



There was no shortage of recycled blessed Palms from Palm Sunday 2013. Large bags of the dried-up Palms provided a copious trove of ashes for use on Ash Wednesday. I am sure you are relieved to know that you can recycle your blessed Palm and not feel like you are desecrating a holy object. Thank you for bringing the Palm. No more Palms, please!

During Lent, there are several significant environment changes you will note in the church. The color of our altar linens and banners is purple, the Holy Water fonts are emptied, in preparation of the blessing of the water at the Easter Vigil, and the crucifix is covered. Lent is meant to be a time of penance and deprivation. Covering the crucifix and allowing for little or no adornment of the church helps us to shift our focus and spend the next few weeks preparing for the coming passion and death of Our Lord. The Easter Vigil Mass marks the end of Lent and celebrates the glorious resurrection of Our Lord, at which time the church is once more decorated in spectacular fashion and the crucifix is once again revealed as a visual focal point of our altar.

For the next few weeks you will hear about the *St. Patrick's Day Dinner* Dance sponsored by our Knights of Columbus on March 15th, the *Get-on the Bus Dinner and Auction* on March 29th, and the *Magic Show* on April 5th. You will have the opportunity to buy tickets for these events after all the Masses.

A few weeks ago I wrote about our Indonesian Servite seminarians studying English and preparing to resume their theological studies in Chicago in preparation for final vows and ordination to the priesthood. I had hoped to establish an education fund for these students. I realize now that with all the fundraisers going on in the parish, along with the Diocese of Orange Capital Campaign, this may not be a good time to ask for added donations. I encourage you to keep these students in your prayers.

The badly needed rain recently has done some good to alleviate the on-going drought. Flooding and mud slides have caused havoc in burnt areas. Los Angeles County experienced an overflow of rain water along waterways typically dry.

The city of Fullerton, as far as I know, has not suffered any ill effects from the storms. The flat roof on our aging Church building could not handle the downpours and consequently we have water damage in the sacristy and in several areas of the interior ceiling of the nave of the church. Repairs have been made in the past but have not held up. We will now have another round of mending. I am not sure if our insurance will cover the damage, since it is not catastrophic. This comes at a time when we have a deficit in our operational costs.

Last Sunday you received an *Operation Rice Bowl Bank* to be used during Lent for the support of Catholic Relief Services. Almsgiving is one of the three *Pillars* of the Lenten discipline: *Prayer, Fasting, and Almsgiving*. CRS is the official international humanitarian agency of the Catholic community in the United States. The use of the Rice Bowl can be an occasion to involve the children and all family members. You may even want to bring the Rice Bowl to the workplace if permitted, to encourage fellow workers to help out.

I read an article recently in *Christopher News* about Father Paul Lostritto, O.F.M., who tries to make meals at the holidays special at the St. Francis Breadline in New Your City by adding a piece of cake or a new type of juice to the hundreds of bags handed out exactly at 7am each morning, seven days a week. The breadline began in 1930 to help during the Great Depression. Today, volunteers hand out plastic bags containing sandwiches to the dozens of people in need of a meal.

For some of the volunteers, the experience sparks an interest in becoming more involved with the parish itself. For instance, some breadline volunteers have become Eucharistic ministers. "That's church to me," Father Lostritto said. "It's not just sitting in the church itself. It's what you do with what you have in the community."

I hope you will attend the Adult Faith Formation presentation, "*Pope Francis: Joy and Challenge*" this Monday, March 10th in the Parish Center at 7pm. Jesuit Father Allen Figueroa Deck, S.J., Ph.D. will be the presenter. There is no cost to you.

Along with the weekly Friday Fish Fry during Lent, don't forget about the *Stations of the Cross* at 6pm in the church. In previous years Fish Fry enthusiasts combined a jaunt to the Fish Fry with the Stations of the Cross.

I am happy to say that my *Holy Land Pilgrimage* presentation is almost finished. Thanks to Suzie Lazuka, our parish secretary, the final draft will soon be transferred to a CD and then readied for a parish-wide viewing during Lent for those who are interested. Of course, this is not a professional guide to the Holy Land. It is comprised of photos I took and my recollections of what I saw and experienced. Your comments if you choose to attend the viewing will be welcomed. I know that many of our parishioners have traveled to the Holy Land and know much more about the Holy Sites than I do. This was my first pilgrimage to Israel.

Father Thomas Connery in a booklet entitled: Lent: Little by Little. Daily Reflections for Lent writes about the first Sunday in Lent: "Jesus was led by the Spirit into the desert to be tempted by the devil" (Lk 4:1-2). Bob left the college library late one evening and walked through the parking lot to his car only to find that he had a very dead battery. The nearest building that was still open was a sorority house. He explained his situation to the young woman who answered the door, and she reluctantly permitted him to use the phone. As soon as he was inside he heard a loud voice call down from upstairs "Jenny, you know that you're not supposed to have any male visitors after 11 o'clock" "It's okay" Jenny answered, "His battery is dead."

Our batteries never die in that we can always succumb to sin. No matter our age, the devil is always seeking to lead us astray. We cannot afford to be overconfident. That is why we fast and pray and seek the Holy Spirit so we may be able to resist (temptations). Be careful of being overconfident and putting yourself in dangerous occasions. The devil's (temptation) motor is always running.

Norman Vincent Peale once said, "To get to where you want to go, you must keep on *keeping on!*"








LENTEN RICE BOWLS STILLAVAILABLE


