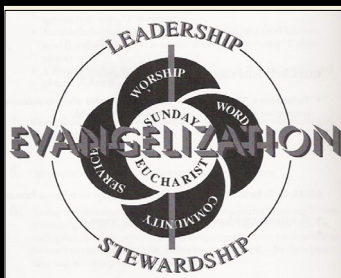

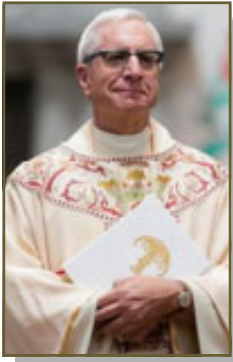

## A MESSAGE FROM FR. MIKE PONTARELLI, O.S.M.



The gospel lesson of the widow who “contributed all she had, her whole livelihood” teaches how to love. It teaches us how much our life is worth. Am I willing to open my hands and give to even unknown others? As always, the gospel is a challenge, how should I act? What is my moral obligation to what I believe?

Stewardship is a response. It’s the “what I do after I say ‘I believe.’” Beliefs are deliberate actions. In a very pragmatic way, beliefs are rules for actions. A belief is that upon which you are prepared to act. You believe Mom when she says: “It’s Sunday and we’re having pasta” and your reaction will be as clear as the bell Pavlov’s dog heard; you go to the table, say your prayers giving thanks to God for the meal and Mom, tuck your napkin under your chin, wind the noodles around the fork, and enjoy the meal. You believe the weatherman and Mom as speaking truth and so you act.

Beliefs can also be formed by watching the actions of another. If you believe the weatherman when he predicts rain, your reaction will be to dress for rain and bring your umbrella along with you. When others see you, they might ask: “Hey is it going to rain?” Watch a department store being decorated for Christmas and you’ll start making a list and checking it twice! Even as you gripe: “Already?”

In today’s gospel Jesus “observed how the crowd put money into the treasury...the poor widow also came and put in two small coins worth a few cents.”

The genesis of belief comes from some convincing truth. I won’t believe in any intellectual way that Pepto Bismal will coat my stomach the same way it coats a glass beaker – my stomach is not glass. Nor will I believe using Crest toothpaste will prevent dental cavities because a professional football player says so. Such evidence is not convincing. Give me a scientist!

Intellectually I believe the teaching of Jesus and I have noticed in the lives of the saints that it is best to follow Jesus’s command and actions. The greatest gift God has given to us is that He has let us in on the secret of who He is and what He is all about. Jesus is that gift. Therefore, Christians believe and act in such a way that it is better to be generous with their time, their talents, and their treasures. After you say: “I believe in the apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism...” what do you **do** that convinces even yourself that you **believe** those words?

The gospel is a challenge. Christian faith is completed in acts of charity, acts of love. Faith without love is dead.

What conclusions can others draw from your actions? Seeing your actions, what will an observant other do?

When the poor widow noticed others putting in something, she also contributed. When Mom said: “We are having pasta” I came to the table ready to eat. When Jesus said: “Love others as I have loved you” did I build, from selfless love, a community gathered in his name? What do you do after you say: “I believe?”

More nifty questions!

## KIDSAVE INFORMATION

Kidsave is a non-profit organization that works to create change so forgotten older orphanage and foster kids grow up in families and connected to caring adults. Kidsave is recruiting host families to participate in the Weekend Miracles and Summer Miracles programs here in Southern California. The Weekend Miracles program connects older foster youth, ages 9-17 with volunteer host families. Hosts commit to spending at least two days a month with their youth for a minimum of one year. Hosts advocate to find their youth a permanent family while also acting as mentors. Some hosts adopt the children they host, some become their legal guardians or caregivers.

The Summer Miracles program brings children from Colombia, ages 10-14, who are growing up in orphanages and foster families to communities across the U.S. to stay with host families for a 4 to 5 week summer visit. During their stay, the children experience life in a family, attend summer camp, and meet prospective adoptive families. 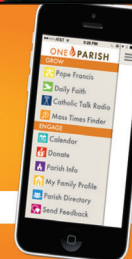
