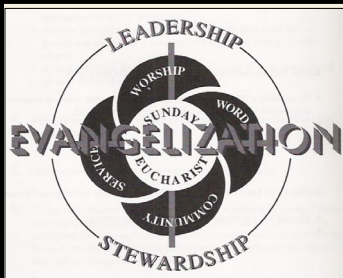

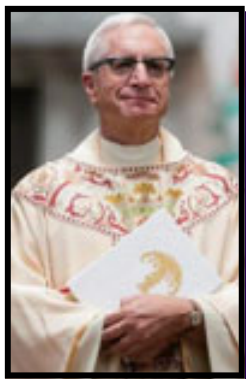

A MESSAGE FROM FR. MIKE PONTARELLI, O.S.M.



Ah, the songs of Christmas past! The conjuring of fond memories! Magical, mystical, haunting! It's that time of year when we sing those old familiar songs. If we don't hear them we sing them. If we don't know the lyrics we make them up. The Feast of the Epiphany begs the *We Three Kings* song, of course it does. Yet, I got to thinking of songs and heard Diana Ross sing *Do You Know?* You might think of me as old or ready for the rubber room.

Strange the way the song works. Haunting really: "Do you know where you're going to? Do you like the things that life is showin' you, where you're goin' to? Do you know? .. Once we were standin' still in time, chasing the fantasies that filled our minds. You knew how I loved you... Do you know?"

So the Wisemen were wise because they knew where they were going to. Like them, we often make journeys to that destination that we hope will change our lives. The wise ones no longer chased a fantasy. They found a star that what would fulfill their lives.

They had gifts to bring. Lately you've made journeys and brought gifts.

Allow this to haunt you: Where are you going to? Do you know?

Ponder the gospel scene for a moment. King Herod is disrupted from his daily concerns. Some strangers, foreigners by any description, come along to ask directions not to his palace but to the address of someone much greater, the King of Kings. **The message of the gospel always disrupts our daily lives. If the gospel does not disrupt our lives, we are not reading the gospel.**

This year allow the kings to drop into your life, disrupt what you are doing, and ask you directions to the place where Jesus is. If you don't direct them to your own soul and your home, if you don't direct them to our parish community, do you know where they'll be going to? Do you know?

"Do you know where you're goin' to? Do you know what you are hopin' for? Do you like the things life is showin' you? Why must we wait so long before we see?"

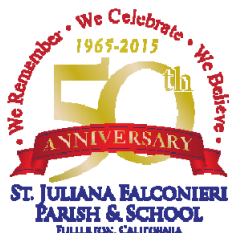
We might laugh at the questions life is asking. How sad some of the answers to the questions can be. What are your answers? If not in the gospel where are you finding them?

CATHOLICISM 101

The Feast of the Epiphany of Our Lord Jesus Christ is one of the oldest Christian feasts, though, throughout the centuries, it has celebrated a variety of things which have now been "split up" into feasts of their own. One such example would be the "Baptism of the Lord" which we will celebrate next Sunday.

This solemnity, "*Epiphany*" comes from a Greek verb meaning "to reveal". Other characterizations of the word would be "manifestation" and "striking appearance".

All of the various events celebrated by the Feast of the Epiphany are revelations of Christ to man.



In our Western Christianity, the feast commemorates principally (but not solely) the [visit of the Magi](#) to the [Christ child](#), and is Jesus' physical manifestation to the [Gentiles](#). It is this event (as well as others) that gives us the tradition of giving gifts. So when you give a gift during this time of year remember that it is God who gives us the greatest gift of all!

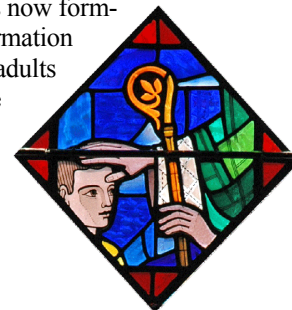

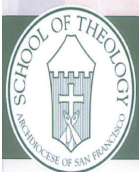
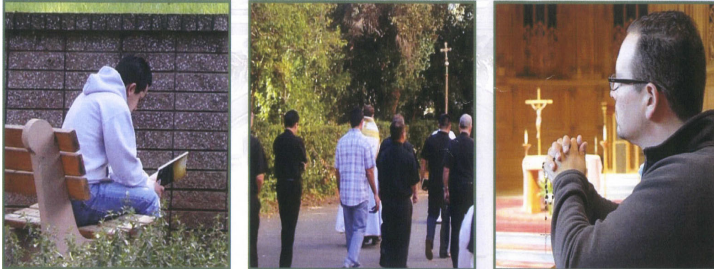

BLESS YOUR DOOR ON THE EPIPHANY



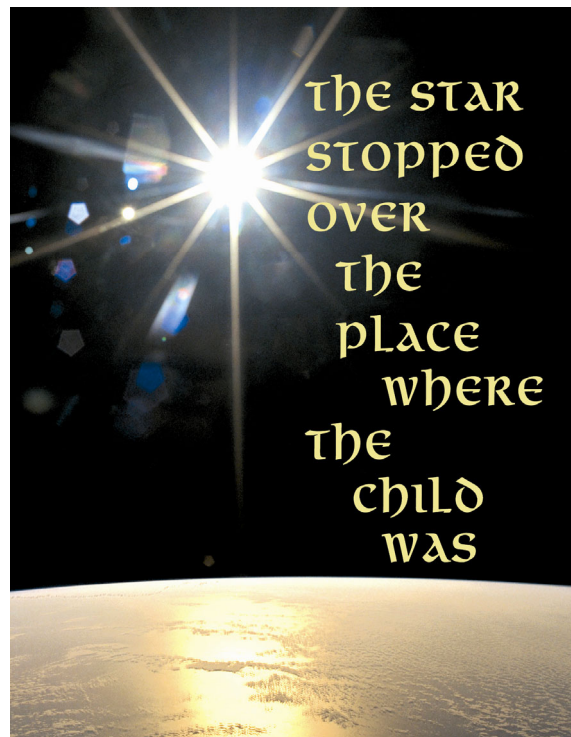
The gospel tells us that the magi found Christ "on entering the house." The door to your home is a holy threshold. You can bless those who come in and go out by inscribing above the door in chalk the first two numbers of the year (20)+C+M+B+ the last two numbers of the year (15). Tradition tells us that the letters stand for the names of the magi:

Caspar, Melchior and Balthasar. Adolph Adam points out that it may also mean "Christus mansionem benedicat" or "May Christ bless this dwelling." It's appropriate to bless your door in January—janua means "door" and the first month is the door to the new year.

After inscribing the doorway, say this prayer:

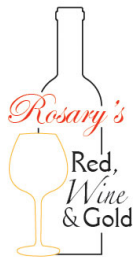
God of Bethlehem and Cana,
God of Jordan's leaping waters,
in baptism you bring us into your family.
You wed us and embrace us as your beloved.
May we fill this place with kindness to one another,
with hospitality to guests,
and with abundant care for every stranger.
By the gentle light of a star,
guide home all who seek you on paths of faith, hope and love.
Then we will join the angels in proclaiming your praise:
Glory in heaven and peace on earth, now and for ever.
Amen.
