

~ FROM THE PASTOR ~



The annual *Pastoral Services Appeal* (PSA) has begun. If you remembered to take your envelope from Church last week you are well aware that this time honored Diocesan campaign has begun. The theme: *Proud to be Catholic* now includes a tagline *"Sent to Serve."*

I fully realize that there are many parishioners who will not support the PSA campaign or the on-going *For Christ*

Forever effort to raise funds for among other things, the renovation of Christ Cathedral and the adjacent campus. Reasons for their decision are many and varied. Appeals, printed literature, statistics and demographics, along with a vision for the future of the Church of Orange, seem to be of little help in motivating a percentage of parishioners who do not respond to appeals no matter how laudable or necessary. Of course it is important to factor in those who are genuinely unable to allocate money for campaigns due to a loss of employment or other serious financial limitations. In most cases this group is small in comparison to those who refuse to participate or simply disregard the importance of financial stewardship.

It is a fact of parish life that those parishioners who then have to contribute extra in order to meet our goal(s) experience duress and in some cases donor fatigue. When these courageous and large-hearted folks reflect on our local Church as a whole, including the 62 parishes and centers, they have a sense of pride in being part of something larger than themselves or their own parish. This realization helps motivate them to be sacrificial.

The Pastoral Services Appeal is the main source of support for selected programs and services which serve parishes, the wider community and the local Church of Orange. Parishes receive 45% of the total PSA campaign funds as a rebate to support local parish stated projects. Certainly paying down our debt is a priority at this time. Other stated objectives are *Catholic Education, Faith Formation, Outreach Ministries, Clergy Formation and Support, and Parish and Diocesan Development through the Orange Catholic Foundation.*

The total goal of the 2014 PSA for the Diocese of Orange is \$6,100,000. St. Juliana's goal is \$250,000. A DVD will be played at Mass and both Father Luke and I will comment briefly on the parish participation in the 2014 PSA and our stated goals.

The three pillars of Lent are *Fasting, Almsgiving and Prayer.* These traditional practices are meant to free us for a time to be open to the grace of God. Everyday cares, distractions, and worries about what we are to eat or drink or wear are put aside to leave room for spiritual realities: love of neighbor, forgiveness, feeding the poor, sacrifice, hope, vision, fidelity, compassion, virtue, honesty, forbearance, courage and the like. We do not have to watch every newscast or read the paper from back to front or waste time doing unnecessary running around. The practice of quiet time, aloneness, and stillness help to calm us and open us to the presence of God. This is the great contribution of the church's liturgical cycle: a yearly reminder that something important is about to happen!

There is a story of a man who prayed earnestly one morning for grace to overcome his besetting sin of *impatience*. A little later he missed a train by half a minute and spent an hour stamping

up and down the station platform in furious vexation. Five minutes before the next train came in he suddenly realized that here had been the answer to his prayer. He had been given an hour to *practice* the virtue of *patience*; he missed the opportunity and wasted the hour.

At the recent meeting of the *Fullerton Interfaith Ministerial Association* (FIMA) the members present at the meeting joyfully and wholeheartedly endorsed the *Second Annual Interfaith Religious Faire* to be held here at St. Juliana on Sunday, September 14th from 1 to 4 pm. Last year's *Faire* was so successful that everyone agreed to plan a repeat presentation of the basic tenets of various Faiths, Christian and Non-Christian. More information will follow at a later date.

The Jewish World Watch organization in Orange County is sponsoring "2014 Walk To End Genocide" on Sunday, April 6, 2014. The "Walk" is designed to mobilize local communities to partner with the people of Sudan and Congo on projects including: Little Ripples: providing pre-school education with a focus on Darfuri culture and values to a refugee population recovering from trauma; Animal Husbandry Training: empowering women through entrepreneurial initiatives and economic development; Solar Cooker Project: eliminating the need for young girls to leave the safety of the Darfuri refugee camps to forage for scarce firewood; Sons of Congo: offering men of Congo a chance to escape a culture of violence through lessons in respectful treatment of women. The Newman Club pancake breakfast will also take place in the Parish Center. Once again the Knights of Columbus will assist with the breakfast.

Dear St. Juliana Parishioners:

One of the most exceptional parts of belonging to St. Juliana Falconieri is the feeling of belonging: we are part of something much greater than any one person. Our Church connects us all – as neighbors and friends, as a community, as children of God and followers of Christ. We are heartened by all the good work we see accomplished through our parishioners' dedication of their gifts of time, talent, and treasure. From faith formation, to outreach in the community, to social and community activities, to our children and young adults, our parish is truly alive in the Spirit.

Your continuous generosity amazes us.

- •In 2011, 458 parishioners participated in the PSA and raised \$233,034.50.
- •In 2012, 433 parishioners participated in the PSA and raised \$192,481.00.
- •In 2013, 320 parishioners participated in the most recent *For Christ Forever* Campaign and raised nearly \$900,000.
- •We would truly like to thank all of you who participated in the past for making our various campaigns so successful.

For 2014, our Pastoral Services Appeal (PSA) diocesan assessment is \$108,000. Our parish goal is to receive at least 500 gifts and raise \$250,000. St. Juliana will receive 100% of all monies received over \$108,000. We are confident that together we can reach our goal. Think how much of an impact these funds can make, not only in our parish, but also in our greater Catholic community as the Diocese of Orange as well. This year 45% of all diocesan PSA campaign funds will be returned to the parishes. The balance of the proceeds will be used for Catholic Education and Faith Formation (including Grants for Lay Ministry Formation and LMU Extension, Catholic Schools Tuition Assistance, and Parish Stewardship Education); Outreach Ministries (including Catholic Charities of Orange County, Catholic Deaf Community, and Catholic Restorative Justice and Detention Ministry); Clergy Formation and Support (including Diaconate Formation and Support, Seminarian Education, Priest Continuing Education, and Vocations); and Orange Catholic Foundation (Parish and Diocesan Development).

We have included a pledge envelope for your consideration and return, detailing the various payment options and guidelines to help you determine what your gift will be. It is important that you prayerfully discern and listen to your heart when making your decision for your pledge. Your response to God's generosity is of great respect and admiration to us as your Pastor and Parochial Vicar, and we hope that we can count on your participation this year. We are inviting you to join our parish family in making your pledge on our Commitment weekend this month. Your continued support is a great encouragement to us in our ministry here at Saint Juliana as we continue our work of Christ. You and your family remain in our prayers.


