

~ From the Pastor ~ March 16, 2014



The *Get On The Bus* presentation was well received by St. Juliana Parishioners last Sunday. I am grateful to all who stayed for the video production highlighting the various components of this program. My thanks to Pat Huber from GOTB and parish representatives, Barbara and Bob Dietterle for setting up the program! It was certainly heart wrenching. I could hear sniffles from nearby viewers and some wiping tears from

their eyes. If you haven't purchased your Dinner/Dance/Auction ticket, there is still time. This fundraiser is in conjunction with First Congregational Church of Fullerton who for years was the sole sponsor of GOTB. Three years ago, at the invitation of First Congregational Church, St. Juliana became a co-sponsor and provided the much needed space to expand the Benefit Dinner and Auction.

As you have heard and seen last week at church and in the bulletin *Get On The Bus* brings children and their guardians/caretakers from throughout California to visit their mothers (on Mother's Day) and fathers (on Father's Day) in prison. The money raised helps to provide transportation, travel, accessories, food, etc., for the children and their parents. Volunteers for the dinner are needed as well as donations of gift cards from restaurants, movie theaters, stores, sport shops to be used as items for the auction. These gifts along with the purchase of tickets can be handled by the parish office staff.

The *Lenten Fish Fry* dinners are in full force. The attendance the last few Fridays has been very encouraging to the school parents and volunteers who have devoted weeks of preparation and hours of cooking, serving, and cleaning-up to this fundraiser for our school. We are proud of the school community and recruits who believe that the sacrifices they are making will in the end benefit all the children of St. Juliana parish.

This Tuesday, March 18th is the last guided study evening on "*Rediscovering Catholicism*." Curtis Wesseln, Barbara Dietterle and Mike McHenry have co-directed this Lenten series in the Parish Center, St. Alexis Room. This final session will be at 7:30 p.m. You are welcome to attend even if you were unable to participate earlier. Bring your book with you.

During Lent we attempt to intensify our acts of charity and our fasting. Prayer is the third pillar of Lent. We may not be able to excel in all three pillars but we try our best. It is helpful to have some planned incentives. Daily Mass, Stations of the Cross, Rosary and Benediction, Adoration are all available for those who are serious about the Lenten discipline. The daily Mass readings contain a wealth of spiritual nourishment.

On Monday mornings during Lent following the 8 a.m. Mass, Mike McHenry, our director of Faith Formation, leads a study of the Lenten Scriptures. The program consists of time to read, pray, share and journal our way through Lent in the Seven Holy Founders Room. Much of this information is in the body of the bulletin but it is my intention to highlight it for you and hope that you will attend.

I hope you are using your *Operation Rice Bowl* banks. This program is worldwide and most parishes here in the Diocese of Orange participate. One heartfelt story is told about a family in Malawi, Africa. Timothy Machicka, his wife, and five children live in this country in southeastern Africa. More than half of the people in Malawi live on less than one dollar per day. Timothy's family was no exception. He struggled to grow potatoes and corn on his small plot of land, and did whatever odd jobs he would find to earn money. Still, often Timothy's family only had one meal per day. Then Timothy joined an agriculture program run by *Catholic Relief Services* (CRS). Timothy learned that chili peppers can grow without much water and will sell well at the market. Timothy's chili harvest was very successful, and he is proud to give his family what he couldn't provide before: three meals a day, and clothes and blankets for the children.

The attendance at the Stations of the Cross on Friday evenings at 6 p.m. has been rather sparse. I encourage you to participate. Perhaps you can combine a visit to the weekly Friday Fish Fry and the Stations of the Cross. This Lenten devotion has a long history in the church, obviously dating back to the *Via Dolorosa* walked by Our Lord.

My prayers and those of the entire St. Juliana parish community are with the Rosary High School students injured in the stage collapse at Servite High School on March 8th. While this accident certainly startled family and friends as well as both school communities, we are grateful that most injuries were not life-threatening. Nevertheless, this experience was certainly traumatic for the girls and not to be minimized. Word of the accident traveled across the country. I am sure this mishap will be corrected and future events on stage will be successful.

In a recent edition of the Orange County Register an article caught my eye entitled: "Stop Yelling!" The staff writer, Roger Bloom suggests, "Five Ways to Stop Yelling at your Child. 1) Be self-aware and have a plan. For example, take deep breaths or count backward from 100. Recognize when you are getting angry, employ your coping mechanism and make a conscious decision to behave in a different way; 2) Take a timeout. Go to another room for a few minutes to calm down. When you return, and are calm, talk about the situation or dispense consequences matter-of-factly: 3) Find a different way to react. Think about the times you have yelled, and then try to construct alternative scenarios for how you might have handled the situation; 4) Talk with your child afterward. Explain why you got angry, apologize for yelling, and strategize with the child about how you both could have handled the situation better; 5) Think back on times you were able to manage your anger and how you felt about that. Next time you are angry, think about how you want to look back on your behavior or imagine telling a respected friend how you handled the situation.

The philosopher David Hume wrote: "He is happy whose circumstances suit his temper, but he is more excellent who can suit his temper to any circumstance."




