venerated her statues, gave charitable assistance to the sick and poor who were housed in hospitals dedicated to her and often worked in them too.

On January 15, 1888 Pope Leo XIII canonized the *Seven Holy Founders*.

There is still time to donate blood this Sunday. The Semi-annual blood drive organized by the Knights of Columbus will contin-

ue to 1 pm this Sunday in front of the Parish Center. The Blood Center at UC Irvine will conduct the blood drive. It is common knowledge that 80% of us will need blood at some time during our lives. Less than 4% of the Southern California population donates blood.

### MORE ABOUT THE SEVEN HOLY FOUNDERS

#### Feast of the Seven Holy Founders (February 17th)

Bonfilius, Bonajuncta, Manettus, Amadeus, Hugh, Sostene, and Alexis are the names with which were canonized the seven men who, around the middle of the thirteenth century, founded the Order of Friar Servants of Saint Mary in Florence. The Church and the Order venerate them with the title of the **Seven Holy Founders**. They were lay men and merchants; some were married, others single or widowed.

They were animated by a strong desire for Christian perfection and belonged to the Greater Society of Our Lady. As members of this Society they served God and Our Lady by practicing works of charity and penance. Their desire to serve God eventually led them to leave their homes and businesses and to form a community outside the city walls. About the year 1245 they moved to Monte Senario, about twelve miles from Florence, where they built a small church and dwelling. Soon other men, desirous of prayer and solitude, joined them. Because of the holiness of their lives, the seriousness of their religious commitment, and the esteem of the people, they obtained first the approval of the bishop of Florence Ardingo, and then that of the Apostolic See. From Monte Senario the Seven and their followers returned to Florence to engage in apostolic work, and at Cafaggio they built a church, the first nucleus of the present basilica of Santissima Annunziata.

Historical data about the Seven Holy Founders are not numerous; even their names, except for Bonfilius and Alexis, are uncertain. But the spiritual characteristics of their life are certain, as told in the *Legenda de origine Ordinis*, the oldest account of the work of the Seven Saints, transmitted by an uninterrupted tradition. These characteristics are an ardent love of God and Our Lady, humility, a spirit of service, a disposition to harmony and pardon, and an active desire to promote peace.

The Seven Holy Founders were canonized as a group by Pope Leo XIII in 1888. Their mortal remains are venerated in the Basilica of Monte Senario.

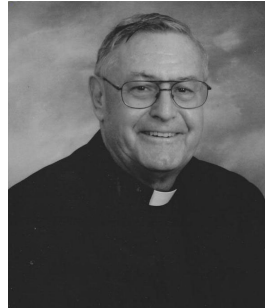

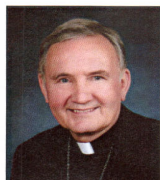
