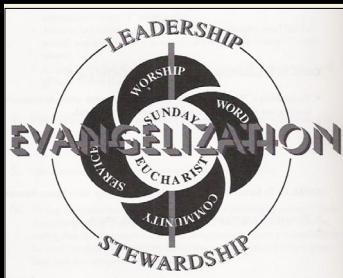

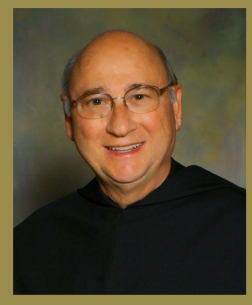

For the past three years I have ordered copies of *The Catholic Worker* newspaper and displayed them in church for you to take a copy home with you as you leave Mass. The Catholic Worker "Movement" was founded by Peter Maurin and Dorothy Day in the 1930's. The Newspaper is celebrating 81 years this month.

While Dorothy and Peter were committed to helping the plight of the worker during the Great Depression and beyond, their greatest contribution to society in general was their use of Catholic Social teachings and writing about the application of Catholic Social principles based on papal encyclicals and theological tenets that reinforced the dignity of work and justice for the poor and marginalized who were joining Communist organizations.

In the May, 2014 edition of *CW* there is a front page article written by Dorothy Day shortly after the death of Peter Maurin in May, 1949 which caught my eye. It is a long article and one you can read in its entirety. I would like to share with you a few of the opening paragraphs that impressed me.

Dorothy writes: *He (Peter) was a man of tremendous ambition, in spite of his simplicity, or perhaps because of it. He wanted to make anew synthesis, as St. Thomas had done in the Middle Ages, and he wanted to enlist the aid of a group of people in doing this. He was no more afraid of the non-Catholic approach to problems than St. Thomas was of Aristotle.*

Peter rejoiced to see men and women do great things and dream great dreams. He wanted them to stretch out their arms to their brothers and sisters, because he knew that the surest way to find God, to find the good, was through one's brothers and sisters. Peter wanted this striving to result in a better physical life in which all would be able to fulfill themselves, develop their capacities for love and worship, expressed in all the arts. He wanted them to be able to produce what was needed in the way of homes, food, clothing, so that there was enough of these necessities for everyone...

Peter made you feel a sense of his mission as soon as you met him. He did not begin by tearing down, or by painting so intense a picture of misery and injustice that you burned to change the world. Instead, he aroused in you a sense of your own capacities for work, for accomplishment. He made you feel that you and all men and women had great and generous hearts with which to love God. If you once recognized this fact in yourself you would expect and find it in others. "The art of human contacts," Peter called it happily. But it was seeing Christ in others, loving the Christ you saw in others. Greater than this, it was having faith in the Christ in others without being able to see Him. Blessed is he that believes without seeing.

In a radio interview in March, 1943 Peter was asked questions to help explain some of the philosophy of *The Catholic Worker Movement*. Question: "What would you suggest as the first step toward the solution of economic ills?" Answer: "Feed the hungry for Christ's sake, clothe the naked for Christ's sake, shelter the homeless for Christ's sake, instruct the ignorant for Christ's sake, as the first Christians used to do, which make the pagans say about the Christians, 'See how they love

one another.'" Question: "What do you mean by the responsibility of ownership?" Answer: "Ownership does not exist to acquire more wealth since all wealth belongs to God and therefore must be used for the service of God's children. The owner is God's trustee. God wants us to be our brothers' and sisters' keeper: what the rich do for the poor for Christ's sake is what they carry with them when they die, for Jean Jacques Rousseau says that when someone dies, they carry in their clutched hand only that which they have given away during their lifetime."

I write this because I believe that in the five years I have been with you and ministered to the best of my ability, I have experienced another trait inherent in the personalities of St. Juliana parishioners: "A Spirit of Outreach." Besides your gift of generosity which I highlighted last week, I believe you have been extraordinary in your outreach to the poor, the homeless, and neglected in our community. Along with an outstanding record of "Respect Life," our St Vincent de Paul Society, Knights of Columbus, Spiritual Partners in Care, Crop Walk Walkers, and Bereavement commission have been exemplary in living the *Corporal Works of Mercy* upon which all Catholic social teaching and programs are built.

Sometimes as Catholic parishioners we can become absorbed in our own day to day responsibilities and have little energy left to be concerned about issues that seem better handled by government or other agencies. If asked to define ourselves as followers of Jesus, we may not think to include that we are committed to helping the poor and marginalized.

There have been articles written, reports disseminated, television and radio interviews published that decry the hiatus of Catholics to other denominations. While this is not something new or disastrous, the reason often is because there is a disconnect between the daily life of Catholics and a higher spiritual calling. When we neglect to be involved in "faith in action," we drift into indifference. God becomes distant and religion loses some of its moral force. *Prayer, Meditation, Study* along with *Action* will assure that our Catholic parish life will continue to be faithful and vibrant. Instead of a hiatus, there will be an influx of new and former members who want to regain what they believed lost or discover entirely new ways of being Catholic.

Generosity, Outreach, and Welcoming are your strong character traits. I believe the parish has grown in many ways these past five years. When I spoke at Mass shortly after I arrived in June, 2009, I wanted you to know that whatever I would do in the days ahead would build on the talents and popular ministries of Father Jude Herlihy, O.S.M. and Father Luke Stano, O.S.M. along with other members of the Servite community since our arrival here in 1993. I believe Father Michael Pontarelli, O.S.M. will bring his many talents and build on what good we have accomplished together. There certainly will be change. There is always change during times of transition. With mutual respect and a common vision the parish will continue to attract new members and encourage those who have "borne the heat of day."

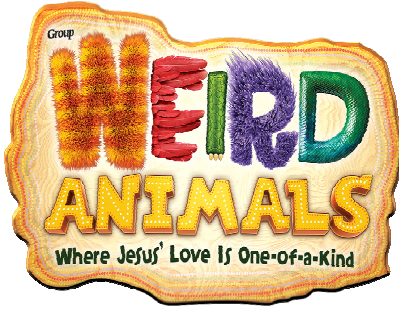

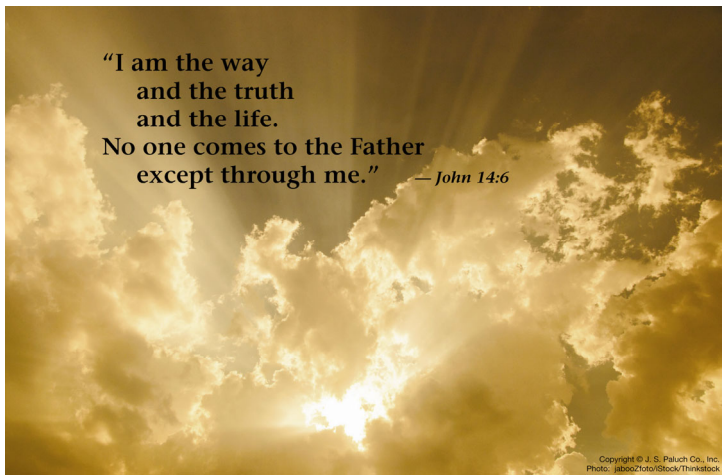

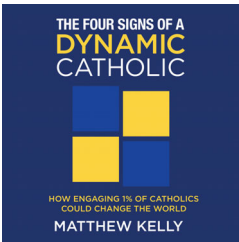

Our PSA 2014 campaign began in late March and to date we have received 183 responses totaling \$121,251. Our pledges range from \$5 - \$12,000.

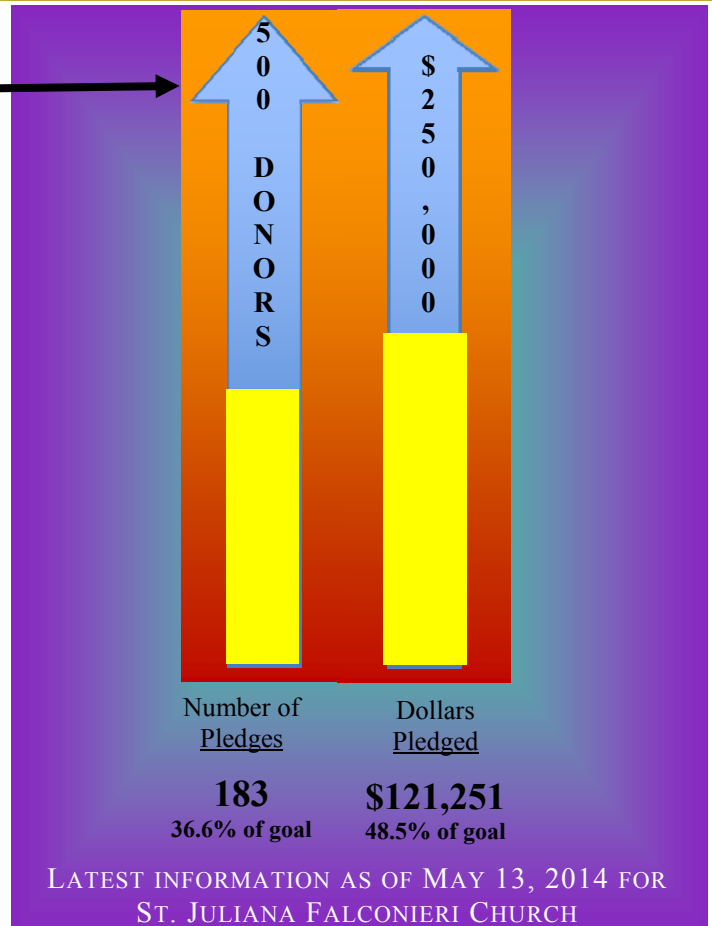


Our diocesan assessment is \$108,000. We

VOCATION ESSAY CONTEST

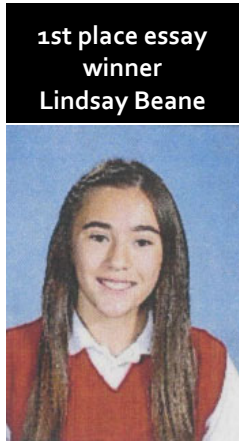

Pope Francis Essay Contest Winner!

"Have you ever stayed away from someone because they looked or acted strange? We shouldn't ignore that person for who they are. Everyone was created in God's image. Pope Francis is a good example of what we should do with the free will God gives us. Pope Francis has touching actions, challenging words, and faithful followers.

Pope Francis teaches us to embrace everyone no matter their wealth, appearance, or anything else. Pope Francis embraced a man with a disfigured face. He says "In life, God accompanies persons, and we must accompany them, starting with their own situation. It is necessary to accompany them with mercy." People are all the same, even if they might look different than the average person. They should still be acknowledged and welcomed in any community.

Everyone is challenged in some way by Pope Francis' words and actions. Even with tough questions on topics such as homosexuality he is not shaken and has a wise answer. "If a homosexual person is of good will and is in search of God, I am no one to judge." Everyone is welcomed into the family of God, but it is their choice if they want to stay with the church or go against its beliefs. He is not afraid to make changes for the benefit of others. He washed the feet of twelve prison inmates on Holy Thursday including two women and two Muslims. The original teachings of the washing of the feet only allowed the Catholic men's feet to be washed, but he has more compassion to love all and serve all in God's image. Some of us don't care about the poor because we are wrapped up in our daily lives and don't think to care about those who are less fortunate. Pope Francis asked, "How can it be that it is not a news item when an elderly homeless person dies of exposure, but it is news when the stock market loses two points?" In a way, Pope Francis is similar to Dorothy Day. They are both caring for the poor, give up their things for others, and want to live like those who don't have much. He is so inspiring that most people wonder, what can I do to be like him?

Just by reading about the wondrous things Pope Francis has said and done makes you want to try and help people and follow in his example. When you feel like you cannot do much to help those in third world countries with their hunger, or just regular people living on the streets, you can - even if it is the simplest things. What I have been doing for many years is giving grains of rice to children and families in third world countries. You could even try something simpler by volunteering at a local soup kitchen, or going to homeless shelters and bringing meals to the people there. There are many things you can do even if they are small. No matter how small you think the act is it still makes an impact on people's lives. Pope Francis is one to follow and is a true example of God.

At first I didn't want to write this essay. I thought it was a waste of my time and I could be reading a book or catching up on homework, but now I am very glad I had an opportunity to write this essay. Before this contest I didn't know one thing about Pope Francis, except for the fact that he owned a Toyota Land Cruiser for his pope mobile. Now I know so much more. This article changed my view of being a Catholic and inspired me. I hope it will inspire others too."

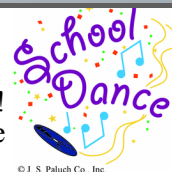

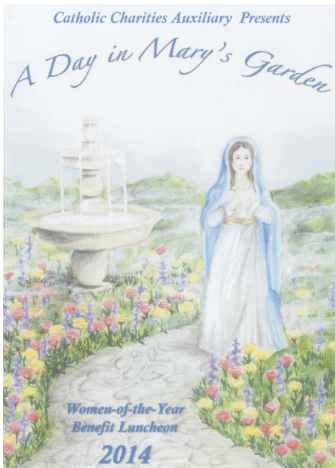
