

A NOTE FROM FR. MIKE, O.S.M.



THE FEAST OF ST PHILIP BENIZI August 23 is the Feast of St. Philip Benizi. That was only yesterday! TODAY, the Servite Secular Community here at St. Juliana Falconieri Parish is leading us in celebrating the feast.

St. Juliana and St. Philip are saints of the Servite Order. The Servite Order is properly known in the Roman Catholic Church as the "Order of Friar Servants of Mary." It is popularly known as the Ser-

vite Order. In the Diocese of Orange its members are Fr. Luke and me at St. Juliana, the priests at St. Philip Benizi Parish in West Fullerton and the priests and brothers at Servite High School in Anaheim. We sign "OSM" which means Order Servants of Mary after our names. Perhaps you were educated by Jesuits who sign SJ (Society of Jesus), Dominicans who sign OP (Order of Preachers), Franciscans who sign OFM (Order of Friars Minor), Sisters of Saint Joseph of Orange who write CSJ, or Holy Cross CSC (Congregation of the Sacred Cross). Some of the faithful have created another signification for the letters, for example, CSC might mean Cash Sweet Cash.

Our Catholic Church in Orange paints an interesting triptych of the Servites in the City of Fullerton. Mary, the Mother of Jesus is central to the spiritually to the Servites. So paint this in your mind: Saint Juliana on the East (we are first for the sun rises in the East!), St. Mary's the Mother Parish in the Center, and St. Philip Benizi in the West where the sun sets. A rather curious three sided painting!

Not long ago I told you a bit about the life of St. Juliana. Early biographers tell us that St. Philip was born on the feast of the Assumption of Mary, August 15 in 1233 – the very day of the great appearance of Mary to the original Seven Holy Founders of the Servites. He was a native of Florence, Italy, the son of Giacomo Benizi and his wife Albaverde. Little is known about Philip's early life. It is recorded that when he entered the Order in 1254 he was well educated having studied philosophy and medicine in Paris and a doctorate in Padua. Education aside, he wished to pursue holiness. He was known for his life of service, humility and devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary which attracted him to the Servites.

As he grew in the Order he wished to be a humble member simply working in the gardens and land at Monte Senario, a foundation of the Order above the city of Florence. In time his education and background became known and he was sent to study theology and be ordained a priest in the Order. Within eight or nine years Philip was elected as the leader, the Prior General of the Order, in 1267. He was the Prior General for eighteen years.

During that time he continued to be known as a humble friar and a priest of great simplicity. In one story he gave his tunic to a leper who upon receiving it was cured. Another part of his history records that on the death of Pope Clement IV in 1268 a

history records that on the death of Pope Clement IV in 1268 a number of cardinals believed Philip to be a candidate for the office of pope. One historian tells us that of hearing this, Philip hid! He was not elected pope. Artistic representations of St. Philip today depict him with the Cross which was his guide, the only book he needed for life, and a papal tiara resting at his feet. There is such a statue of him on the Great Colonnade, those huge arms in St. Peter's Piazza.

Another important part of his life is the miracle of the bread. While Philip was on his way to visit the houses of the Order in Germany, he came to a place where there was neither bread nor wa-



ter. Moved to pity in the sight of people overcome with heat and hunger Philip prayed to the Lord to provide nourishment. On finishing his prayer, Philip looked around where he was and noticed some "very white bread and a jar of water." His prayers were answered.

This is the bread that is provided to you by the community of Secular Servites today (after the Sunday morning Masses.)

I encourage you to visit with the Secular Servites. Learn our Tradition from them. I am proud of our Community of Secular Servites at St. Juliana Parish. I encourage you to meet them and consider joining their community.






This year we welcome Dr. Robert Ellwood as our keynote speaker.


