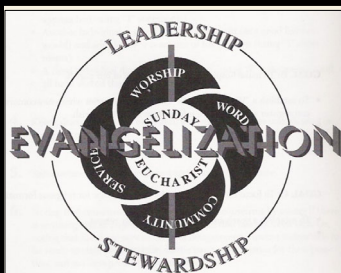

A MESSAGE FROM FR. MIKE PONTARELLI, O.S.M.



Some weeks ago this writing was about the Mass. I am returning to that theme today. I left off just at the beginning of the Eucharistic Prayer. This Great Prayer of the Mass begins with a dialogue which is quite familiar; it is recited or sung almost without second thought – or even first! We can do it in our sleep.

The Lord be with you...Lift up your hearts...Let us give thanks to the Lord our God...

This prayer includes and involves each of us. You, as a community, have a part in the dialogue. We lift up our hearts, it is right for us to give thanks and praise. Why not do it with voices that sound lifted up and filled with praise and thanks-giving? Whether in song or recitation, this is an act of praising God.

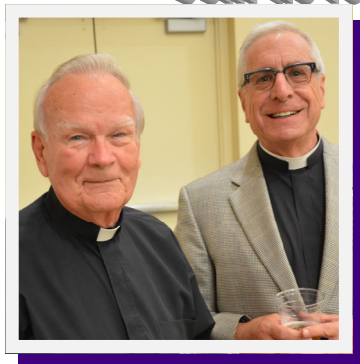
Together we say or sing the Sanctus, “Holy, Holy” – the Memorial Acclamation after the account of the Last supper – together we affirm our prayer as we conclude it with the Great Amen. These responses belong to all of us. Together we are united in our prayer to God our Father.

Listen to the words of the Eucharistic Prayer; make them your own prayer by responding to the prayer by truly lifting up your hearts and minds. Respond to the prayer by doing what it asks; give God thanks and praise. Give God thanks and praise by doing what these prayers ask of you; remember what God has done, celebrate what He continues to do, believe that you can be the presence of God to a community that might not know Him if it weren't for you.

During this great season of Lent, I encourage you to look into the signs of the times by the light of faith and constantly devote yourselves to the service of the Gospel. Be attentive to the needs of all. Share their grief and pain, their joy and hope, bring the people you meet the good news of salvation.

Be thankful for the many graces and blessings you have received. Take a few moments each day to reflect on those blessings. Give God thanks, become God's thanks-giving to other people. You will be changed... so will those whom you encounter.

CATHOLICISM 101
LENTEN FASTING - More insights



Fasting may be a priority in your Lenten spring cleaning regimen. Almost every religious tradition recognizes that fasting is a key to heightened spiritual awareness. You know this from your own experience. When you are engaged in a hobby, painting a room, keeping vigil near a delivery room, or standing watch at a sickbed, you may simply forget to eat. What you are doing so fills you that the intensity of the action is itself nourishing. In fasting from food, or drink, or habitual behaviors, you make room for what is truly important.

Even though Lenten Sundays stand apart from the Lenten fast, you will notice traces of fasting in our liturgy. We fast from singing the Gloria and Alleluia, we fast from flowers bedecking the altar. This hints that fasting is a prelude to feasting, and the vigor of our Easter alleluias is a rich fare after a long silence. In the same way, even a small fast—no cream in the coffee, no pepper in the soup, no radio in the car—can not only point to deeper hungers, but help us rejoice more fully in the feast when we break our fast together.
