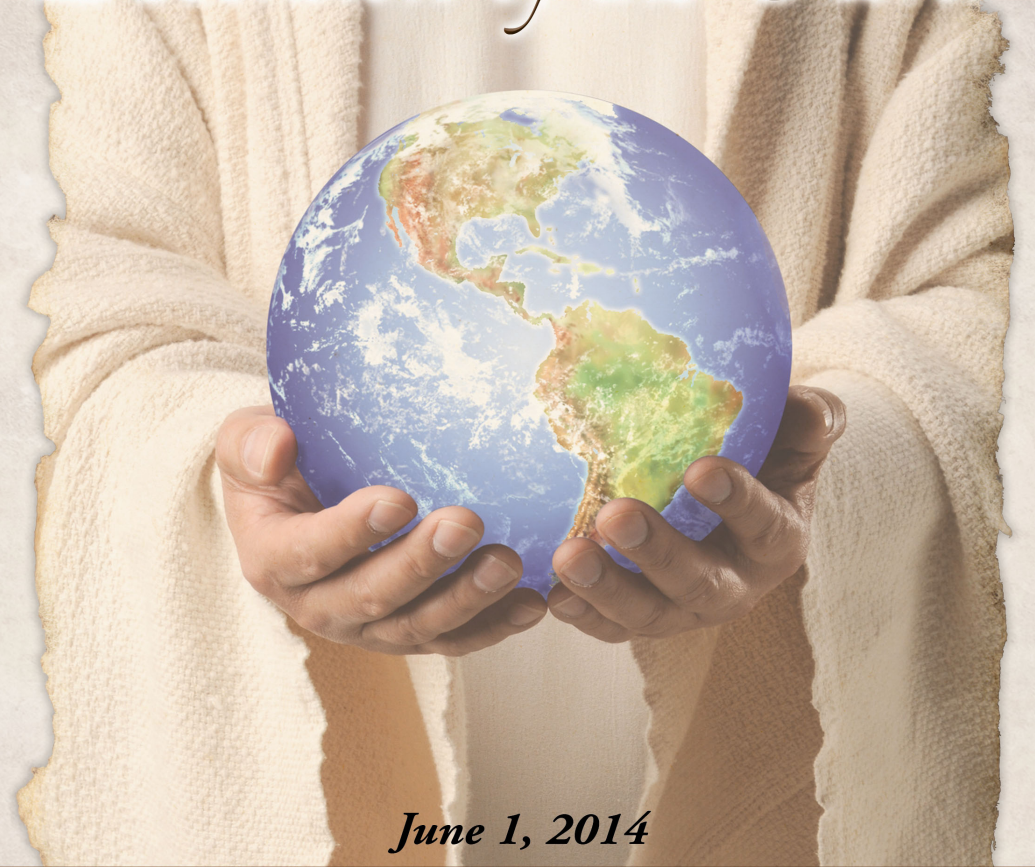

I have to admit that I'm not as young as I used to be. I am sure that is a familiar declaration. Recently, I accompanied our 8<sup>th</sup> grade graduation class and their teachers as they journeyed to Boston, New York, Gettysburg and Washington, D.C. This week-long pilgrimage to historic American sites was informative, eye-opening, fun and exhausting. Even these rather fearless and energetic teens found the pace strenuous and the cache of historical

information somewhat challenging. The guide did a good job helping the students and teachers to understand both the historical and contemporary context of our American heritage and political life. All in all it was a good experience and I am glad that I was invited to join in on the fun.

Apart from the educational goals this trip offered, the interaction among the students with their extraordinarily good behavior exemplified the benefits of Catholic education and discipline. Parents, teachers, and parishioners should be proud of these students and continue to believe and support our parish school. These wonderful "off-spring" will accomplish great things as they move up the academic ladder. I am glad that I was able to engage them in conversation and some good natured foolery.

Day by day I am slowly making preparations for my leaving St. Juliana. While I continue to exercise my position as pastor, I am also deferring some decisions to Father Michael Pontarelli, O.S.M. He will be meeting with members of the Pastoral Council, Finance Committee, and School Board within the next few weeks. The transition will be methodical and cordial and I believe those in positions of leadership are ready for change.

I will always be grateful for parishioners and leaders who have cooperated with me and found my guidance and administrative acumen helpful in living out their talents and leadership skills. For the most part I believe there has been mutual respect and cooperation in ministering to the spiritual, emotional, and physical needs of our St. Juliana family.

At the recent Parish Pastoral Council meeting, I listed a series of parish activities, ministries, and outreach programs that I believe have been successful these past five years and I then made suggestions on how to ensure that these will continue in the years ahead. More will be added and some will be modified. As I look back, I believe there have been many times when a homily, adult education program, social event, parish mission, or devotion impacted the lives of St. Juliana parishioners. This is not to say that everything these past five years was original or never tried before. Building on the past and standing on the shoulders of those who built this parish and have committed their time, talent, and fortune to its prosperity is the right way to go. As much as we believe that we are responsible for all the good that we enjoy today, let's not forget all who preceded us and their love and loyalty to the parish and their Catholic faith. There have been many giants associated with St. Juliana.

In the past few bulletins I have tried to share my experiences with you and how we have grown together. I truly appreciate and value your strength, convictions, and self-confidence. At times I have felt that my leadership, opinion, and direction were not seen as helpful. However, deep down I really tried to honor our differences and I believe that in the end, for the most part, we found common ground. With a change of administration this kind of interplay will be tricky; a good amount of patience and honesty will insure a smooth transition.

My special thanks to Suzanne Wulff, Curtis Wesseln, Mike McHenry and Bill Jason for sharing their combined reflection in last Sunday's bulletin on the Stewardship conference we attended sponsored by the diocese of Orange. I believe that the information we garnered at the conference will be helpful as we work toward a **Total Stewardship Parish**.

Your generosity in the **Servite Mission Collection** every year is remarkable. Last year you gave \$7,420 to support the work of the Servite missionaries in Kwa-Zulu, South Africa. The main task of the missionaries today continues to be the proclamation of the Gospel and the establishment of viable Catholic Communities. The idea that the people are the Church is quite strong and our missionaries report that participation in the liturgy is heartwarming and the daily work of the church is very fruitful. Today the Catholic population under the care of the Servite Friars is approaching 25,000 compared to about 4,000 in the early 1960's. Other ministries include education and primary health care centers where victims and orphans of the AIDS epidemic are served. Your mission donation next weekend, June 7th and 8th will also provide adequate housing for the people of the mission areas and funding to improve the water system and root out malaria. Thank you for your bountiful kindness.

Three years ago we began to celebrate the Feast of St. Juliana on the closest Sunday to her actual feast day (June 19<sup>th</sup>) in the Servite calendar with greater merriment. A picnic, lawn games, visits from the fire and police departments, and train rides for the children have been added to the spiritual celebration. This year we will observe the feast day on June 22nd following the 11am Mass. Bishop Kevin Vann will be with us the entire weekend as a guest of the parish and with Father Luke and myself, residing in the rectory. He will celebrate some of the Masses, preach at others, hear confessions, and be available to visit with parish leaders and families. Such a celebration! Will you be there? Will you bring your family, e-z up's, picnic items, chairs, tables and whatever will help create a festive atmosphere? I truly hope so! There will be free food, a chili cook-off, and balloons.

Our eighth grade students will graduate this Friday, June 6, 2014 at 5pm in the Parish Center, preceded by a farewell Mass at 10:30am in church on June 5th. Everyone is welcome to attend. Congratulations to our students, teachers, parents, staff, for another successful year, and blessings to our kindergarten graduates as they step up one rung on the academic ladder and say goodbye to Mrs. Ritter, their teacher, as she retires.

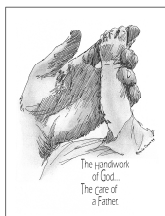
## SERVITE MISSIONS

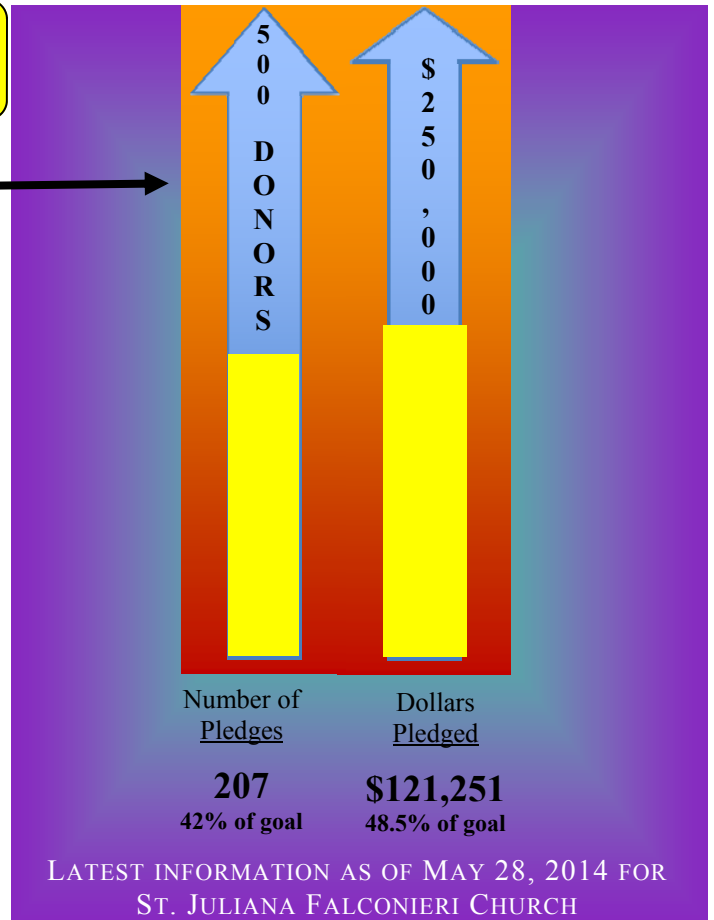
Our PSA 2014 campaign began in late March and to date we have received 207 responses totaling \$121,251. Our pledges range from \$5 - \$12,000.

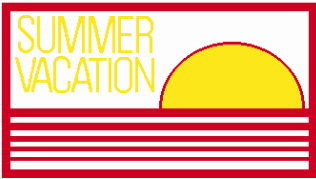
Our diocesan assessment is \$108,000.

### Seven lessons from Pope Francis- Dig Deeper

After reading the "Seven Lessons From Pope Francis; I am inspired to follow all seven steps and enhance my catholic behavior and attitude. In this essay I will answer three questions from the Catholic Update "Dig Deeper." The questions I will be answering from are "Dig Deeper" include: "Which action by Pope Francis touched you the most?" "How do Pope Francis/ words and actions challenge you?" I think this article shows that not many people want to sacrifice to donate items that they use, but sometimes don't even need. We need to get serious and donate more. A lot of people have money but many do not. Whether you are rich, or just making it on a low income we can all take stock of ourselves and sacrifice for others. For example, some people lay around on their video games or watch Netflix when they could cancel that and save the money. Then they could donate that eight dollars a month and then give that away to charity. Another example would be to cancel a magazine subscription and donate that money. I hope some of those people realize that, so that everyone is equal. When I have the chance I always donate my money to the church. When I'm altar serving I see a lot of donations and that makes me happy that our church can stand together for a long time and help those in need. It makes me happy when more people celebrate - then the church stands stronger and we are all united under one church.

The third question is "What one thing can you do this month to follow Pope Francis' lead?" I have decided this month I can give up more of my possessions to the church, be a good foster brother, and have good will in order to follow Pope Francis' lead. For giving my possessions to the church, I will be more involved with St. Vincent de Paul and food drives. I have been a foster brother for 2 years and I am happy about it every single moment. For good will to others, I will go through my clothes and toys and towels and put them in the blue bin. I will try my best to follow in the Pope's lead.

From answering these questions I have reflected and planned my behavior in the world and how I can help. Pope Francis has been a big inspiration to me. I hope by "digging deeper" in my own life I will improve the lives of others.
