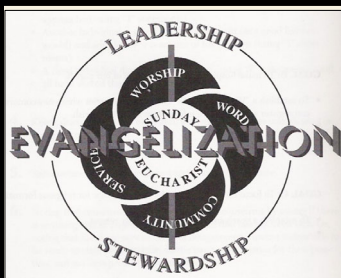

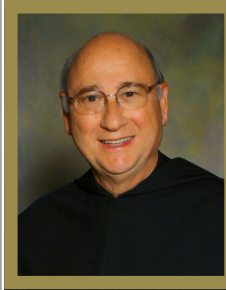

Catholic Schools Week celebrated throughout the United States this past week had a twofold objective: to promote Catholic Education and school pride along with showcasing the technological strength and teaching skills of committed Catholic teachers whose salary is often lower than their counterparts. My special thanks to the school community for the celebration at the 9am Mass and for host-

ing the open house and pancake breakfast. We also owe a debt of gratitude to our *Knights of Columbus* for cooking the breakfast. It was a morning filled with excitement, good food, and friendliness. There was a delightful mix of school families and parishioners. Let us keep that “*Spirit*” alive as we prepare now for the school **Falcon Gala-2014** on February 22nd in the Parish Center.

Last Sunday’s bulletin included an insert with our Faith Formation program for 2014. I would like to single out the pre-Lenten Parish Mission which will take place on February 24, 25, 26, 2014 in church. The success of this mission will depend on the cooperation of all of our parishioners and reserving the dates on personal calendars as soon as possible. **Ash Wednesday** begins the Lenten season of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving the following week on March 5, 2014.

Lent seems a long way off. However, it is not too soon to be reminded of why we celebrate this Liturgical season as part of our Church discipline. Not everyone who receives the blessed ashes will be moved to live a deeper and more faithful Catholic life. There is a certain cultural reality that beckons even the least faithful churchgoer to come to Mass or at least be present when the ashes are distributed on Ash Wednesday.

In the early church, when Lent was a time for the reconciliation of public penitents, the penitents would come to the church at the beginning of Lent; that is, on Ash Wednesday. They would wear a penitential garment, suggesting sackcloth, and be sprinkled with ashes. Then they would be ritually expelled from the assembly to do their penance for forty days, returning to the church on Holy Thursday, when they would be readmitted to the sacraments.

With time, the expulsion of penitents disappeared, but the ashes remained and became a call to penance of all the faithful. In the Scriptures, sackcloth and ashes are the signs of penance.

The practice of using ashes from the palms of the previous year’s Palm Sunday is a relatively new element of the liturgy, first appearing in the twelfth century. It adds another layer of meaning to this rich rite, reminding us of where we are headed--to the glory of Easter.

Beginning this week you will find a portable fire pit in the back of church. You may bring your old palm you received on Palm Sunday last year if you still have it. I always place a strand of palm on the crucifix in my bedroom. As you can imagine it is

dry and brittle. By placing your palm in the fire pit we will have palms to be burned and used on Ash Wednesday. The fire pit will be placed near the parking lot door and clearly marked.

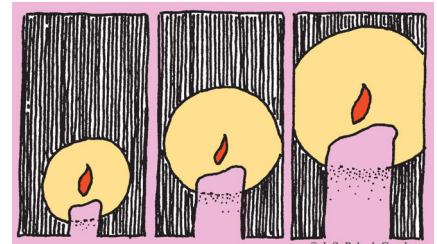
This weekend we celebrated the ***Feast of the Presentation of the Lord***. This feast is rooted in everyday life. In faithful observance of the Law of Moses, Mary and Joseph present Jesus in the Temple to consecrate him to the Lord. There they met the righteous Simeon, and the prophet Anna, for whom the Temple worship was part of everyday life. When the ceremony of presentation was completed, Mary and Joseph and Jesus returned home and created a family life. The Feast of the Presentation is also called ***Candlemas Day***. According to St. Luke’s account of the Gospel, Simeon recognized Jesus as the Messiah in the Temple and declared him “a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and glory for your people Israel.” This led to the tradition of blessing candles and became known as “Candlemas”. The blessed candles you receive this weekend may be lit on special occasions at home as a reminder that we, too, are called to “lights to the world.”

As I wrote last week, a program, long-standing among our parish ministries and in need of revitalization and additional membership is our ***Welcoming and Belonging*** committee. The present membership has directed this program for many years and needs younger members to come forth and assume a leadership role. The committee is looking for 8-12 individuals to join the team. The time commitment would not be huge: 2-4 meetings a year; 2-4 activities a year. These will be divided among the entire group. 

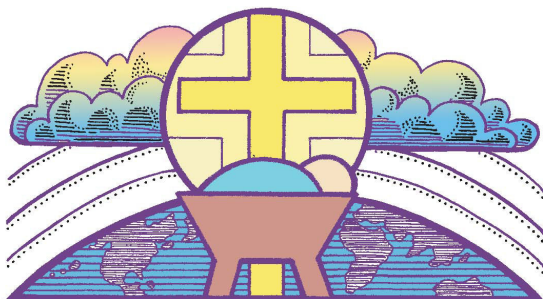

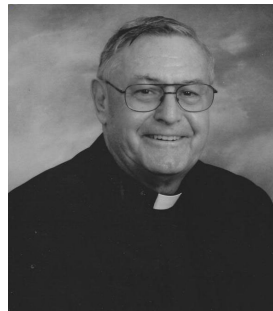

DIOCESE OF ORANGE FOR CHRIST FOREVER CAMPAIGN

Pledge Totals Surpass \$870,345 at St. Juliana Falconieri!

Our For Christ Forever Campaign Committee would like to thank all the families and individuals who have contributed so far and have made the diocesan campaign a great success. We have received **\$870,345** in pledges from 294 parish individuals and families. At this time, we are awaiting a response from over 1,100 of our parish families. Currently, we are at **64% of goal** from only 19% of our parish. Please keep in mind that since we have surpassed our 2013 PSA goal in cash, we will now receive 25% of all monies collected up to our campaign target of \$1,287,473. Our rebate will be used to pay down the Parish Center loan that currently stands at **\$800,037.92** and make some roof repairs to the Church and rectory.

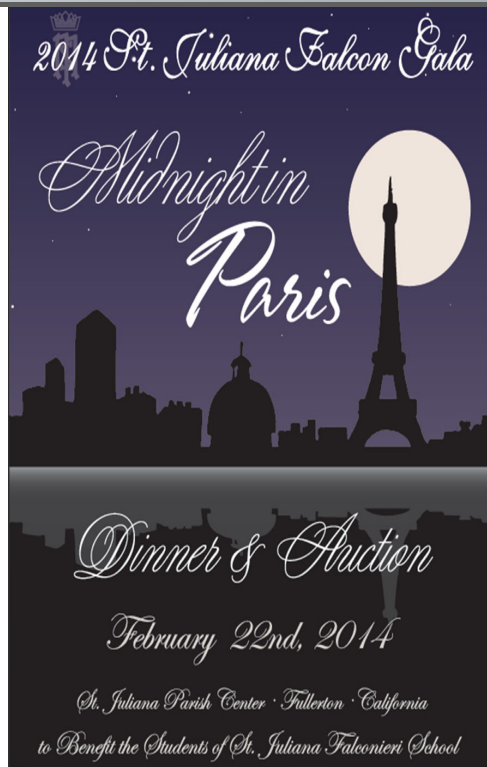
