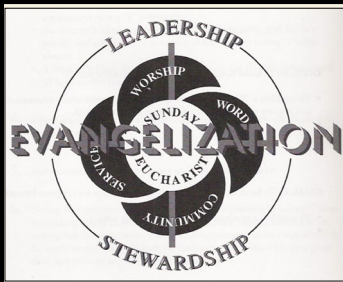

A NOTE FROM FR. MIKE PONTARELLI

The Third Sunday of Advent, it's called *Gaudete* Sunday; "Shout for joy! Be glad with all your heart!" "Rejoice in the Lord always, I shall say it again: rejoice!" Also, this bit of spiritual direction: "Have no anxiety at all." "Jesus preached good news to the people." Not only happiness, but joy! That guy with his bell at Macy's! Aunt Mary is coming and I didn't expect her! A house to decorate, presents to buy then wrap, and meals to cook and tables to set. Ugh, still a couple of weeks of this torture before Christmas and New Years and then all that follows. Along with Scrooge, do you want to shout: "Bah Humbug! give me peace, quite, and distance from this madness?" Where is all this "happiness?"

As a child I recall the Ray Conniff singers and others, St. Dean Martin for one, sang a song: "Happiness Is" – different things to different people. "To a preacher, it's a prayer, to a golfer it's a hole in one, to the Yankees it's a four game sweep." Maybe you know the wonderful Peanuts cartoon of our youth. It insisted that happiness was "finding a pencil, a pizza with sausage, happiness is five different crayons; happiness is anyone and anything at all that's loved by you."

Where do **you** find happiness, even joy? And what do you name it? What do you do to create happiness for others? The Lord tells us to share with others, to be people of mercy. In your search for happiness, find a quiet moment. Listen! The voice of the Lord is speaking: "You, I need you to give one of your sweaters and some of your food to the one who is lacking. Just one sweater. Simply some food." Are you good at stewardship? He is not asking us to give away our wardrobe and be naked. He is not telling us to give all of our money away and join the roving band of the poor, begging for our next meal. He is saying: "Act with belief that I am here." He is saying that for our sakes and for his. Play fair with everyone.

Is the Lord asking the impossible from you? No more than he asked the impossible of Peter, "Come, follow me. You, feed my sheep. You, go and be where I cannot be. You, I need you. When you go, rely on me." What did the apostle find? Faith-filled-fulfillment, a shot beyond just being a good human. He found the joy that Jesus alone gives. Not the joy of getting whatever it is that your big eyes and ego desires; he found joy in the heart. He found the joy of a relationship with Jesus.

Where might we find that joy? Look at mercy. Mercy has been defined as "entering into the life of another so as to make that person's life better." We were taught that acts of mercy are of two types: corporal and spiritual. The corporal acts are the better known: to feed the hungry, to give drink to the thirsty, to clothe the naked, to shelter the homeless, to visit the sick, to visit the imprisoned, and to bury the dead. And to do this in such a way as to extend the loving care of Jesus to a neighbor. The seven spiritual works of mercy are also aimed at relieving suffering. They are: to instruct the ignorant, to counsel the doubtful, to admonish sinners, to bear wrongs patiently, to forgive offenses willingly, to comfort the afflicted, and to pray for the living and the dead.

Besides the dish-washing liquid, where do you find joy? Make a list and check it twice! Can you identify an act of mercy that will increase your joy, the joy of someone else, perhaps a community? Can you respond to the food and toy drive? Did you hear the bell-ringer at Macy's? How did you welcome Aunt Mary? Mercy, it's a matter of loving as Jesus loved. On the level of mere humanity, it's being a decent human being.

Happiness is one of the simplest things in life. How was it made so difficult?

"Rejoice!"

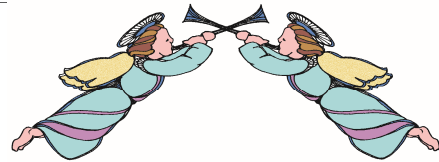

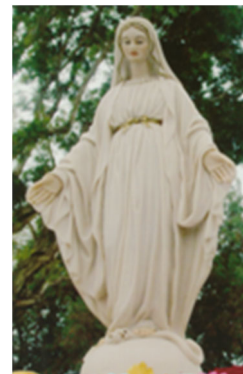

LEGACY PLANNING QUICK AND EASY - - - MORE EXAMPLES

The Orange Catholic Foundation wishes to invite parishioners and friends of the Diocese of Orange to consider including their parish, school and other Catholic charitable organizations in their estate plans in a variety of ways. Here are samples of Testamentary and Non-Testamentary Language letters to bequest a gift in a will to the church or school :

Bequest Language

For a specific monetary bequest:

I give and bequeath the sum of \$ _____ or _____ % or (specific asset) to the Orange Catholic Foundation, located in Garden Grove California tax id # 33-0934571 for the benefit of St. Juliana Falconieri Parish, School, ministry, etc. (optional).

For residuary bequest:

I direct that the remainder of my estate, whether real property, personal or mixed and wheresoever situated, be distributed to the Orange Catholic Foundation, located in Garden Grove California tax id # 33-0934571 for the benefit of St. Juliana Falconieri Parish, School, ministry, etc. (optional). My Executor shall, at the request of Orange Catholic Foundation, liquidate and sell any real estate or tangible personal property which is part of the residue of my estate before making distribution.

Other helpful language for any will:

I instruct that all charitable gifts, bequests and devises should be made, to the extent possible, from assets that constitute income in respect of a decedent, as that term is defined in the Internal Revenue Code.

Non-Testamentary Language for Designation of Beneficiary

Donors may wish to designate a charity or fund as the beneficiary of assets such as life insurance, stock accounts and IRAs. This allows the donor to have complete control of his or her assets during the donor's lifetime. At the donor's death, the asset passes without probate to the beneficiary designated.

In order to designate a beneficiary, the donor should contact the custodian of the asset and request a beneficiary designation form. The fund may be designated as either primary or as contingent beneficiary. Suggested language is as follows:

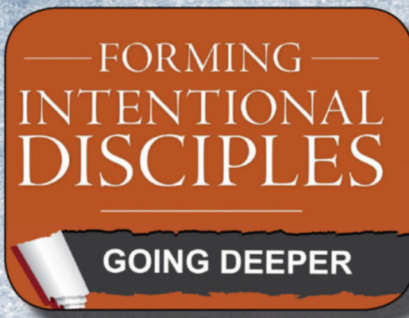

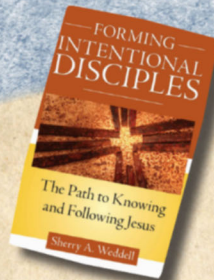

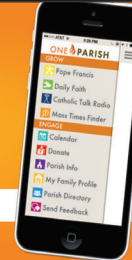
