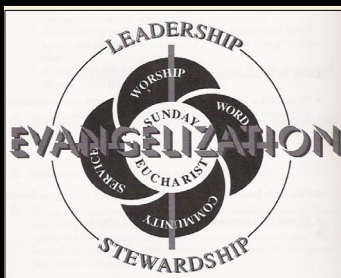

A MESSAGE FROM FR. MIKE PONTARELLI, O.S.M.



Easter is the one day that opens up forever. The resurrection tells us how important we are. We last forever! Life changes, it is not ended. And that makes all the difference. St. Paul tells us: “If Christ has not been raised, then our proclamation has been in vain and your faith has been in vain.” (ICor 15.14)

Theologians and intellectuals (most often skeptics) and the Gospel of St. Matthew proclaimed on Easter Monday offer a variety of theories, ideas, and creative genius on why Jesus’ tomb was empty. Only one explanation is necessary; the empty tomb is a sign that points away from itself to another reality. Signs do that; the 57fwy sign points to the reality of the 57 freeway, it’s over there.

The tomb can only point to one reality, the resurrection of Jesus. New life. Death comes to life! My guess is that most folks aren’t far from St. Thomas, the Apostle. “We’ve just seen the Risen Jesus” isn’t good enough. Proof is needed. It’s so easy to identify with Thomas. Absent from the group for a moment, he returns without the experience of the others.

How did Jesus appear to the apostles? Was he physical? St. Paul, in First Corinthians goes on about that point as well, “How are the dead to be raised up? What sort of body will they have? A nonsensical question!” (ICor 15.35-44). Let’s just say Jesus was raised in a real body and be done with the science of it.

Most often what we know in faith comes to us in a “web of belief” - that is the testimony of others. The truth of the resurrection is, after all, beyond what tactile knowledge can handle. It is outside of space and time.

An appropriate question is: “Why do you believe?” Where will you find reliable testimony? Perhaps that reliable testimony is the various deaths the “blessed apostles and glorious martyrs” endured. The testimony of giving one’s life for a belief is rather powerful! Easier to say: “I don’t know the man.”

Faith is an experience of Jesus (The crucified One is before me) – theology is reflecting on that experience (My Lord and my God) – belief is what you do about it; it the how you show it with your life (spread the news to the nations – bank your life on it and live your life accordingly). Okay, St. Thomas the Apostle, you are a hero. Jesus’ resurrection defies what is acceptable – but it is TRUE. And there is only one explanation or its truth.

That’s the reason of “The Joy of the Gospel” – it’s the reason we can’t stop singing Alleluia, Alleluia!

THANK YOU – THANK YOU- ALLELUIA- THANK YOU to all who participated in our ONE CELEBRATION OF THREE DAYS, the Easter Triduum. HOLY THURSDAY, GOOD FRIDAY, GREAT EASTER VIGIL and EASTER SUNDAY itself is a time to celebrate the central mysteries of our faith. Thank you choir, staff, volunteers, and all who were asked to participate in special ways. I am grateful to those who were baptized and fully initiated into this faith community. May God bring to completion the good work that was begun in each of you. Now, go out and find others like you – those who like the Lord and want to be brought into a better relationship with Him – in this community, in His Word of Scripture, and in the Eucharistic Table of thanksgiving where we get strength to serve and love as Jesus did. Hope it lasts forever!
