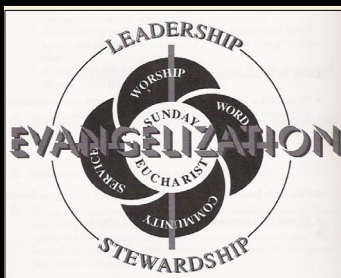

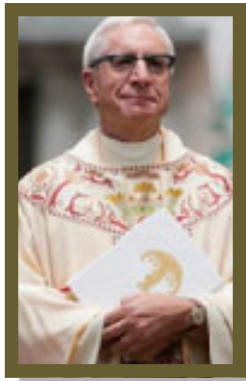

A MESSAGE FROM FR. MIKE PONTARELLI, O.S.M.



Today's Gospel lesson teaches the importance of making and maintaining a connection with God who might be disguised as a neighbor or someone on the periphery. Make a positive life giving relationship and eliminate whatever will break such a connection between you with God and people. Careful! Jesus is not telling us to make a virtual relationship with a picture, screen, or social media. "Give a cup of water, do a mighty deed, drive out demons" is what Jesus says. That's not watch it happen. It's get out there and make it happen.

Repetition is the mother of learning: all are called to a deeper relationship with Almighty God. Being connected to Him, knowing, loving, serving Him is the way to heaven. To live fully, now and to eternity, means to be connected to God. How is your relationship with God? How strongly are you connected to Him? What might you do, in the positive, to make it more secure?

It's a case of practicing the virtues. It's a matter of being hospitable. Jesus says: "show hospitality in works of service." The Church says and Pope Francis practices: love as Jesus loves, serve as Jesus served. It's a matter of being full of mercy, entering into the life of another person, no matter how chaotic that life is at this moment.

The virtues might be the best way to gauge your direction to LIFE and not toward Gehenna. If you could name some connections you need to save, which ones are they? If you need to strengthen one, which one would it be? How will you do it?

Who, or worse what, might be competing for the center of your life? As always, the Mass calls us to a deeper relationship with God – that's why we participate in the Mass. When a serious relationship is in serious disaster it gets a lot of attention. That's exactly how lawyers and psychologists make their money. The advice of a priest is less expensive. How is your relationship with God? Can it be more secure? Just asking.....

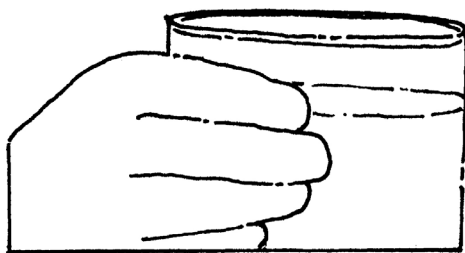

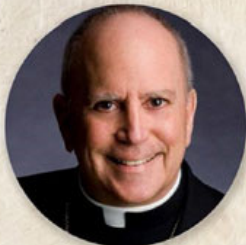

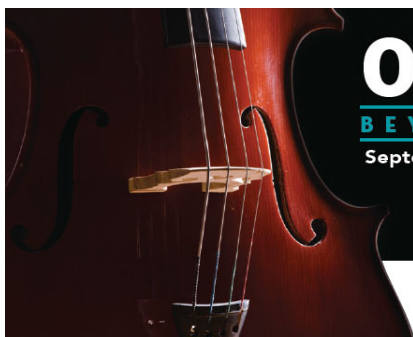
