


#### THE PARISH AS ONE BODY

#### FROM THE PASTOR



The Easter Season continues and refers to the *Great Fifty Days* from Easter Sunday to Pentecost Sunday, June 8<sup>th</sup>, a celebration of our participation in Christ's resurrection which brings us from the death of sin to a life of grace. Its last ten days (Ascension Thursday through Pentecost) focus on the promise of the presence and power of the Holy Spirit. The fiftieth day (pente-) is seven (the perfect number) squared plus one (the first day of the *New Life*).

The weeks ahead are known as the Sundays of and not after Easter. The preposition "of" instead of "after" refers to the Sundays between Easter and Pentecost in order to recognize Easter as a season as well as a Sunday: Sundays of Easter. So the first Sunday after Easter and the Second Sunday of Easter are the same day, from different points of view.

Churches and institutions at this time of year have Easter egg "hunts" or "Egg Rolls." In 1873 President and Mrs. Haynes had an Easter Monday egg roll on the White House lawn for their eight children. They could not have known that they were starting a tradition and may not have known that the egg roll was originally more than a game. Historically, the rolling egg imitated the rolling away of the stone from Christ's tomb.

This Second Sunday of Easter is *Divine Mercy Sunday*. The celebrations this Sunday afternoon center on our God's justice and mercy as reflected in the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus his Divine Son.

When Pope St. John Paul II (canonized in Rome this Sunday) instituted this memorial he wrote these words: "The presentday mentality, more perhaps than that of people in the past, seems opposed to a God of mercy, and in fact tends to exclude from life and to remove from the human heart the very idea of mercy...Humanity and the modern world need so much. And they need mercy even though they often do not realize it... Making the Father present as love and mercy is, in Christ's own consciousness, the fundamental touchstone of his mission as Messiah...Christ proclaims by his actions even more than by his words that call to mercy which is one of the essential elements of the Gospel ethos (values). In this instance it is not just a case of fulfilling a commandment or an obligation of an ethical nature; it is also a case of satisfying a condition of major importance for God to reveal himself in his mercy to man (humankind)."

Congratulations to Paul Durning and the entire volunteer staff of The St. Vincent de Paul Society for the successful *Forty Cans of Lent Campaign* recently. Your generosity and the dedication of the volunteers provided a substantial quantity of both perishable and non-perishable items to supplement the tables of over 160 families. Although some of clients served by St.VdeP are unemployed, the majority represent the working poor in our community that are having great difficulty making ends meet.

This Sunday afternoon volunteers from the parish will be walking in the annual *Crop Hunger Walk* from 1 p.m. until about 4 p.m. originating in downtown Fullerton. The object of the Crop Walk is to raise awareness of local and national hunger. It is so important that St. Juliana parishioners continue to support this

local community program and continue to be an active member of the Fullerton Interfaith community sharing not only our Catholic Faith but also the rich social teachings of the Catholic Church and our parish outreach...

Catholic Charities and the myriad of local branches can at times seem distant and impersonal. We donate to these charities but rarely participate in a personal way. While there is nothing wrong with that and they certainly need our support, the impact of personal involvement demonstrates that Catholics are willing to go public with their concern for the poor as we do here at the Armory, Isaiah House, and our weekly pantry. The one-on-one contact brings hope to those who often despair.

I have an exciting surprise to share with you. On Sunday, May 11th, which is also Mother's Day, we will have a guest choir visit St. Juliana directed by a wonderful Latino musician and choir director, Gerardo Larios. Gerardo will be bringing his choir to lead the singing at the 9 a.m. and 11 a.m. Masses. These will be bi-lingual Masses and fully participative for all who attend. Todd Helm, our music director and I have been meeting with Gerardo and we are both excited about having this musical experience here at St. Juliana. The Masses will be beautiful, spirited, and prayerful.

I try to keep my eyes and ears open to read or hear stories about men and women, young and old who have strong faith and manage to nurture their faith in a world that often works against them. When I see teenagers and college students at Mass here at St. Juliana, especially on Sunday evenings, I look at the expressions on their faces as they come for Holy Communion. They have intense appearances and I believe intentional faith. They want to be at Mass.

I read a testimony recently in *Tidings* magazine written by a young woman named Chelsea Houghton. She answers the question, "What Does Faith Mean To Me?" in the following words. "Faith to me is life. In our world today, particularly in my peer group, I think faith can be seen as an optional extra, even something that one does not need at all. It is far more than that. It is what I was created for. We were created by God for Love and to Love. That takes a lifetime. As a relationship with a true and living God, Jesus Christ, faith cannot be segmented into a section of our lives. It is not just an important part of life; it covers all parts of life. My faith makes sense of the world. It gives me a joy and optimism that, many without faith, do not have. My identity and way of life is joyful and in many ways, logical. The 'rules' of the Church that many do not understand actually make sense of the confusing modern world, and its natural laws keep me healthy and happy. Do not get me wrong---it is not always easy! There are many ups and downs, desolations, and consolations. It is hard standing out as we live trying to be faithful...Faith moves me even when I do not feel it. It brings joys that cannot be described. And that makes it all worth it."




#### **CATHOLICISM 101**



The period from Easter Sunday through Divine Mercy Sunday (the Sunday after Easter Sunday), also known as the Octave (or eighth day) of Easter, is an especially joyful time. But the Easter season doesn't end there: Because Easter is the most important feast in the Christian calendar—even more important than Christmas—the Easter season continues on for 50

days, through the Ascension of Our Lord to Pentecost Sunday. (Indeed, for the purpose of fulfilling our Easter Duty, the Easter season extends until Trinity Sunday, the first Sunday after Pentecost!)

So keep on celebrating and wishing your friends a happy Easter! As St. John Chrysostom reminds us in his famous Easter homily, read in Eastern Catholic and Eastern Orthodox churches on Easter, Christ has destroyed death, and now is the "feast of faith."

What a glorious Easter Vigil we shared with the RCIA neo-




