



One of the highlights of my pilgrimage to the Holy Land was a saunter down the road leading to Jerusalem that tradition tells us Jesus used at the time of his triumphal entrance on Palm Sunday. No doubt it was a bitter sweet moment in Jesus' life seeing the palm-waving crowd and knowing that this revelry would be short-lived as the days of his Passion were fast approaching. This Sunday, Palm Sunday or as it is also

called, *Sunday of the Lord's Passion* reminds us as we take our palm in hand and then give it a place of honor in our homes until next Ash Wednesday that we are challenged to honor our Lord not only at this time but all through the year.

Sometimes our church and others throughout the Catholic World are packed with worshippers on Palm Sunday. This applies to Easter Sunday as well! There is something attractive or mystical or maybe magical about getting a cut of palm to take home after Mass. As if a palm branch is a token or premium or reward for coming to Mass on this Sunday before Easter. Hopefully, this year will be different and we will experience as a parish family a spiritual swelling manifested in more faithful attendance, generous support, and continued outreach to the poor and needy in our parish and Fullerton community. If we can do all these good works, we will see a growth in spirit and numbers all through the year.

Congratulations to Pat Riehl and the new officers of the Order of Secular Servants of Mary, St Juliana of the Eucharist Community. Pat is Prioress, followed by Assistant Prior-Dave Lazaro, Treasurer-Shirley Halpin, and Secretary-Kathy Murphy. If you were unable to attend our Lenten Communal Reconciliation Service last Friday, I encourage you to celebrate the Sacrament some time during the Easter season. Penitents find examination of conscience confessional aids helpful when preparing to receive this sacrament. Recently, I discovered a short selfexamination which centers on the *power of words*. The author, Patti Maguire Armstrong, writing in the periodical, Shalom Tidings writes about ways that our words get us into trouble: 1) **Detraction**-repeating something true without a good reason (Sirach 21); 2) Racial jokes that encourage hatred or sexual **jokes** which use impunity for entertainment (Ephesians 5:3-4); 3) Calumny-talking about someone's faults ."Do not judge, and you will not be judged; and do not condemn, and you will not be condemned... (Luke 6:37); 4) Sarcasm-a way to put others down and disguise it as humor; 5) Arguing-speaking nasty or using biting remarks; 6) Criticizing-constant complaining and scolding to vent rather than a desire to help another out of love (Proverbs 21:9); 7)**Breaking Confidences-**"Don't tell anyone else, but..." (Proverbs 11:13); Listening to the words of others can be wrong-"An evildoer listens to wicked lips; a liar pays attention to a destructive tongue" (Proverbs 17:4).

"God gave us the gift of speech. We use it to praise and glorify Him. Our words can evangelize and lift others up in spirit. But talking can also be empty, frivolous, gossipy, and a waste of time. It can take time away from out family, prayer, or tasks which we should be tending to."

Dr. Gregory Popcak director of the Pastoral Solutions Institute which offers Catholic telephone counseling for couples, individuals and families asks the question: "What does it take to create a Catholic home?" He suggests the following: A truly Catholic home must be a home where the mother and father work hard to love and serve each other, to put the other's needs first, to organize their priorities with time for family connection at the top of the list. It must be a home where parents do not just love their children the way their neighbors do, but love them extravagantly, as God loves them, with generous affection, loving conversation, and ample time to hear their stories, comfort them in their sorrows, celebrate their little successes. A Catholic home must be a home where children are taught how to give back all the love they receive by being respectful to their parents, by saying "please" and "thank you" and "Can I help?" and "Ok, Mom and "I love you too" by being generous and thoughtful to their siblings; by cheerfully playing each other's games, and taking turns, letting their sister ride shotgun, or their brother go first and by being good servants to the people they meet in the world---their extended family, teachers, and friends.

Holy Week begins this Monday. Thursday, Friday and Saturday are the days this week known collectively as the *Sacred Triduum*. The Catholic Source Book edited by Father Peter Klein of Harcourt Religious Publishers describes the Triduum in this way: "The ancient Great Three Days, to which all leads and from which all flows, celebrate the heart of Christian faith: Jesus' redemptive death and resurrection. Related to the church year as Sunday is related to each week, the Triduum begins with the evening Mass of the Lord's Supper, continues through Good Friday and Holy Saturday, culminates in the Easter Vigil, and concludes with Evening Prayer of Easter Sunday."

The first day of the Triduum, the Christian Passover is from Holy Thursday sunset until Good Friday sunset; it is the day of Jesus' death, and has been likened to the sixth day of creation, when God formed us from the clay and breath. It includes the liturgies of "The Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper," and "The Celebration of the Lord's Passion." The second day of the Triduum, from Good Friday sunset until Holy Saturday sunset, is the Paschal Sabbath, the day of rest. In burial, the Lord rested, and we rest in him. The third day of the Triduum, beginning Holy Saturday at sunset, is the great surprise, the Easter surprise. This third day begins with the holiest night of the year, the vigil of Easter, leading into the day of days, the queen of feasts.

On Good Friday the collection taken during the service is in support of Christians in the Holy Land. I never paid much attention to this collection until this year when I saw firsthand how Christians and the holy places are in need of financial support. The Franciscan friars have been the caretakers of most of the Christian sites since St. Francis of Assisi brought the friars there in the 13<sup>th</sup> Century. Over the years Christian sites have been preserved, fought over, decimated, rebuilt, and cautiously guarded and preserved. Christians are a minority and often without property and health care. More information about this may be found at www.MyFranciscan.org.

#### GOOD FRIDAY—FAST AND ABSTINENCE

To **abstain from meat** on Good Friday means to not eat meat. It does not intend the omission of eggs or dairy products. The **required fast** on Good Friday involves eating only one full

meal on those days. One or two smaller meals may be taken on those days, but may not total one full meal. The required fast does not allow eating anything between meals.

All Catholics who have **completed their fourteenth year** are bound by the law of abstinence; all adults are bound by the law of fast up to the **beginning of their sixtieth year**.



#### **CATHOLICISM 101**

Palm Sunday commemorates the triumphal entrance of Christ



into Jerusalem (Matthew 21:1-9), when palm branches were placed in His path, before His arrest on Holy Thursday and His Crucifixion on Good Friday. It thus marks the beginning of Holy Week, the final week of Lent, and the week in which Christians celebrate the mystery of their salvation through Christ's Death and His Resurrection on Easter Sun-

day. Beginning in the fourth century in Jerusalem, Palm Sunday was marked by a procession of the faithful carrying palm branches, representing the Jews who celebrated Christ's entrance into Jerusalem. In the early centuries, the procession began on the Mount of the Ascension and proceeded to the Church of the Holy Cross.

An Excerpt from Matthew Kelly's "The Four Signs of a Dynamic Catholic"

#### THE THIRD SIGN - GENEOSITY

Dynamic Catholics are generous

"Dynamic Catholics are filled with a spirit of service and are generous stewards of their time, talent, and treasure.

The 7% are universally described as generous, not just with money and time, but with their love, appreciation, praise, virtue, and encouragement. They see generosity as the heart of Christianity and the proof that the teachings of Christ have taken root in their lives.

The most fascinating thing that came out of the interviews in relation to the third sign is that Dynamic Catholics believe it starts with financial generosity. They describe love of money and attachment to the things of this world as a primary impediment to spiritual growth, and see this as something that everyone struggles with regardless of how much or how little we have.

Financially, Dynamic Catholics give several times more to their parish and other nonprofit organizations (as a percentage of their annual income) than their counterparts in the 93 percent.

But it is how comprehensively generosity is woven into their lives and the spontaneity with which they dispense it that was so inspiring to me. They are generous lovers, they are generous parents, they are generous with their colleagues at work, and they are generous with strangers who cross their path. They are generous with their virtue-generous with patience, kindness and compassion. Generosity is not a religious requirement for the 7%; it's a way of life, a way of bringing the love of God to the world."


