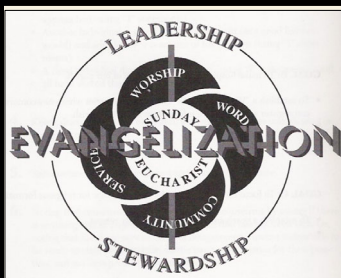

A MESSAGE FROM FR. MIKE PONTARELLI, O.S.M.



Nothing is more important than the Resurrection. Nothing! Not Christmas, not the Ten Commandments, not the beatitudes. Not the Nordstrom's sale, not the Rose Bowl, not the Super Bowl. Not even a Cubs victory in the World Series – and that's expecting a lot! The Cubs winning the World Series would be the victory of the silly little under-dog. Yet, nothing means the difference the Resurrection makes.

And nobody saw it happen! Our faith and our belief are the effects of the Resurrection. The Resurrection describes who we are, how we experience life, and how we shall act.

Today, this Easter morning you made a decision and you acted on it. You made the decision nothing is more important to you than the Resurrection. You made a decision to imitate the first disciples and hurry from your beds to that place where you hope to find the Lord. You came to this Church community looking for Jesus so that you might love the Lord as part of His Christian community.

Today, this Easter morning in faith you hear and sing back what is most joyful to you, that oldest and most important hymn of all of Christianity – ALLELUIA! HE IS RISEN! Christmas said: "this is the most wonderful time of the year" – Easter says: "WOW! Death is a comma, THE way to a new life! This day is for all time, I am immortal! Now, that's Good News!" Yes, it is Good News for me and you and those who have not heard it, yet. Won't you shout JESUS IS RISEN from the roof-tops? At the very least experience the contagious joy of being a Christian today.

On this Easter morning, believe what you hear.

Renew your faith.

Life your faith.

WOW, just Wow!

Silly little under-dog redeemed in the end.

What can beat that?

You didn't even see it!

Celebrate the greatest victory ever!

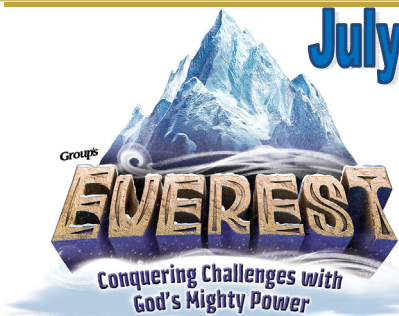

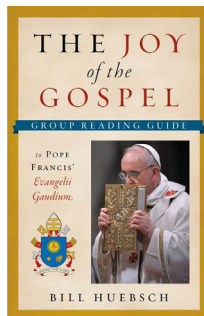
