

# FROM THE PASTOR



Last weekend was certainly a busy time for our parish. The men's retreat was in full vigor at Sierra Madre. Father Tom Allender, S.J. talked at all the Masses encouraging parishioners to attend the pre-Lenten mission. The School Gala and Auction Dinner Dance brought folks from near and far to celebrate the scholastic achievements of the parish school and financial endorsement of future technology. It was an energetic two days

and so many committee members, volunteers and participants gave a titanic measure of time, talent, and treasure to the successful outcome. Thank you!

This will be the final weekend for you to return your used Palm from last Palm Sunday to be burnt for ashes on Ash Wednesday. Please dispose of it by simply adding it to compost or burying it in your garden, thus returning it to the earthly elements. My gratitude to all who responded to the directive! We accumulated over six sizeable bags of used palms.

Wednesday is Ash Wednesday and the start of our liturgical season of fasting, prayer, and almsgiving. This church season seems to be viewed by some Catholics with a certain measure of indifference. Fasting, almsgiving, and prayer practiced intentionally is often viewed as "old-fashioned" or even worse *ar*-*chaic* and inconsequential. I believe St. Juliana parishioners take Lent seriously and mean to observe Lent in union with the entire Church. There will be ample opportunities to honor Lent by participating in daily Mass, the Stations of the Cross, Small Christian Community gatherings, the Faith Formation programs, Confession, fasting at home and/or at work, contributing alms to the poor, supporting the Holy Land collection on Good Friday for the care of Christian sites and Christian communities in unwelcomed regions of the Middle East.

Much of our world lives in chaos and bereft of basic necessities. I read a short anecdote about an incident that Father James Martin, S.J. experienced while living in Kenya. One Christmas he helped throw a party for the refugees he served. Each person in attendance received three green, plastic cups. A few weeks later, Father Martin was visiting one of the refugees who had attended the party. She lived in an unlit shack. When he entered he noticed she had set the cups on a small, wooden table and given them pride of place. "Brother Jim, I love my cups," she told him. "For me a plastic cup was something you might throw away," Father Martin said. "But her words have stuck with me". Witnessing the gratitude felt by those who had very few possessions reminded Father Martin to be more grateful for the many blessings in his own life.

The daily Scripture readings during Lent are filled with words and images to spur us on to think and live in the embrace of God's love and grace. We are not alone, says St. Paul in the second reading on Ash Wednesday. "*Now is the day of salvation.*" Some days we live in the past and future. During Lent let's try to live in the present. If you're chopping celery, then chop away! If you are talking or texting (not while driving) then pay attention. Listen! See God in every *now*.

Moses in the Book of Deuteronomy tells the people: "Choose

*Life!*" Jesus adds: *"Deny yourself and take up your cross daily and follow me.*" That requires sacrifice. Can we bear a cross during Lent without grumbling?

If the book, *"Rediscovering Catholicism"* you received at Christmas is still on your coffee table or book shelf, take it in hand and make it your Lenten reading. Open yourself up to the possibility that a single sentence or a random phrase might prompt you to be a stronger and more intentional Catholic.

Members of the Young Ladies Institute (YLI) will be present at the 11 am Mass this Sunday as they participate in the Annual District Conference. Representatives from San Diego, Long Beach, Irvine, Pomona and Fullerton will join together for lunch in the Parish Center and at that time officers will present a check to the Diocese of Orange for the education of seminarians.

The weather this winter has been unpredictable. We have had dry, unseasonably warm days, and a drought. Some days we need the heat on in the church and other days the airconditioning. I have repeatedly asked that the doors of the church be kept closed especially after Mass is finished and everyone has exited the church. Here is where I need your help. Please close any door that you find open when you are in or around the church. If you stay late to pray, and find a church door open, please close it behind you. This applies to morning Masses as well. If the church is too warm we will open windows or use the air-conditioner. If the church is too cold, we will close the windows and turn on the heat. So please help me in this regard. I will be very grateful.

Last weekend I intimated that we help provide for our Servite Seminarians from Indonesia presently studying English at De-Paul University in Chicago and living at Our Lady of Sorrows Servite monastery. In the fall they will continue their studies in theology leading to Ordination. I suggested that perhaps we could begin a scholarship fund to help pay for their education. My first request was made to the Knights of Columbus who have historically assisted in the education of priests. If you feel called to help in this regard, I would be very grateful since these young men rely on the American Servites for their education, room and board. Let me know.

In his book *Wellsprings* Father Anthony de Mello wrote a reflection that impressed me when I read it. I would like to share it with you. "I have arrived at where I am today through countless wasted hours of boredom, useless conversation, pastimes, incapacitating sickness or sufferings I was fool enough to bring upon myself; through energy I squandered on unproductive planning, stillborn projects and fruitless undertaking. I contemplate the myriad opportunities I threw away, the talents I neglected, the challenges I dared not face, the promises that never were kept. I contemplate this not with sadness, not with guilt, but with patient understanding, for I wish to love life as much in its failure as in its success. I look at the Savior on the cross and realize that somewhere, somehow, all of it has meaning, all of it is redeemed and made beautiful and resurrected."

# FAST & ABSTINENCE INFORMATION

Catholics who are over the age of 18 and under the age of 60 are required to fast on Ash Wednesday, which means that they can eat only one complete meal and two smaller ones during the day, with no food in between. Catholics who are over the age of 14 are required to refrain from eating any meat, or any food made with meat, on a day of fast and abstinence.

# LENT - PRAYER, FASTING AND ALMSGIVING


